MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

REGULATION UNDER SECTION 9 (1).

COUNTY OF BERKS.

To the County Council of Berks:—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in Regulations made by the Local Government Board with a view to the safety of the public on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the power to make such Regulations has been transferred to the Minister of Transport;

And whereas the County Council of Berks have applied for the issue of a Regulation in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising certain roads or parts of roads situate within the Parish of Twyford:

Now, therefore, the Minister of Transport, in pursuance of the powers given to him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulation:—

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Act with respect to

the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the parts of roads within the said Parish which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—This Regulation shall come into operation on the seventh day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four.

So much of the London—Bath road as extends from a point 150 yards east of the cross roads in the middle of Twyford Village to the centre of the bridge over the Great Western Railway about 170 yards west of the said cross roads; and

So much of the Wokingham—Twyford—Henley road as extends from its junction with Station Road about 113 yards south-east of the said cross roads to a point 120 yards north-west of the said cross roads.
