

PART II—*continued.*

In the case of a Female worker employed on Piece-work, each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY WORKER of the class in question not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate appropriate to the class.

In determining whether any Piece-Rate satisfies the above-mentioned condition, regard must be had only to the earnings of ordinary workers, *i.e.*, workers of ordinary skill and experience in the class of work in question, and not to the earnings of workers of less than ordinary skill and experience, *e.g.*, learners and infirm workers.

PART III.

PROPOSED OVERTIME RATES.

Overtime Rates based on the appropriate proposed General Minimum Time-Rate or Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, as set out in Part I or Part II of this Schedule, and calculated in the manner described in Part III of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice H.M. (10), dated 9th November, 1922, shall apply to workers of the classes specified in Parts I and II of this Schedule in substitution for the Proposed Minimum Rates in respect of all time worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board, in the above-mentioned Part of the Notice H.M. (10), to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

PART IV.

APPLICABILITY OF PROPOSED MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES.

Subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts the proposed Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule shall apply to all Female Workers in England and Wales of the classes specified in Parts I and II of this Schedule in respect of all time during which they are employed in the Hat, Cap and Millinery Trade, as specified in the Trade Boards (Hat, Cap and Millinery) Order, 1919, and as set out in Part V of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice H.M. (10), dated 9th November, 1922.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 2nd day of October, 1923. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Hat, Cap and Millinery Trade Board (England and Wales), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W.1.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.
