

Re CECILIA JONES, Deceased.

PURSUANT to an Order of the Chancery Division of the High Court of Justice, England, dated the 11th May, 1923, made in an Action in the Matter of the estate of Cecilia Jones, Widow, late of 10, Pant-road, Dowlais, Merthyr Tydfil, in the county of Glamorgan, who died on the 30th December, 1921, *Davies v. Parry*, 1923, J.
