The Home Secretary gives notice that, in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an order authorising the employment on two day shifts of women and young persons of 16 years of age and over in calendering starched cloth for buckram at the Val Bleach Works of Messrs. Buckram Limited, at Dunstable Road, Luton, subject to compliance with the Welfare Order dated 9th October, 1917 (Supply of Drinking Water), and to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks; that there shall be provided: suitable protective clothing, cloakroom and mess-room accommodation, washing facilities and facilities for sitting; and that arrangements

shall be made for the effective and regular supervision of the workers by a responsible forewoman.
