The KING has been graciously pleased, by Warrant under His Majesty's Royal Sign Manual, to ordain and declare that Gladys, widow and relict of Hubert Francis Fitzwilliam Brabazon Foljambe, Esquire, late Captain The King's Royal Rifle Corps, deceased, and Dorothy Alfreda Bewicke-Copley, Spinster, shall henceforth respectively have, hold and enjoy the same title, rank, place, pre-eminence and precedence as the daughters of a Baron which would have been due to them respectively had their mother, Dame Selina Frances Bewicke-Copley, wife of Sir Robert Calverley Alington Bewicke-Copley, C.B., Colonel The King's Royal Rifle Corps, both deceased, survived and succeeded to the title and dignity of Baroness Cromwell by the termination of the abeyance.

And to command that the said Royal Order and declaration be recorded in His Majesty's College of Arms.

The KING has been graciously pleased to give and grant unto Victor Robert Montgomerie, of Hunsdon House, nr. Ware, in the county of Hertford, Esquire, O.B.E., Major on the Reserve List of the 2nd Life Guards, His Royal Licence and authority that

he may take and use the surname of Charrington in addition to, and after that of Montgomerie, that he may bear the Arms of Charrington quarterly with those of Montgomerie, and that such surname and arms may in like manner be taken, borne and used by his issue, the said arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms and recorded in the College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal Licence and permission to be void and of none effect and to command that the said Royal Grant be recorded in His Majesty's College of Arms.
