## YORKSHIRE AND LANCASHIRE (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1923 (No. 6).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals

Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Meaning of Terms.*

1. In this Order:—

“ A Prohibited Area ” means an Area in which the movement of animals is hereby prohibited;

“ A Controlled Area ” means an Area in which the movement of animals is hereby controlled;

The Prohibited Areas and the Controlled Areas are described in the Schedule hereto. If any farm (excluding any detached part) is partly within and partly outside a Prohibited Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within that Area. Subject to this provision, if any farm (excluding any detached part) is partly within and partly outside a Controlled Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within such Area;

“ Animals ” means cattle, sheep, goats and pigs;

“ Slaughterhouse ” means premises used habitually and solely for the purpose of slaughtering animals, but does not include a slaughterhouse which forms part of a farm.

*Restrictions in Force in a Prohibited Area.*

2.—(a) No animals shall be moved into or out of a Prohibited Area, except as herein-after provided;

(b) No animals shall be moved along or across any road or other highway, or by water, within a Prohibited Area, or be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any such road or highway;

(c) No market, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in a Prohibited Area;

(d) No slaughterhouse manure or refuse shall be moved out of a Prohibited Area or be brought into contact with animals in a Prohibited Area.

*Control of Dogs in Prohibited Area.*

3.—(a) Dogs in a Prohibited Area shall at all times, except whilst in a dwelling-house, be kept under control by being:—

(i) confined in a kennel or other enclosure from which the dog cannot escape; or

(ii) secured to some premises by a collar and chain; or

(iii) accompanied by the owner or some person deputed by him and under effectual control.

(b) Any dog which is not kept under control, as prescribed by this Order, may be seized by the Local Authority, or by the Police, and any dog so seized shall be dealt with in the same manner as a stray dog seized under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906, is thereby authorised to be dealt with. No dog so seized shall be given or sold for the purpose of vivisection.

*Provision for Movement into a Prohibited Area*

(1) of Animals for Immediate Slaughter, and  
(2) of Cows and Heifers.

4.—(1) Animals may be moved from premises outside a Prohibited Area to a slaughter-

house in any borough or urban district in a Prohibited Area, subject to the following conditions:—

(i) A licence authorising the movement must be obtained from an Inspector of the Local Authority of the destination before the movement commences. This licence must accompany the animals throughout the whole movement;

(ii) The animals must be put on rail at a station outside a Prohibited Area, and be moved by railway without being untrucked within a Prohibited Area until arrival at the railway station nearest to the place of destination: Provided that where the distance from the railway station in the Area to the place of destination is greater than the distance to be covered within the Area if the movement were to take place by road, the Inspector granting the licence may specify therein any other route if he thinks it desirable, and may require the animals to be moved by float.

(2) Cows and heifers may be moved from premises outside a Prohibited Area to premises in any such Area to which this Order applies if they are accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Ministry, and subject to such conditions, if any, as may be inserted in the licence.

*Restrictions in Force in a Controlled Area.*

5.—(a) No animal shall be moved out of a Controlled Area except into a Prohibited Area. Such movement shall be limited to cows and heifers and to animals intended for immediate slaughter, as provided in the preceding Article.

(b) No animals shall be moved without a licence under Articles 4 or 6 of this Order:—

(i) into a Controlled Area; or

(ii) along or across any road or other highway or by water within a Controlled Area,

(c) No animal shall be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any road or other highway in a Controlled Area;

(d) No market, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in a Controlled Area; except a market or sale for fat animals intended for immediate slaughter or a sale of animals on farm premises. A licence must be obtained from the Local Authority to hold any such market or sale, and a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend and examine the animals exposed thereat;

(e) No slaughterhouse manure or refuse shall be moved out of a Controlled Area or be brought into contact with animals in such Area;

*Movement of Animals by Licence into or within a Controlled Area.*

6.—(1) Licences may be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority for the following movement of animals only:—

(a) From premises outside a Prohibited Area and Controlled Area to a slaughterhouse in a Controlled Area;

(b) From a farm in a Controlled Area to a licensed fat stock market or fat stock sale in such Area;

(c) From a licensed fat stock market or sale in a Controlled Area, or from a farm or other premises in a Controlled Area, to a slaughterhouse in such Area;

(d) From one farm to another in a Controlled Area or between different parts of the same farm in such Area, if the Inspector considers the movement to be necessary or expedient. These licences may be made available for movement as often as required if the Inspector endorses the licences "Occupation Licence."

(e) In the case of store cattle (including cows and heifers) only, for movement from premises outside the Prohibited Areas and Controlled Areas to premises in a Controlled Area.

(2) No licence shall be granted under this Order for the movement of animals from any premises to any farm for the purpose of sale at a licensed farm sale.

*Conditions of Licences.*

7.—(a) Licences may be granted only by an Inspector of the Local Authority in whose district the movement commences, except in the case of movement from premises outside the Prohibited Areas and Controlled Areas to a slaughterhouse or other premises in such Areas, in which case the licence shall be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the slaughterhouse or place of destination is situate;

(b) Licences shall not permit movement on any road in a Prohibited Area, or movement out of a Controlled Area, in order to reach a destination in the latter Area;

(c) Occupation Licences may be withdrawn at any time by a notice served by an Inspector of the Local Authority on the person to whom such licence was granted;

(d) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, must be delivered up at or sent by post to the nearest Police Station, or to an officer of the Local Authority, immediately after completion of the movement;

(e) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, shall only be available for four days, including the day of issue, and shall accompany the animals throughout the movement;

(f) Animals while being moved with a licence under this Order shall be moved as far as practicable by the nearest available route and without avoidable delay to the place of destination specified in the licence, and not elsewhere, and shall be kept separate, as far as practicable, from all other animals;

(g) Copies of licences authorising movement into the district of another Local Authority shall be sent by the Inspector issuing such licences to such other Local Authority;

(h) Licences shall be produced by the person in charge of the animals moved there-with on demand to an Inspector or to a Constable, and such person shall, if required by such officer, give his name and address.

*Movement through Prohibited Areas or Controlled Areas by Railway Permitted.*

8. This Order shall not prevent the movement of animals direct by railway through the

Prohibited Areas, or through the Controlled Areas, or both, if the animals are not untrucked within such Areas.

*Animals for Slaughter to be Marked.*

9.—(a) Animals moved to a slaughterhouse in accordance with a licence under this Order shall be detained at such slaughterhouse until they are slaughtered;

(b) Before movement commences all such animals shall be marked as follows:—

*Cattle.*—A broad arrow six inches long clipped on the left hindquarter and the hair clipped off the end of the tail.

*Sheep.*—A broad arrow clipped on the forehead and a letter M six inches long painted or stamped with red or blue adhesive composition on both sides of each sheep.

*Pigs.*—Letter M painted or stamped on both sides of the pig with red or blue adhesive composition.

*Closing of Footpaths and Premises.*

10.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may (notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way) prohibit the entry of any person into any field, shed or other place in a Prohibited Area by giving notice in writing to that effect to the occupier. In such cases the owner of the animals in such places, or his agents or servants, may enter for the sole purpose of feeding or tending the animals, but no other persons shall enter any such place until such notice has been withdrawn by a further notice from an Inspector, unless he has obtained a licence to do so from an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority;

(2) Copies of such notices shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he may think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed;

(3) Copies of such notices, when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

*General Power to Control Dogs and Poultry.*

11.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may, by a written notice served upon the occupier of any premises in a Prohibited Area, on which dogs or poultry are kept, require such occupier to keep such dogs or poultry under such control as may be prescribed in the notice, or to confine them to any specified part of the premises;

(2) Copies of such notices, when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

*Local Authority to Enforce Order.*

12. This Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

*Offences.*

13. Any contravention of this Order or of any notice served thereunder shall be deemed to be an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and renders the offender liable to prosecution.

*Revocation of Orders.*

14. The Yorkshire and Lancashire (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Orders of 1923 (Nos. 4 and 5) are hereby revoked.

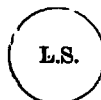

## IMPORTED ANIMALS ORDER OF 1923.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Alteration of Regulations as to movement of imported animals from Approved Landing Places.*

1. The Regulations as to movement of imported cattle contained in the Schedule to the Importation of Animals Act, 1922 (Session 2), and the provisions of Part 4 of the Animals (Landing from Ireland, Channel Islands and Isle of Man) Order of 1923, and the provisions of Part 5 of the Importation of Canadian Cattle Order of 1923, are hereby altered and modified in manner prescribed by this Order.

*Premises to which movement may be authorised.*

2. No licence shall be granted authorising the movement of imported cattle, sheep, or goats out of an Approved Landing Place to a market, but only to premises (including a slaughterhouse) other than a market.

*Detention of Animals.*

3.—(1) Animals moved from an Approved Landing Place to a slaughterhouse shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.

(2) Animals moved from an Approved Land-ing Place to premises other than a slaughter-house shall, on arriving at those premises, be detained therein, unless previously slaughtered therein, for a period of 14 days from the date of their arrival thereat and such period shall be substituted for the period of six days speci-fied in the Regulations and provisions hereby altered and modified. During the said period of detention the animals shall not be moved from the said premises otherwise than under a further licence to be granted by a local inspector.

(3) Animals may if so authorised and accom-panied by any such licence be moved after the expiration of six days from the date of their arrival—

(1) to a slaughterhouse to be there de-tained until they are slaughtered; or

(2) to any other premises (other than a market) to be there detained for the remainder of the said period of fourteen days, which period shall be stated in the licence; or

(3) to a vessel for export.

(4) If the place of destination to be stated in such further licence is situate in the District of another Local Authority the licence shall not be granted unless the consent of that Local Authority to the movement of the animals into their District has been previously obtained.

*Disinfection of Railway Trucks and Railway Loading Banks.*

4.—(1) A railway truck or other railway vehicle used for the conveyance of any animals from an Approved Landing Place shall, immediately before any such animal is placed in it, be thoroughly sprayed with liquid disinfectant, under the supervision and to the satisfaction of the Inspector of the Ministry at the Landing Place.

(2) A railway loading bank or loading dock used for the loading of imported animals at an Approved Landing Place for conveyance therefrom shall, when required by an Inspector of the Ministry at the Landing Place, be thoroughly sprayed with liquid disinfectant.

(3) The liquid disinfectant to be used for the purposes of this Article shall be—

(a) a one per cent. (minimum) solution of chloride of lime containing not less than thirty per cent. of available chlorine; or

(b) a five per cent. (minimum) solution of carbolic acid (containing not less than ninety-five per cent. of actual carbolic acid); or

(c) a disinfectant equal in disinfective efficiency to the above-mentioned solution of carbolic acid.

(4) Nothing in this Article shall interfere with the operation of the provisions of the Animals (Transit and General) Order of 1912 as to the cleansing and disinfection of railway trucks and other railway vehicles used for the conveyance of animals on a railway.

(5) If anything is omitted to be done in contravention of this Article the railway company loading the animals or owning the loading banks in respect of which, as the case may be, the same is omitted to be done, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

*Revocation.*

5. The Animals (Prohibition of Landing from Ireland) Order of 1923 is hereby revoked.

*Removal of restrictions on landing of animals at the port of Heysham.*

6. Notwithstanding the provisions of Article 5 (f) of the Yorkshire and Lancashire (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1923 (No. 4), animals may be landed at the Approved Landing Place at Heysham.

*Commencement.*

7. This Order shall come into operation on the nineteenth day of November, nineteen hundred and twenty-three.

*Short Title.*

8. This Order may be cited as the IMPORTED ANIMALS ORDER OF 1923.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

RENFREWSHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1923 (No. 5).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Meaning of Terms.*

1 In this Order:—

“The Prohibited Area” means the Area in which the movement of animals is hereby prohibited;

“The Controlled Area” means the Area in which the movement of animals is hereby controlled.

The Prohibited Area and the Controlled Area are described in the Schedule hereto. If any farm (excluding any detached part) is partly within and partly outside the Prohibited Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within that Area. Subject to this provision, if any farm (excluding any detached part) is partly within and partly outside a Controlled Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Controlled Area;

“Animals” means cattle, sheep, goats and pigs;

“Slaughterhouse” means premises used habitually and solely for the purpose of slaughtering animals, but does not include a slaughterhouse which forms part of a farm.

*Restrictions in Force in the Prohibited Area.*

2.—(a) No animals shall be moved into or out of the Prohibited Area, except as herein-after provided;

(b) No animals shall be moved along or across any road or other highway, or by water, within the Prohibited Area, or be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any such road or highway;

(c) No market, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in the Prohibited Area;

(d) No slaughterhouse manure or refuse shall be moved out of the Prohibited Area or be brought into contact with animals in the Prohibited Area;

(e) The landing of animals at the approved landing place and the imported animals wharf at the port of Glasgow, is hereby prohibited.

*Control of Dogs in Prohibited Area.*

3.—(a) Dogs in the Prohibited Area shall at all times, except whilst in a dwelling-house, be kept under control by being:—

(i) confined in a kennel or other enclosure from which the dog cannot escape; or

(ii) secured to some premises by a collar and chain; or

(iii) accompanied by the owner or some person deputed by him and under effectual control

(b) Any dog which is not kept under control, as prescribed by this Order, may be seized by the Local Authority, or by the Police, and any dog so seized shall be dealt with in the same manner as a stray dog seized under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906, is thereby authorised to be dealt with. No dog so seized shall be given or sold for the purposes of vivisection.

*Provisions for Movement of Animals into Prohibited Area.*

4.—(1) Animals may be moved from premises outside the Prohibited Area to which this Order applies to any public slaughterhouse in the Prohibited Area, subject to the following conditions:—

(i) A Licence authorising the movement must be obtained from an Inspector of the Local Authority of the destination before the movement commences. This licence must accompany the animals throughout the whole movement;

(ii) The animals must either (1) be put on rail at a station outside the Prohibited Area, and be moved by railway without being untrucked within the Prohibited Area until arrival at the railway station nearest to the place of destination; or (2) be moved by water to a landing place specified in the licence in the Prohibited Area, and thence by railway to the railway station nearest the place of destination: Provided that where the distance from the railway station or landing place in the Area to the place of destination is greater than the distance to be covered within the Area if the movement were to take place by road, the Inspector granting the licence may specify therein any other route if he thinks it desirable, and may require the animals to be moved by float or other suitable vehicle.

(2). Animals, the movement of which is necessary for breeding or wintering may be moved from premises outside the Prohibited Area to which this Order applies to premises in such Area, if they are accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Ministry, and subject to such conditions, if any, as may be inserted in the licence.

*Restrictions in Force in the Controlled Area.*

5.—(a) No animal shall be moved out of the Controlled Area except into the Prohibited Area to which this Order applies, as provided in the preceding article;

(b) No animal shall be moved without a licence under Articles 4 or 6 of this Order:—

(i) into the Controlled Area; or

(ii) along or across any road or other highway or by water within the Controlled Area;

(c) No animal shall be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any road or other highway in the Controlled Area;

(d) No market, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in the Controlled Area; except a market or sale for fat animals intended for immediate slaughter or a sale of animals on farm premises. A licence must be obtained from the Local Authority to hold any

such market or sale, and a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend and examine the animals exposed thereat;

(e) No slaughterhouse manure or refuse shall be moved out of the Controlled Area or be brought into contact with animals in such Area.

*Movement of Animals by Licence into or within the Controlled Area.*

6.—(1) Licences may be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority for the following movement of animals only:—

*Conditions of Licences.*

(c) Occupation Licences may be withdrawn at any time by a notice served by an Inspector of the Local Authority on the person to whom such Licence was granted;

(d) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, must be delivered up at or sent by post to the nearest Police Station, or to an officer of the Local Authority, immediately after completion of the movement;

(e) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, shall only be available for four days, including the day of issue, and shall accompany the animals throughout the movement;

(f) Animals while being moved with a licence under this Order shall be moved as far as practicable by the nearest available route

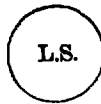

FIFE AND PERTSHIRE DISTRICT  
(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER  
OF 1923.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Meaning of Terms.*

1. In this Order:—

“ A Prohibited Area ” means an Area in which the movement of animals is hereby prohibited;

“ The Controlled Area ” means the Area in which the movement of animals is hereby controlled;

The Prohibited Areas and the Controlled Areas are described in the Schedule hereto. If any farm (excluding any detached part) is partly within and partly outside a Prohibited Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within that Area. Subject to this provision, if any farm (excluding any detached part) is partly within and partly outside the Controlled Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Controlled Area;

“ Animals ” means cattle, sheep, goats and pigs;

“ Slaughterhouse ” means premises used habitually and solely for the purpose of slaughtering animals, but does not include a slaughterhouse which forms part of a farm.

*Restrictions in Force in a Prohibited Area.*

2.—(a) No animals shall be moved into or out of a Prohibited Area, except as hereinafter provided;

(b) No animals shall be moved along or across any road or other highway, or by water, within a Prohibited Area, or be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any such road or highway;

(c) No market, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in a Prohibited Area;

(d) No slaughterhouse manure or refuse shall be moved out of a Prohibited Area or be brought into contact with animals in a Prohibited Area.

*Control of Dogs in Prohibited Areas.*

3.—(a) Dogs in a Prohibited Area shall at all times, except whilst in a dwelling-house, be kept under control by being:—

(i) confined in a kennel or other enclosure from which the dog cannot escape; or

(ii) secured to some premises by a collar and chain; or

(iii) accompanied by the owner or some person deputed by him and under effectual control;

(b) Any dog which is not kept under control, as prescribed by this Order, may be seized by the Local Authority, or by the Police, and any dog so seized shall be dealt with in the same manner as a stray dog seized under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906, is thereby authorised to be dealt with. No dog so seized shall be given or sold for the purpose of vivisection.

*Provisions for Movement of Animals into a Prohibited Area.*

4.—(1) Animals may be moved from premises outside a Prohibited Area to which this Order applies to any public slaughterhouse in a Prohibited Area, subject to the following conditions:—

(i) A licence authorising the movement must be obtained from an Inspector of the Local Authority of the destination before the movement commences. This licence must accompany the animals throughout the whole movement;

(ii) The animals must be put on rail at a station outside a Prohibited Area and be moved by railway without being untrucked within the Prohibited Area until arrival at the railway station nearest to the place of destination: Provided that where the distance from the railway station in the Area to the place of destination is greater than the distance to be covered within the Area if the movement were to take place by road, the Inspector granting the licence may specify therein any other route if he thinks it desirable, and may require the animals to be moved by float or other suitable vehicle;

(2) Animals, the movement of which is necessary for breeding or wintering, may be moved from premises outside a Prohibited Area, to which this Order applies, to premises in any such Area, or from one such Area to another such Area, if they are accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by any Inspector of the Ministry, and subject to such conditions, if any, as may be inserted in the licence.

*Restrictions in Force in the Controlled Area.*

5.—(a) No animal shall be moved out of the Controlled Area except into a Prohibited Area to which this Order applies as provided in the preceding article;

(b) No animal shall be moved without a licence under Articles 4 or 6 of this Order:—

(i) into the Controlled Area; or

(ii) along or across any road or other highway or by water within the Controlled Area;

(c) No animal shall be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any road or other highway in the Controlled Area;

(d) No market, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in the Controlled Area, except a market or sale for fat animals intended for immediate slaughter, or a sale of animals on farm premises. A licence must be obtained from the Local Authority to hold any such market or sale, and a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend and examine the animals exposed thereat;

(e) No slaughterhouse manure or refuse shall be moved out of the Controlled Area or be brought into contact with animals in such Area.

*Movement of Animals by Licence into or within the Controlled Area.*

6.—(1) Licences may be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority for the following movement of animals only:—

(a) From premises outside a Prohibited Area and Controlled Area to a slaughterhouse in the Controlled Area;

(b) From a farm in the Controlled Area to a licensed fat stock market or fat stock sale in such Area;

(c) From a licensed fat stock market or sale in the Controlled Area, or from a farm or other premises in the Controlled Area, to a slaughterhouse in such Area;

(d) From one farm to another in the Controlled Area or between different parts of the same farm in such Area, if the Inspector considers the movement to be necessary or expedient. (These licences may be made available for movement as often as required if the Inspector endorses the licences "Occupation Licence");

(e) In the case of animals, the movement of which is necessary for breeding or wintering only, for movement from premises outside the Prohibited Areas and Controlled Area to premises in the Controlled Area.

(2) No licence shall be granted under this Order for the movement of animals from any premises to any farm for the purpose of sale at a licensed farm sale.

*Conditions of Licences.*

7.—(a) Licences may be granted only by an Inspector of the Local Authority in whose district the movement commences, except in the case of movement from premises outside the Prohibited Areas and Controlled Area to a slaughterhouse, in which case the licence shall be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the slaughterhouse is situate;

(b) Licences for movements to destinations in the Controlled Area shall not permit movement on any road in a Prohibited Area, or movement out of the Controlled Area in order to reach a destination in the latter Area;

(c) Occupation Licences may be withdrawn at any time by a notice served by an Inspector of the Local Authority on the person to whom such Licence was granted;

(d) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, must be delivered up at or sent by post to the nearest Police Station, or to an officer of the Local Authority, immediately after completion of the movement;

(e) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, shall only be available for four days, including the day of issue, and shall accompany the animals throughout the movement;

(f) Animals while being moved with a licence under this Order shall be moved as far as practicable by the nearest available route and without avoidable delay to the place of destination specified in the licence, and not elsewhere, and shall be kept separate, as far as practicable, from all other animals;

(g) Copies of licences authorising movement into the district of another Local Authority shall be sent by the Inspector issuing such licences to such other Local Authority;

(h) Licences shall be produced by the person in charge of the animals moved therewith on demand to an Inspector or to a Constable, and such person shall, if required by such officer, give his name and address.

*Movement through Prohibited Areas or Controlled Area by Railway Permitted.*

8. This Order shall not prevent the movement of animals direct by railway through the Prohibited Areas, or through the Controlled Area, or both, if the animals are not untrucked within such Area.

*Animals for Slaughter to be Marked.*

9.—(a) Animals moved to a slaughterhouse in accordance with a licence under this Order shall be detained at such slaughterhouse until they are slaughtered;

(b) Before movement commences all such animals shall be marked as follows:—

*Cattle.*—A broad arrow six inches long clipped on the left hindquarter and the hair clipped off the end of the tail.

*Sheep.*—A broad arrow clipped on the forehead and a letter M six inches long painted or stamped with red or blue adhesive composition on both sides of each sheep.

*Pigs.*—Letter M painted or stamped on both sides of the pig with red or blue adhesive composition.

*Closing of Footpaths and Premises.*

10.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may (notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way) prohibit the entry of any person into any field, shed or other place in the Prohibited Area by giving notice in writing to that effect to the occupier. In such cases the owner of the animals in such places, or his agents or servants, may enter for the sole purpose of feed-

ing or tending the animals, but no other person shall enter any such place until such notice has been withdrawn by a further notice from an Inspector, unless he has obtained a licence to do so from an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority;

(2) Copies of such notices shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he may think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed;

(3) Copies of such notices, when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

*General Power to Control Dogs and Poultry.*

ORDER OF 1923.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Meaning of Terms.*

1. In this Order:—

“ A Prohibited Area ” means an Area in which the movement of animals is hereby prohibited;

“ The Controlled Area ” means the Area in which the movement of animals is hereby controlled.

The Prohibited Areas and the Controlled Area are described in the Schedule hereto. If any farm (excluding any detached part) is partly within and partly outside a Prohibited Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within that Area. Subject to this provision, if any farm (excluding any detached part) is partly within and partly outside the Controlled Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Controlled Area;

“ Animals ” means cattle, sheep, goats and pigs;

“ Slaughterhouse ” means premises used habitually and solely for the purpose of slaughtering animals, but does not include a slaughterhouse which forms part of a farm.

*Restrictions in Force in a Prohibited Area.*

2.—(a) No animals shall be moved into or out of a Prohibited Area, except as hereinafter provided;

(b) No animals shall be moved along or across any road or other highway, or by water, within a Prohibited Area, or be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any such road or highway;

(c) No market, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in a Prohibited Area;

(d) No slaughterhouse manure or refuse shall be moved out of a Prohibited Area or be brought into contact with animals in a Prohibited Area.

*Control of Dogs in Prohibited Area.*

3.—(a) Dogs in a Prohibited Area shall at all times, except whilst in a dwelling-house, be kept under control by being:—

(i) confined in a kennel or other enclosure from which the dog cannot escape; or

(ii) secured to some premises by a collar and chain; or

(iii) accompanied by the owner or some person deputed by him and under effectual control.

(b) Any dog which is not kept under control, as prescribed by this Order, may be seized by the Local Authority, or by the Police, and any dog so seized shall be dealt with in the same manner as a stray dog seized under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906, is thereby authorised to be dealt with. No dog so seized shall be given or sold for the purpose of vivisection.

*Provision for Movement of Animals into a Prohibited Area for Immediate Slaughter.*

4. Animals may be moved from premises outside a Prohibited Area to which this Order applies to a slaughterhouse in any borough or urban district in a Prohibited Area, subject to the following conditions:—

(i) A licence authorising the movement must be obtained from an Inspector of the Local Authority of the destination before the movement commences. This licence must accompany the animals throughout the whole movement.

(ii) The animals must be put on rail at a station outside a Prohibited Area, and be moved by railway without being untrucked within the Prohibited Area until arrival at the railway station nearest to the place of destination: Provided that where the distance from the railway station in the Area to the place of destination is greater than the distance to be covered within the Area if the movement were to take place by road, the Inspector granting the licence may specify therein any other route if he thinks it desirable, and may require the animals to be moved by float.

*Restrictions in Force in the Controlled Area.*

5.—(a) No animal shall be moved out of the Controlled Area, except into a Prohibited Area to which this Order applies for immediate slaughter as provided in the preceding article;

(b) No animal shall be moved without a licence under Articles 4 or 6 of this Order:—

(i) into the Controlled Area; or

(ii) along or across any road or other highway or by water within the Controlled Area;

(c) No animal shall be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any road or other highway in the Controlled Area;

(d) No market, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in the Controlled Area, except a market or sale for fat animals intended for immediate slaughter, or a sale of animals on farm premises. A licence must be obtained from the Local Authority to hold any such market or sale, and a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend and examine the animals exposed thereat;

(e) No slaughterhouse manure or refuse shall be moved out of the Controlled Area or be brought into contact with animals in such Area.

*Movement of Animals by Licence into or within the Controlled Area.*

6.—(1) Licences may be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority for the following movements of animals only:—

(a) From premises outside the Prohibited Area and Controlled Area to a slaughterhouse in the Controlled Area;

(b) From a farm in the Controlled Area to a licensed fat stock market or fat stock sale in such Area;

(c) From a licensed fat stock market or sale in the Controlled Area, or from a farm or other premises in the Controlled Area, to a slaughterhouse in such Area;

(d) From one farm to another in the Controlled Area, or between different parts of the same farm in such Area if the Inspector considers the movement to be necessary or expedient. These licences may be made available for movement as often as required if the Inspector endorses the licences "Occupation Licence."

(2) No licence shall be granted under this Order for the movement of animals from any premises to any farm for the purpose of sale at a licensed farm sale.

*Conditions of Licences.*

7.—(a) Licences may be granted only by an Inspector of the Local Authority in whose district the movement commences, except in the case of movement from premises outside the Prohibited Areas and Controlled Area to a slaughterhouse, in which case the licence shall be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the slaughterhouse is situate.

(b) Licences shall not permit movement on any road in a Prohibited Area, or movement out of the Controlled Area in order to reach a destination in the latter Area;

(c) Occupation Licences may be withdrawn at any time by a notice served by an Inspector of the Local Authority on the person to whom such licence was granted;

(d) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, must be delivered up at or sent by post to the nearest Police Station, or to an

officer of the Local Authority, immediately after completion of the movement;

(e) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, shall only be available for four days, including the day of issue, and shall accompany the animals throughout the movement;

(f) Animals, while being moved with a licence under this Order shall be moved as far as practicable by the nearest available route and without avoidable delay to the place of destination specified in the licence, and not elsewhere, and shall be kept separate, as far as practicable, from all other animals;

(g) Copies of licences authorising movement into the district of another Local Authority shall be sent by the Inspector issuing such licences to such other Local Authority;

(h) Licences shall be produced by the person in charge of the animals moved therewith on demand to an Inspector or to a Constable, and such person shall, if required by such officer, give his name and address.

*Movement through Prohibited Areas or Controlled Area by Railway Permitted.*

8. This Order shall not prevent the movement of animals direct by railway through the Prohibited Areas or through the Controlled Area, or both, if the animals are not untrucked within such Areas.

*Animals for Slaughter to be Marked.*

9.—(a) Animals moved to a slaughterhouse in accordance with a licence under this Order shall be detained at such slaughterhouse until they are slaughtered;

(b) Before movement commences all such animals shall be marked as follows:—

*Cattle.*—A broad arrow six inches long clipped on the left hindquarter and the hair clipped off the end of the tail.

*Sheep.*—A broad arrow clipped on the forehead and a letter M six inches long painted or stamped with red or blue adhesive composition on both sides of each sheep.

*Pigs.*—Letter M painted or stamped on both sides of the pig with red or blue adhesive composition.

*Closing of Footpaths and Premises.*

10.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may (notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way) prohibit the entry of any person into any field, shed or other place in a Prohibited Area by giving notice in writing to that effect to the occupier. In such cases the owner of the animals in such places, or his agents or servants, may enter for the sole purpose of feeding or tending the animals, but no other persons shall enter any such place until such notice has been withdrawn by a further notice from an Inspector, unless he has obtained a licence to do so from an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority;

(2) Copies of such notices shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he may think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed;

(3) Copies of such notices, when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

*General Power to Control Dogs and Poultry.*

11.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may, by a written notice served upon the occupier of any premises in a Prohibited Area on which dogs or poultry are kept, require such occupier to keep such dogs or poultry under such control as may be prescribed in the notice, or to confine them to any specified part of the premises;

(2) Copies of such notices, when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

*Local Authority to Enforce Order.*

12. This Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

*Offences.*

13. Any contravention of this Order or of any notice served thereunder shall be deemed to be an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and renders the offender liable to prosecution.

*Revocation of Order.*

14. The Yorkshire (East Riding) (Bridlington District) (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1923 (No. 2) and the Yorkshire (East Riding) (Holderness District) (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1923 are hereby revoked

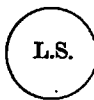

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Meaning of Terms.*

1. In this Order:—

“The Controlled Area” means the Area in which the movement of animals is hereby controlled.

The Controlled Area is described in the Schedule hereto. If any farm (excluding any detached part) is partly within and partly outside the Controlled Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Controlled Area;

“Animals” means cattle, sheep, goats and pigs;

“Slaughterhouse” means premises used habitually and solely for the purpose of slaughtering animals, but does not include a slaughterhouse which forms part of a farm.

*Restrictions in Force in the Controlled Area.*

2.—(a) No animal shall be moved out of the Controlled Area.

(b) No animal shall be moved without a licence under Article 3 of this Order:—

(i) into the Controlled Area; or

(ii) along or across any road or other highway or by water within the Controlled Area;



(c) No animal shall be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any road or other highway in the Controlled Area;

(d) No market, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in the Controlled Area; except a market or sale for fat animals intended for immediate slaughter or a sale of animals on farm premises. A licence must be obtained from the Local Authority to hold any such market or sale, and a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend and examine the animals exposed thereat. No licence shall be granted for the holding of any such sale on any premises within a radius of five miles from any place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease.

(e) No slaughterhouse manure or refuse shall be moved out of the Controlled Area or be brought into contact with animals in such Area.

*Movement of Animals by Licence into or within the Controlled Area.*

3. Licences may be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority for the following movements of animals only:—

(a) From premises outside the Controlled Area to a slaughterhouse in the Controlled Area;

(b) From a farm in the Controlled Area to a licensed fat stock market or fat stock sale in such Area;

(c) From a licensed fat stock market or sale in the Controlled Area or from a farm or other premises in the Controlled Area, to a slaughterhouse in such Area;

(d) From one farm to another in the Controlled Area or between different parts of the same farm in such Area, if the Inspector considers the movement to be necessary or expedient. (These licences may be made available for movement as often as required if the Inspector endorses the licence "Occupation Licence.")

Provided that no licence shall be granted under this Article for (i) the movement of any animal on a road within a radius of two miles from any place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease, or (ii) the movement of animals from any premises to any farm for the purpose of sale at a licensed farm sale.

*Conditions of Licence.*

4.—(a) Licences may be granted only by an Inspector of the Local Authority in whose district the movement commences, except in the case of movement from premises outside the Controlled Area to a slaughterhouse, in which case the licence shall be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the slaughterhouse is situate;

(b) Licences shall not permit movement on any road within a radius of two miles of a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place, or movement out of the Controlled Area in order to reach a destination in that Area;

(c) Occupation Licences may be withdrawn at any time by a notice served by an Inspector of the Local Authority on the person to whom such Licence was granted;

(d) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, must be delivered up at or sent by

post to the nearest Police Station, or to an officer of the Local Authority, immediately after completion of the movement;

(e) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, shall only be available for four days, including the day of issue, and shall accompany the animals throughout the movement;

(f) Animals while being moved with a licence under this Order shall be moved as far as practicable by the nearest available route and without avoidable delay to the place of destination specified in the licence, and not elsewhere, and shall be kept separate, as far as practicable, from all other animals;

(g) Copies of licences authorising movement into the district of another Local Authority shall be sent by the Inspector issuing such licences to such other Local Authority;

(h) Licences shall be produced by the person in charge of the animals moved therewith on demand to an Inspector or to a Constable, and such person shall, if required by such officer, give his name and address.

*Movement through Controlled Area by Railway Permitted.*

5. This Order shall not prevent the movement of animals direct by railway through the Controlled Area, if the animals are not untrucked within such Area.

*Animals for Slaughter to be Marked.*

6.—(a) Animals moved to a slaughterhouse in accordance with a licence under this Order shall be detained at such slaughterhouse until they are slaughtered;

(b) Before movement commences all such animals shall be marked as follows:—

*Cattle.*—A broad arrow six inches long clipped on the left hindquarter and the hair clipped off the end of the tail.

*Sheep.*—A broad arrow clipped on the forehead and a letter M six inches long painted or stamped with red or blue adhesive composition on both sides of each sheep.

*Pigs.*—Letter M painted or stamped on both sides of the pig with red or blue adhesive composition.

*Closing of Footpaths and Premises.*

7.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may (notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way) prohibit the entry of any person into any field, shed or other place in the Prohibited Area by giving notice in writing to that effect to the occupier. In such cases the owner of the animals in such places, or his agents or servants, may enter for the sole purpose of feeding or tending the animals, but no other persons shall enter any such place until such notice has been withdrawn by a further notice from an Inspector, unless he has obtained a licence to do so from an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority;

(2) Copies of such notices shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he may think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed;

(3) Copies of such notices, when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

*Control of Dogs and Poultry.*

8.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may, by a written notice served upon the occupier of any premises in the Controlled Area on which dogs or poultry are kept, require such occupier to keep such dogs or poultry under such control as may be prescribed in the notice, or to confine them to any specified part of the premises;

(2) Copies of such notices, when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

*Local Authority to Enforce Order.*

9. This Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

*Offences.*

10. Any contravention of this Order or of any notice served thereunder shall be deemed to be an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and renders the offender liable to prosecution.

*Revocation of Previous Orders.*

11. 19. To constitute the Council the local lighthouse authority for the purposes and within the meaning of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894.

20. (Provision and Working of Trolley Vehicles in the Borough of St. Helens, the Townships of Eccleston, Rainhill and Whiston, and the Urban District of Prescot; Fares, Rates and Charges; Working Agreements; Incidental Provisions; Abandonment or Discontinuance of Existing Tramways; Borrowing of Money and other Financial and Miscellaneous Matters; Incorporation, Repeal and Amendment of Acts).

**N**OTICE is hereby given, that in pursuance of Section 55 of the St. Helens Corporation Act, 1921, the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of St. Helens (hereinafter called "the Corporation" and "the borough" respectively), intend to apply to the Minister of Transport on or before the 23rd day of December, 1923, for a Provisional Order for all or some of the following amongst other purposes:—

1. To empower the Corporation to provide, maintain, equip, work and run mechanically

propelled vehicles adapted for use upon roads without rails and moved by electrical power supplied by means of overhead conductors or other external source (in this Notice referred to as "trolley vehicles"), along the following routes in the borough and in the townships of Eccleston, Rainhill, and Whiston (all in the Rural District of Whiston), and the Urban District of Prescot, in the county of Lancaster, namely:—

Route No. 2 (in the said townships of Rainhill and Whiston and in the said Urban District of Prescot).—Commencing in the Township of Rainhill by a junction with Route No. 1 at its termination, thence proceeding in a westerly direction along Warrington Road to and terminating in the Urban District of Prescot at the junction of Warrington Road with High Street and St. Helens Road.

2. To authorise the Corporation to provide, erect, lay down and maintain or adapt in connection with and for the purposes of such trolley vehicles all necessary and proper posts, standards, brackets, wires, conductors, mains, apparatus, sheds, buildings, works and conveniences, and to provide and maintain all other necessary and proper electrical and other equipment in, over, under, along and across any public street or road in the borough or in the townships and urban district aforesaid, to supply electrical energy therefor, and to confer on the Corporation the exclusive right of using any apparatus provided, erected, adapted, or used by them for the purpose of working the said trolley vehicles.

3. To extend and apply to the trolley vehicles to be provided by the Corporation under the powers of the proposed Order (in this Notice referred to as "the Order"), and to the works for moving the same by electrical power all or some of the provisions relating to the tramway undertaking of the Corporation, including provisions contained in the St. Helens and District Tramways Act, 1879, the St. Helens and District Tramways Act, 1883, the St. Helens Corporation Act, 1898, the St. Helens Corporation Tramways Order, 1900, the St. Helens Corporation Act, 1911, and the St. Helens Corporation Act, 1921, and any other Act or Order relating to the said undertaking with such modifications, alterations and exceptions as may be enacted in the Order; to extend and apply to such vehicles all or some of the regulations and bye-laws relating to the tramways of the Corporation, or in the alternative to enact in relation to the proposed trolley vehicles provisions similar to the provisions which apply to those undertakings, but with such additions, alterations, exceptions or modifications as may be specified in the Order; to provide that for certain purposes the trolley vehicles shall form part of the tramway undertaking of the Corporation.

4. To make provision either specifically or by incorporation for the following amongst other matters, namely:—The use of trolley vehicle routes on special occasions; the running of special services of cars and the setting apart of special cars for the conveyance of passengers travelling on or using the same on any such special occasion; the demanding of special fares and charges for the use of special vehicles or of any special service thereof in excess of the ordinary fares and charges; passengers' luggage; the carriage of parcels, animals and goods; fares on Sundays and holidays; the temporary stoppage of streets; the acquisition of patent rights; requiring passengers to wait in queues; stopping and starting places; the imposition of penalties upon persons obstructing, damaging or interfering in any manner with the working thereof; the suspension of traffic; the use of trailers; the running of through cars; the erection of shelters, cloak rooms and lost property offices; the use of portions of the public streets and the purchase of land for that purpose; the disposal of lost property; the removal of obstructions; the attachment of brackets to buildings and signs to lamp posts; the lopping of trees on trolley vehicle routes; and the use of trolley vehicles for sanitary services.

5. To exempt the Corporation from liability to any claim in respect of extraordinary traffic for the user of roads by their trolley vehicles subject to such conditions (if any) as may be contained in the Order.

6. To exclude the said trolley vehicles from the operation of the Highways and Locomotives (Amendment) Act, 1878, the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896, the Locomotives Act, 1898, the Motor Car Act, 1903, the Roads Act, 1920, or any of the Orders bye-laws and regulations made thereunder respectively and from the enactments mentioned in the schedule to the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896, and from any other Acts or Orders relating to locomotives, motor cars or omnibuses.

7. To authorise the taking of fares, rates and charges for the use of and for the carriage and conveyance of passengers and goods by such trolley vehicles, and the making and enforcement of bye-laws and regulations in relation thereto.

8. To authorise the Corporation to acquire by agreement, lands and buildings for the purposes of car sheds, garages or depôts, and for other purposes in connection with their trolley vehicles.

9. To enact that the provisions of the Town Police Clauses Acts, 1847 and 1889, and of the Tramways Act, 1870, with respect to the licensing of hackney carriages, omnibuses and light railway cars, and the drivers and conductors thereof, and with respect to the making by a local authority of bye-laws for regulating the use of such vehicles shall not apply to the trolley vehicles of the Corporation, and to provide that these matters shall be dealt with by the Minister of Transport or by some other single authority.

10. To empower the Corporation and any other corporation, authority, company, body or person to enter into and fulfil contracts or agreements with reference to the construction,

maintenance, working, running over, user, leasing, sale or purchase of or interchange of traffic upon the trolley vehicles of the Corporation or the tramways, light railways, trolley vehicles or omnibuses of such other corporation, company, body or person or both of them.

11. To empower the Corporation (if and to the extent to which it may be so provided in the Order) to discontinue and abandon either temporarily or permanently the whole or any part or parts of some or all of the tramways belonging to and worked by them and constructed on the whole or some part or parts of any or all of the trolley vehicle routes authorised by the Order and to make provision as to the date upon which such discontinuance and abandonment shall take effect, and as to the substitution of services of trolley vehicles for services of cars on such tramways; to make provision for the taking up of the rails of any tramways so abandoned and for the reinstatement of the roadway where the same are laid, and to make other provisions for and in connection with the matters aforesaid including the repeal, alteration or amendment (in relation to any tramways so abandoned or discontinued) of some or all of the provisions relating to such tramways and contained in the Acts or Orders relating thereto or some of them.
