

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Extension of Limits of Foot-and-Mouth
Disease: Infected Place.*

1. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place (No. 15), described in the Schedule to the Order of the Minister dated 17th December, 1923 (No. 2039), is hereby extended so as to include the whole of the buildings and lands known as Ash House Farm, situated in the parish of Brindley, in the administrative county of Chester, and in the occupation of the Executors of the late Thomas Dutton, Ash House Farm, Brindley, Nantwich, Cheshire.

2. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place (No. 1), described in the Schedule to the Order of the Minister dated 3rd January, 1924 (No. 2283), is hereby extended so as to include the whole of the buildings and fields known as Higher Hall Farm, situated in the parish of Norbury, in the administrative county of Chester, and in the occupation of George Drinkwater, Higher Hall, Norbury, Cheshire.
