3. The buildings and the land known as Ashwood Brow Farm, in the occupation of William Henry Gough, in the parish of Antrobus.
4. The land and the premises at Milton Green, in the occupation of George Partington, in the parish of Handley.
5. The farmstead at Burton, in the occupation of James Bowcock, in the parish of Burton.

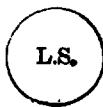
FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE:
INFECTED PLACES.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts,

1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

The several premises mentioned in the Schedule hereto are hereby declared to be places infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease.

In witness whereof the Official Seal of the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries is hereunto affixed this twenty-seventh day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty-three.

2. The land and buildings known as Little Russia Farm, in the occupation of Joseph Jackson, in the parish of Tattenhall.
3. The land and buildings known as Pit Farm, in the occupation of Frank Mayers, in the parish of Christleton.
4. The buildings and land, in the occupation of George Foster, Cotton Edmunds, in the parish of Christleton.
5. All farm buildings, yards and pastures at Blakeley Lane, in the occupation of John Henry Bowker, in the parish of Budworth.
