

SCHEDULE.

Description and Limits of Infected Places.

1. The whole of the farm buildings and also the pastures known as the Horse Pasture, the Orchard, and Green Hill field at Betton Hall Farm, in the occupation of George Henry Noden, in the parish of Market Drayton, in the administrative county of Salop.

2. The whole of the farm buildings and also the fields known as the Thorneys, Brickhills Meadow, The Ten Acres, the Cow pasture, Lady Meadow, Front Field, the Stackyard field, and Root field, at Manor Farm, in the occupation of William Edwards, in the parish of Edgmond, in the administrative county of Salop.

3. The buildings and fields situated in Mickley Lane, in the occupation of Frederick Jones, in the Parish of Hodnet, in the administrative county of Salop.

4. The premises and fields known as Heath Lane Dairy Farm, in the occupation of William Griffiths, in the parish of Whitchurch, in the administrative county of Salop.

5. The buildings and fields known as Lostford House Farm, in the occupation of Joseph Noden, in the parish of Hodnet, in the administrative county of Salop.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1923 (No. 6.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Substitution of Infected Areas.

1. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1923, hereinafter referred to as the "Principal Order," shall be read and have effect as if the Areas described in the First Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Infected Areas described in the First Schedule to the Principal Order.

Revocation of certain Orders.

2. The Orders described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby revoked.

Commencement.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-seventh day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty-three.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1923 (No. 6).

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Infected Areas.

1. An area comprising:—

The Counties of Durham and Northumberland, including all county and other boroughs geographically situate therein, and also comprising:—

In the county of Berwick.

The parishes of Coldingham, Eyemouth, Ayton, Mordington, Foulden, Chirnside, Hutton, Ladykirk, Whitsome, Swinton, Coldstream, Edrom, and Bunkle and Preston.

2. An Area comprising:—

(a) The county of Lancaster (including all county and other boroughs geographically situated therein).

(b) The North Riding of Yorkshire, including all county and other boroughs geographically situated therein (*except the borough of Scarborough and the parishes of Burniston, Scalby, Suffield-cum-Everley, Seamer, Cayton, Lebberton, Gristhorpe, Irtton, East Ayton, West Ayton, Hutton Buscel, and such portions of the parishes of Alderston, Ebberston, Snainton, Brompton and Wykeham as lie to the south of the road from Pickering via Thornton Dale and Ebberston to Scarborough*).

(c) The West Riding of Yorkshire, including all county and other boroughs geographically situated therein (*but excluding the Sedburgh sub-division of the petty sessional division of Ewccross, the Thorne sub-division of the petty sessional division of Lower Strathforth and Tickhill, and the parishes of Eastoft, Haldenby, Fockerby, Adlingfleet, Cusefleet, Whitgift, Reedness, Swinefleet, Goole Fields, Goole, Hook, Airmyn, Rawcliffe, Snaith and Cowick, Pollington, Gowdall, Hirst Courtney, Carlton, Camblesforth, Barlow, Long Drax, Drax, and Newland*).

(d) The City of York, the parish of York Castle.

(e) *In the administrative county of the East Riding of Yorkshire.*

The parishes of Naburn, Stillingfleet with Morby, Kelfield, Riccall, Barby, Knapton, Wintringham, Thorpe Bassett, Scampston, Rillington, Scagglethorpe, Norton, Settrington, Duggleby, Kirby Grindalythe, Wharramle-Street, Wharram Percy, Raisthorpe and Burdale, Birdsall, North Grimston, Langton,
