## SCHEDULE.

*Description and Limits of Infected Places.**Derbyshire.*

1. The whole of the buildings, and the land attached thereto, known as Spring Cottage Farm, in the occupation of Newton Wright, in the parish of Hørsley Woodhouse, in the administrative county of Derby.

*Durham.*

2. The lands and buildings at Harmire, in the occupation of Joseph Jameson, in the parish of Barnard Castle, in the administrative county of Durham.

*Lancashire.*

3. The farm buildings, comprising four ship-pons, stable, cart shed, barn and Dutch barn, and the farm yard and pasture field, known as Little Height Meadow, at Further Barn Farm, in the occupation of Arthur Dickson Halroyd, in the parish of Habergham Eaves, in the administrative county of Lancaster.
