NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE ACTS. 1911 to 1922.

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the National Health Insurance Joint Committee, acting jointly with the Minister of Health and the Scottish Board of Health, after the expiration of at least 40 days from this date, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the National Health Insurance Acts, 1911 to 1922, and by the National Insurance (Joint Committee) Regulations, 1912 to 1920, to make regulations amending Article 18 (3) of the National Health Insurance (Deposit Contributors) Regulations, 1918.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 7TH DECEMBER, 1923.)

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE: INFECTED PLACE.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

The premises mentioned in the Schedule hereto are hereby declared to be a place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease.
