FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED  
AREAS) ORDER OF 1924 (No. 40).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Contraction of Infected Area No. 2.*

1. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1924 (No. 34) shall be read and have effect as if such part of the County of Renfrew as lies to the south of the River Clyde were excluded from and ceased to form part of the Infected Area No. 2 described in the First Schedule to that Order.

*Commencement.*

2. This Order shall come into operation on the seventeenth day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-four.

*Short Title.*

3. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1924 (No. 40).
