DUKE STREET,

MANCHESTER SQUARE, W.

Three vehicles.

In the centre of Duke Street, commencing South of the crossing at Manchester Square, and extending Southward as far as necessary toward Dukes Mews.

Horses' heads to the North.

CAVENDISH STREET, HARLEY STREET. Six vehicles.

In the centre of New Cavendish Street, East of Harley Street, extending Eastward as far as necessary.

Horses' heads to the West.

QUEEN ANNE STREET, HARLEY STREET.

Three vehicles.

In the centre of Queen Anne Street, commencing at the East side of Harley Street, and extending Eastward as far as necessary. Horses' heads to the West.

PORTLAND PLACE, WEYMOUTH STREET. Eight vehicles.

In the centre of Portland Place, commencing at Weymouth Street, and extending Northward toward Devonshire Street as far as necessary.

Horses' heads to the South.

WEYMOUTH STREET, HARLEY STREET. Three vehicles.

In the centre of Weymouth Street, commencing East of crossing at Harley Street. Horses' heads West.

NEW CAVENDISH STREET. Wimpole Street.

Eight vehicles.

In centre of New Cavendish Street, commencing immediately West of its junction with Wimpole Street, and extending Westward.

A clear space of 87 yards to be left between the second and third carriages, of 34 yards between the fourth and fifth carriages, and 43 yards between the sixth and seventh carriages.

The first four horses' heads to face East, and the remainder West.

LANGHAM STREET.

Four vehicles.

In the centre of Langham Street, commercing immediately East of its Junction with Great Portland Street. Front of vehicles toward the West.

WEYMOUTH STREET, GREAT PORTLAND STREET.

Two vehicles.

In the centre of the roadway at East end of Weymouth Street. Front of vehicles facing East.

BERNERS STREET. MORTIMER STREET. Eight vehicles.
