In pursuance of an Act for better preserving  
the Navigation of the River Mersey (5 and 6  
Vic., cap. 110), We,

JOSEPH ASHWORTH AND SONS LTD.,  
Fertilisers and Feeding Stuffs Manufacturers,  
Frodsham Bridge, Cheshire,

hereby give you notice, that we propose to  
construct at Frodsham Bridge, in accordance  
with Plans and Sections deposited at the Office  
of the Mersey Conservancy, an electric cable  
(insulated) in the bed of River Weaver at  
Frodsham Bridge from the premises known as  
"The Ashworth Oil Cake Mills" to the factory  
on the opposite bank of the river, and known as  
"The Frodsham Bridge Bone and Manure  
Works." The proposed works are for the  
supplying of electric current for power pur-  
poses. It is proposed to commence the work  
early in December, 1923. The cable will be  
weighted and embedded in the mud on the bed  
of the River Weaver, and will not interfere with  
the tidal or other waters of the river.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF  
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 13TH NOVEMBER, 1923.)

YORKSHIRE AND LANCASHIRE (FOOT-  
AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF  
1923 (No. 5).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries,  
by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested  
in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts,  
1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling  
him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Alteration of Controlled Area and of Prohibited  
Areas.*

1. The Yorkshire and Lancashire (Foot-and-  
Mouth Disease) Order of 1923 (No. 4) shall  
be read and have effect as if the Prohibited  
Areas and Controlled Area described in the  
First Schedule hereto were substituted respec-  
tively for the Prohibited Areas and Controlled  
Area described in the Schedule to that Order,  
and the Area described in the Second Schedule  
hereto is accordingly released from the restric-  
tions imposed by that Order.

*Commencement.*

2. This Order shall come into operation on  
the fifteenth day of November, nineteen  
hundred and twenty-three.

*Short Title.*

3. This Order may be cited as the YORK-  
SHIRE AND LANCASHIRE (FOOT-AND-MOUTH  
DISEASE) ORDER OF 1923 (No. 5).

*Areas to which the Yorkshire and Lancashire  
(Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1923  
(No. 4) continues to apply.*

*Prohibited Areas.*

(1) An Area comprising:—

*In the Administrative County of the West  
Riding of Yorkshire.*

The parishes of Coniston Cold, Gargrave,  
Broughton, Elslack, Hornton-in-Craven, Earby,  
Salterforth, Barnoldswick, Brogden (including  
its detached part), Middop, Rimington, Gis-  
burn (*except its detached part*), Horton, News-  
holme, Nappa, Swinden, Bank Newton,  
Martons Both, Bracewell, Calton, Flasby-  
with-Winterburn, Eshton, and Stirton-with-  
Thorlby, and the detached part of the parish  
of Sawley; and

*In the Administrative County of Lancaster.*

The parishes of Blacko, and Foulridge  
(*except its detached part*).

(2) An Area comprising:—

*In the Administrative County of the West  
Riding of Yorkshire.*

The boroughs of Morley, Ossett and Ponte-  
fract;

The petty sessional divisions of Tadcaster  
(*except the parishes of Long Marston, Hutton,  
Wandesley and Angram*), Upper Barkston Ash  
(*excluding its detached part*), Upper Osgold-  
cross, Lower Agbrigg (*except the parishes of  
Flockton and Emley*), and Skyrack (including  
its detached part, *but excluding the parishes  
of Horsforth, Rawdon, Adel-cum-Eccup, and  
Alwoodley*), the detached part of the petty  
sessional division of Lower Barkston Ash, and

The parishes of Wintersett, Ryhill, Haver-  
croft with Cold Hiendley, South Hiendley,  
Shafton, High Hoyland, Kexborough, Woolley,  
Notton, Royston, Carlton, Darton, Drighling-  
ton, Harewood, Kearsby with Netherby, Sick-  
linghall, East Keswick, Bardsey-cum-Rigton,  
Wothersome, Collingham, Linton, Wetherby,  
Micklethwaite, Boston Spa, Thorp Arch,  
Walton, Clifford, Bramham-cum-Oglethorpe,  
and Ryther-cum-Ossendyke.

And also comprising:—

The County Boroughs of Leeds and Wake-  
field.
