

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 12TH APRIL, 1924.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

The premises described in the Schedule

hereto which were declared by the Orders specified in the Schedule to be Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Places are hereby declared to be free from Foot-and-Mouth Disease.

In witness whereof the Official Seal of the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries is hereunto affixed this twelfth day of April, nineteen hundred and twenty-four.
