MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE WORKERS UNDER 21 YEARS OF AGE OTHER THAN WORKERS EMPLOYED IN THE SCRAP METAL BRANCH OF THE TRADE.

Effective as from 19th November, 1923.*

* Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by any employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in any case not later than 25th November, 1923.

PAYMENT OF HALF-YEARLY INCREASES.

SECTION II.

٠.

In the case of workers of 14½ years of age and under 21 years of age the rate applicable to a worker of any particular age specified in Section I shall only become payable on the first pay day in January or July, as the case may be, which corresponds with or immediately follows the date on which the worker attains such age. Until such time the rate payable shall be that applicable to a worker of the next lower age group.

Note.—In the case of Male Workers under 21 years of age employed on piece-work; each piece-rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ordinary worker of any particular age group as shown above, at least the equivalent of the General Minimum Time-Rate appropriate to such age group.

PART II.

OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE WORKERS UNDER 21 YEARS OF AGE.

Overtime Rates, calculated on the minimum rates of wages specified in Part I of this Schedule, in the manner set out in Part III of the Schedule of the Notice D.B. (7) issued by the Trade Board and dated 30th January, 1923, apply in substitution for the rates set out in Part I of this Schedule in respect of all hours worked by a worker as defined in that Part in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in Part III of the Schedule of the above mentioned Notice D.B. (7) to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.
