CENSUS OF HORSES, 4TH JUNE, 1924.
(GREAT BRITAIN).

REGULATIONS REGARDING THE CENSUS OF HORSES, 1924, MADE BY THE ARMY COUNCIL ON 11TH MARCH, 1924.

1. Any person who on the fourth day of June, 1924, is the owner of any horse or ass within Great Britain shall, on or before the fourteenth day of June, 1924, make a Return to the Board of Trade in the form set out in the schedule hereto, giving the information specified in such form with regard to every such horse or ass owned by him on the fourth day of June, whether in his possession on that day or not.

2. Horses loaned out, or sent for sale but not yet sold, or supplied under contract must be accounted for by the actual owner or his representative, and not by the person in whose charge they are.

3. A separate return shall be furnished in respect of horses or asses owned in each borough, urban district or county. In cases where horses or asses under one ownership are not all stabled or kept in the same places the owner may, however, include in one Return all the horses and asses owned by him and stabled or kept in separate localities of the same borough or urban district or (if stabled or kept elsewhere than in a borough or urban district) in separate localities of the same county. In this Regulation as applying to Scotland the expressions "borough" and "urban district" shall mean a burgh.

4. For the purpose of these Regulations:—

"Horse" shall include mare, gelding, colt, filly, pony and mule.

5. Failure to comply with the above requirements is a summary offence under Section 114 of the Army Act.

8. (1) The landing of foreign animals, the landing of which in Great Britain is not prohibited by this Order, is hereby made subject to the following conditions:—

First.—That, if at any time within twenty-eight days before the shipment of the animals the vessel in which the animals are brought to Great Britain has had on board any animal which had been exported or carried coastwise from any port in any scheduled country, or has entered or been within any such port the vessel was before the shipment of the animals effectively cleansed and disinfected to the satisfaction

of a duly authorised representative of the Government of the country from which the animals are shipped.

Second.—That the animals imported have not, while on board the vessel, been in contact with an animal exported or carried coastwise from a port in a scheduled country.

(2) Animals shall not be landed unless and until the master of the vessel in which they are imported has on the occasion of such importation delivered to the Commissioners of Customs and Excise or their proper officer, a declaration made and signed that all the animals then imported therein are properly imported according to the provisions of this Article."

(2) Any railway truck or other vehicle used for the conveyance of the animals under this Order shall on every occasion after an animal is taken out of it, and before any other animal or any fodder or litter, or anything intended to be used for or about animals is placed in it, be cleansed and disinfected under the supervision, and to the satisfaction, of a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry.
