PART III.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES APPLICABLE TO FEMALE WINDERS by the addition of the following to the provisions relating to female winders contained in the Trade Board's Notice F.H. (15) dated 25th July, 1922.

A winder is a worker, other than a bit or beating winder, who is wholly or mainly employed on winding from the reel, hank or bobbin.

PART IV.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES APPLICABLE TO MALE APPRENTICES by providing that the minimum rates set out in Part I of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice F.H. (10), dated 23rd February, 1922, shall apply to male apprentices who are apprenticed to tenting or dressing under indentures IN ANY FORM APPROVED BY THE TRADE BOARD, as well as to those indentured in the form prescribed by the Trade Board.

PART V.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF OVERTIME RATES.

Overtime rates calculated on the minimum rates of wages proposed in this Schedule in the manner specified in Part VII of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice F.H. (15) dated 25th July, 1922, shall apply in substitution for the proposed minimum rates of wages in respect of all time worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the before-

mentioned Notice F.H. (15) to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from 12th day of February, 1924. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to The Secretary of the Flax and Hemp Trade Board (Great Britain), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W.1.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and, so far as possible, with reasons,

what is objected to.
