2. On the first day of April, 1924, all the estate, interest, rights, powers and liabilities of the Crown and of the Commissioners of Woods in or in connection with any property under the management or control of the Commissioners of Woods which is situate in any parish mentioned in the first schedule to this Order or is described in the second schedule to this Order shall, subject to the exceptions and reservations set out in the said schedules respectively and to the following provisions of this Order, be transferred to and vest in the Forestry Commissioners.

3. Where any property transferred under this Order adjoins other property which is under the management of the Commissioners of Woods but is not included in the transfer (hereinafter referred to as property retained)

(a) any fences or ditches between the properties shall vest in the Forestry Commissioners, and it shall be the duty of those Commissioners if so required by the Commissioners of Woods to maintain repair and cleanse the same, and where no fence exists, to construct a fence to the satisfaction of the Commissioners of Woods;

(b) any ways, water-courses or other rights or easements on, over or under the property retained which appertain to or are reputed to appertain to or are held or enjoyed with the property transferred shall be deemed to

be included in the transfer; and

(c) any ways, water-courses or other rights or easements on, over or under the property transferred which appertain to or are reputed to appertain to or are held or enjoyed with property retained shall be deemed not to be included in the transfer.

- 4.—(1) Subject to the provisions of the Forestry (Transfer of Woods) Act, 1923, and this Order, all property transferred to the Forestry Commissioners under this Order shall be held by them in like manner and they may exercise in relation thereto all the like powers as if the estate, interest, rights and powers therein or in connection therewith which are transferred to them under this Order had been acquired by them under the Forestry Act, 1919, subject to the liabilities so transferred. and they may also exercise in relation thereto any powers which at the time of transfer are exercisable in relation thereto by His Majesty or the Commissioners of Woods: Provided that nothing in this Order shall be construed as authorising the Forestry Commissioners to sell, lease, exchange or enclose any land forming part of a royal forest, park or chase except under and in accordance with the terms of such last mentioned powers.
- (2) Nothing in this Order shall affect any right of patronage or right of nomination to any benefice which is vested in the Crown or any right of nominating the Official Verderer of the New Forest.
- (3) Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this Order the exemption from stamp duty granted by section seventy-seven of the Crown Lands Act, 1829, or by any enactment extending that section shall not apply to any instrument relating to property transferred under this Order or to the management of such property.

5. The Office of Keeper of the Gawle-abovethe-Wood within the Forest of Dean and also the Office of Keeper of the Gawle-under-the-

Wood within the said Forest which by section thirteen of the Dean Forest (Mines) Act, 1838, were vested in the First Commissioner of Woods and are therein and hereinafter referred to as the Office of Gaveller shall on the 1st day of April, 1924, be transferred to and vest in the Forestry Commissioners together with all the powers, rights and authorities belonging or appertaining to the Office of Gaveller (including the power to appoint a deputy Gaveller) and all such powers, rights and authorities may after the transfer be exercised either by the Forestry Commissioners or by the deputy Gaveller appointed by them, and any instrument required by any Act to be made under the hand or under the hand and seal of the Gaveller may be made under the seal of the Forestry Commissioners.

6. The Commissioners of Woods and the Forestry Commissioners shall preserve in their respective offices the sets of duplicate plans which have been deposited with them respectively for the purposes of this Order.
