N.B.—The employment of Female Workers, young persons and children is subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, and the Education Acts.

Every occupier of a factory or workshop or of any place used for giving out work to outworkers must, on receipt of this Notice, post up and keep posted up, a sufficient number of true copies thereof in PROMINENT POSITIONS in the factory, workshop or place used for giving out work, in such a manner as to ensure that in each case the Notice is brought to the knowledge of all workers employed by him, or on his premises who are affected thereby. PENALTY FOR NON-COMPLIANCE, A FINE NOT EXCEEDING 40s. Where a notice applies only to a special process in the work of the trade or a class of workers in the trade or a class of workers in a special process, an occupier shall be under no obligation to post or keep posted such notice so long as no workers are employed by him or on his premises to whom any of the rates set out in the Notice are applicable.
