**WHEREAS** by Section 14 (1) of the Ancient Monuments Consolidation and Amendment Act, 1913, penalties are imposed upon any person injuring or defacing (among other things) any monument to which that section applies by virtue of an Order in Council made thereunder, and by sub-section (4) of the

same section it is provided that His Majesty may by Order in Council declare that the said section shall apply to any monument specified in the Order which appears to His Majesty to be an ancient monument within the meaning of the said Act:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the above mentioned Act, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order and prescribe that Section 14 of the said Act shall apply to the following monuments which appear to His Majesty to be ancient monuments within the meaning of the said Act:—

The following Addresses were presented to the KING on Wednesday, the 23rd instant, on the occasion of the opening by His Majesty of the British Empire Exhibition, Wembley:—

#### BRITISH EMPIRE EXHIBITION.

As President, I ask you graciously to declare open to your people this British Empire Exhibition. It is a particular satisfaction to all who have been engaged in its preparation that we can ask you to do this on St. George's Day. During the last stages of preparation there have been many adverse factors, not the least of which was a very inclement winter. But industry and perseverance have, I am glad to say, overcome all obstacles.

You see before you a complete and a vivid representation of all Your Empire. The Dominions, India, the Colonies, the Protectorates and Mandated Territories under Your care have joined together in the great task of presenting this picture of our Commonwealth of Nations. The Exhibition is thus the work of the whole Empire, and it shows the craftsmanship, the agricultural skill, the trading and transport organizations of all our peoples and all our territories. It gives also a living picture of the history of the Empire and of its present structure. It will suggest to the world, I truly believe, that the most powerful agency of civilization has its heart set upon peaceful aims and the good of mankind.

The lighter side of the organization of a great Exhibition has not been neglected. It is essential to the success of an enterprise such as this that it should be attractive; that it should encourage the desire for amusement as well as for education. The sports, the entertainments, the music, the arrangements for the comfort of our visitors have been carefully planned.

As President, I wish to express my gratitude to those who have helped in this great undertaking, to those men of great vision who were responsible for the first proposal for the Exhibition made before the war; to the representatives of the Dominions, of India and of the Colonies; to the Executive Council, with the Duke of Devonshire at its head; to the Board, consisting of Sir James Stevenson, Sir Henry McMahon, Sir Charles McLeod, and Sir James Allen, and to the Chief Administrator, Sir Travers Clarke; to the architects, the engineers, the builders and the workers. The great work has been carried through with splendid loyalty and energy.

I hope, Sir, the result of this Exhibition will be to impress vividly upon all the peoples of Your Empire the advice that You have given to them on more than one occasion, that they should be fully awake to their responsibilities as the heirs of so glorious a heritage; that they should be in no wise slothful stewards, but that they should work unitedly and energetically to develop the resources of the Empire for the benefit of the British race, for the benefit of those other races which have accepted our guardianship over their destinies, and for the benefit of mankind generally.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—

It gives me the greatest pleasure and satisfaction to come here to-day with the Queen

for the purpose of opening the British Empire Exhibition.

Our heartiest congratulations are due to the Board of Management, to the Executive Council, and to all who have worked with and under them for the marvellous organization and industry which have produced this triumphant result. I am well aware of the numerous adverse circumstances, including the exceptionally unfavourable weather, which had to be faced. These were successfully overcome by arduous labours, carried out with resolution and good will. Many who, like the Queen and myself, have seen the work in the earlier stages can appreciate to the utmost the skill and toil which have translated the magnificent conception into this splendid reality that now stands before us.

I am happy to welcome the representatives, official and unofficial, of my Dominions beyond the seas; and to express the pleasure we all feel that they are taking part in to-day's opening ceremony.

You have said that your object has been to produce a picture of our commonwealth of nations. No one can doubt that this has been fully attained. The Exhibition may be said to reveal to us the whole Empire in little, containing within its 220 acres of ground a vivid model of the architecture, art, and industry of all the races which come under the British Flag. It represents to the world a graphic illustration of that spirit of free and tolerant co-operation which has inspired peoples of different races, creeds, institutions, and ways of thought, to unite in a single commonwealth and to contribute their varying national gifts to one great end.

This Exhibition will enable us to take stock of the resources, actual and potential, of the Empire as a whole; to consider where these exist and how they can best be developed and utilized; to take counsel together how the peoples can co-operate to supply one another's needs, and to promote national well-being. It stands for a co-ordination of our scientific knowledge and a common effort to overcome disease, and to better the difficult conditions which still surround life in many parts of the Empire.

Think, for example, of the scientific work accomplished in recent years for the prevention and treatment of tropical diseases. And it is easy to imagine how greatly the Exhibition can contribute towards the progress of our tropical territories and the development of the yet unexplored capacities of the Empire.

Our thoughts go back to the Great Exhibition of 1851—associated for all time with the memories of Queen Victoria and of the Prince Consort—and to the brilliant hopes of the growth of international peace and friendship with which it was inaugurated. Our object here is not quite so ambitious and for that very reason, perhaps, more hopeful of attainment. We believe that this Exhibition will bring the peoples of the Empire to a better knowledge of how to meet their reciprocal wants and aspirations; and that, where brotherly feeling and the habit of united action already exist, the growth of inter-imperial trade will make the bonds of sympathy yet closer and stronger. Business relations between strangers may, or may not, lead to friendship; co-operation between brothers for the better development

of the family estate can hardly fail to promote family affection.

And we hope, further, that the success of the Exhibition may bring lasting benefits, not to the Empire only, but to mankind in general. No nation, or group of nations, can isolate itself from the main stream of modern commerce; and if this Exhibition leads to a greater development of the material resources of the Empire and to an expansion of its trade, it will, at the same time, be raising the economic life of the world from the disorganization caused by the war.

I declare the British Empire Exhibition open: and I pray that by the blessing of God it may conduce to the unity and prosperity of all my peoples and to the peace and well-being of the world.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF  
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 29TH APRIL, 1924.)

FOOT - AND - MOUTH DISEASE (IN-  
FECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1924  
(No. 70).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Revocation of Previous Orders.*

1. The Orders described in the Second Schedule to this Order are hereby revoked.

*Meaning of Terms.*

2. In this Order:—

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

“The Minister” and “The Ministry” mean the Minister and the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries.

“An Infected Area” means an Area described in the First Schedule hereto, and any other area which is declared by an Order of the Minister to be an Infected Area for the purposes of this Order.

If any farm, holding, park or enclosure (excluding any detached part) is partly within and partly outside an Infected Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within that Area.

“Animals” means cattle, sheep, goats, deer or pigs;

“Slaughterhouse” means premises used habitually and solely for the purpose of slaughtering animals, but does not include (1) a slaughterhouse which forms part of a farm, or (2) any premises on which animals other than those intended for immediate slaughter are kept.

“Infected Place” means a place declared by an Order of the Minister to be a place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease. Provided that any such place on which all affected animals have been slaughtered shall, for the purposes of this Order cease to be regarded as an infected place at the expiration of twenty-eight days from the date upon which the slaughter of the stock was completed, if the final disinfection of the premises has been completed to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Ministry.

*Restrictions in Force in the Infected Areas.*

3.—(a) No animals shall be moved out of an Infected Area except to a slaughterhouse in another Infected Area as provided in Article 4 of this Order.

(b) No animals shall be moved without a licence under Article 4 or Article 11 of this Order:—

(i) into an Infected Area; or

(ii) along or across any road or other highway or by water within an Infected Area.

(c) (i) No cattle, sheep, goats or pigs shall be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any road or other highway in an Infected Area

(ii) The occupier of any park or enclosure in which deer are kept shall, if such park or enclosure is within an Infected Area, take all practicable steps to prevent the straying of any such deer out of the park or enclosure.

(d) No market, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in an Infected Area, except a market or sale of fat animals intended for immediate slaughter, or a sale of animals on farm premises. A licence must be obtained from the Local Authority to hold any such market or sale, and a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend and examine the animals exposed thereat. No licence shall be granted for the holding of any such market or sale of fat animals on any premises within a radius of five miles from any infected place, or for the holding of a sale on farm premises within a radius of two miles from any infected place.

(e) No slaughterhouse manure, refuse, or offals or other parts of a carcass intended for feeding animals shall be moved out of an Infected Area or be brought into contact with animals in any such Area.

(f) The landing of imported animals at the approved Landing Places at the Ports of Fleetwood, Manchester, Glasgow and Preston is hereby prohibited, except for animals intended for slaughter. Such animals may be moved from the Landing Place only to a slaughterhouse in an Infected Area. The landing of imported animals at the approved Landing Place at the Port of Ayr is prohibited.

*Movement of Animals by Licence into or within the Infected Areas.*

4.—(1) Licences may be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority for the following movement of animals only:—

(a) From premises outside any Infected Area to a slaughterhouse in an Infected Area.

(b) From premises outside any Infected Area to a farm in an Infected Area.

(c) From a farm in an Infected Area to a licensed fat stock market or fat stock sale in the same Area.

(d) From a licensed fat stock market or sale in an Infected Area, or from a farm or other premises in an Infected Area, to a slaughterhouse in the same Infected Area or in another Infected Area.

(e) From one farm to another in the same Infected Area, or between different parts of the same farm in such Area, if the Inspector considers the movement to be necessary or expedient. (These licences may be made available for movement as often as required if the Inspector endorses the licence “Occupation licence.”)

(f) For such movements as are specifically authorised in Article 11 of this Order.

(2) Where a licence is granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority under paragraph (b) for the movement of animals from

premises outside any Infected Area to a farm in an Infected Area, or under paragraph (e) for movement from one farm to another in an Infected Area, it shall be a condition of the licence that the animals shall on arrival at the destination specified in the licence be detained thereon for a period of twenty-eight days, and during that period the animals shall not be removed from the premises for any purpose. Provided that this provision shall not apply to a licence granted in respect of the movement of animals for breeding purposes, if such licence is endorsed by the Inspector granting the same "For Breeding Purposes."

This Article shall not be deemed to prohibit the movement of the carcase of an animal slaughtered on the premises during the said period.

(3) No licence shall be granted under this Article for (i) the movement of animals from any premises to any farm for the purpose of sale at a licensed farm sale, or (ii) the movement of any animal to or from any place or along any road within a radius of two miles from any infected place.

#### *Time Limit for Slaughter of Animals.*

5. Except where any less period is expressly stated in this Order any animals moved with a licence under this Order, to a slaughter house, shall be slaughtered within 96 hours of the time of arrival at the slaughterhouse, provided that the Local Authority of the district in which the slaughterhouse is situate may, if they think fit, require any such animals to be slaughtered within a less period than 96 hours.

#### *Conditions of Licences.*

6.—(a) Licences may be granted only by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the place of destination is situate, and a licence shall not be available for the movement of the animals, unless and until it is countersigned by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district from which the animals are to be moved.

(b) In any case where the number of animals proposed to be moved with a licence under this Order (other than an Occupation Licence) is less than the number in respect of the movement of which the licence was granted, the licence shall not be available for the movement unless and until the Inspector countersigning the licence has endorsed thereon the number of animals proposed to be moved. After such endorsement the licence shall be deemed to be available for the movement of the number of animals so endorsed, and no other number.

(c) Where any animals are moved with a licence under this Order, the Inspector granting or countersigning the licence may, if he thinks it desirable, specify therein the route by which the animals are to be moved, and may require the animals to be moved by float or other suitable vehicle.

(d) Licences granted for the movement of animals from any premises in an Infected Area shall not permit the movement of such animals on any road not within an Infected Area for the purpose of reaching a destination within any such area.

(e) Licences may be withdrawn at any time by a notice served by an Inspector of the Local Authority on the person to whom such licence was granted.

(f) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, must be delivered up at or sent by post to the nearest Police Station, or to an Officer of the Local Authority immediately after completion of the movement.

(g) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, shall be available for six days, including the day of issue, or any less period endorsed on the licence by the Inspector granting the same, and shall accompany the animals throughout the movement.

(h) Animals, while being moved with a licence under this Order, shall be moved as far as practicable by rail, by the nearest available route and without avoidable delay to the place of destination specified in the licence, and not elsewhere, and shall be kept separate, as far as practicable, from all other animals. Animals being moved under this Order by railway shall not be untrucked until they reach the railway station nearest to the place of destination. In no case shall any such animal be untrucked at any place outside the Infected Areas.

(i) Licences shall be produced by the person in charge of the animals moved therewith on demand to an Inspector or to a Constable, and such person shall, if required, by such Officer, give his name and address.

(j) Licences shall not permit movement on any road within a radius of two miles of any infected place.

#### *Movement through Infected Areas by Railway permitted.*

7. This Order shall not prevent the movement of animals direct by railway through an Infected Area or Areas, from a place outside any such Area to another place outside any such Area provided that the animals are not untrucked within any Infected Area.

#### *Animals for Slaughter to be Marked.*

8.—(a) Animals moved to a slaughterhouse in accordance with a licence under this Order shall be detained at such slaughterhouse until they are slaughtered.

(b) Before such movement commences all such animals shall be marked as follows:—

*Cattle.*—A broad arrow six inches long clipped on the left hindquarter and the hair clipped off the end of the tail.

*Sheep.*—A letter M six inches long painted or stamped with red or blue adhesive composition on both sides of each sheep.

*Pigs.*—A letter M painted or stamped on both sides of the pig with red or blue adhesive composition.

#### *Closing of Footpaths and Premises.*

9.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may (notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way) prohibit the entry of any person into any field, shed or other place in an Infected Area by giving notice in writing to that effect to the occupier. In such cases the owner of the animals in such places, or his agents or servants, may enter for the sole purpose of

feeding or tending the animals, but no other person shall enter any such place until such notice has been withdrawn by a further notice from an Inspector, unless he has obtained a licence to do so from an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority.

(2) Copies of such notices shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he may think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed;

(3) Copies of such notices, when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

#### *Control of Dogs and Poultry.*

10.—(1) Within a radius of two miles from any infected place all dogs shall at all times, except whilst in a dwelling house, be kept by the owner or person in charge thereof under control by being:—

(i) confined in a kennel or other enclosure from which the dog cannot escape; or

(ii) secured to some premises by a collar and chain; or

(iii) accompanied by the owner or some person deputed by him and under effectual control.

(2) Any dog which is not kept under control as prescribed by this Order may be seized by the Local Authority, or by the Police, and any dog so seized shall be dealt with in the same manner as a stray dog seized under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906, is thereby authorised to be dealt with. No dog so seized shall be given or sold for the purpose of vivisection.

(3) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may, by written notice served upon the occupier of any premises in an Infected Area on which dogs or poultry are kept, require such occupier to keep such dogs or poultry under such control as may be prescribed in the notice, or to confine them to any special part of the premises;

(4) Copies of such notices, when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

#### *Provision for movement of Sheep and Lambs to Special Markets authorised by Minister.*

11.—(1) Sheep and lambs intended for immediate slaughter may be moved from premises not within any Infected Area to such markets in an Infected Area as are not within a radius of five miles of an Infected Place, and are authorised by the Minister to be used for the time being for the purposes of this Article, with a licence granted by the Local Authority of the District in which the market is situate; provided that no such licence shall be granted unless the owner of the sheep shall sign and give to the Local Authority an undertaking in the form set out in the Third Schedule to this Order.

(2) Sheep or lambs moved to any such market shall not be moved therefrom except direct to a slaughterhouse and with a licence of an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the slaughterhouse is situate. Such licence shall not be available unless and until it is countersigned by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the market is situate. No such licence shall be countersigned unless the owner of the sheep shall sign and give to the Local Authority an

undertaking in the form set out in the Third Schedule to this Order.

(3) Sheep or lambs moved to a slaughterhouse with a licence under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall so far as is practicable be kept separate from all animals which are not being moved or have not been moved with a licence under this Article. On arrival at the slaughterhouse the animals shall be there detained and slaughtered within 48 hours after the time of arrival.

(4) The undertakings when received by the Local Authority shall be forthwith transmitted to the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries.

#### *Precautions to be taken by Persons Clipping Sheep.*

12. Any person who clips sheep on any farm or premises in an Infected Area shall before he clips sheep on any other farm or premises, whether in an Infected Area or not, take the following precautions against the spread of foot-and-mouth disease:—

(1) He shall not clip sheep on such other farm unless he is wearing overalls capable of being cleansed and disinfected as required by this Order and which have been so cleansed and disinfected since he clipped any other sheep, by being steeped for not less than five minutes in boiling water or steeped for not less than twenty minutes in the prescribed solution.

(2) He shall remove all wool, dung and soil from his boots and leggings (if worn) and then disinfect them by immersion in, or thorough sponging with, the prescribed solution.

(3) He shall remove all wool from any clippers or other instruments used in clipping and then disinfect them with the prescribed solution.

(4) The prescribed solution for the purposes of the foregoing provisions shall be either a five per cent. (minimum) solution of carbolic acid (containing not less than ninety-five per cent. of actual carbolic) or a disinfectant equal in disinfective efficiency to the above-mentioned solution of carbolic acid.

(5) He shall wash and brush his hands thoroughly with hot water and then immerse them in a solution containing not less than three per cent. of carbolic acid of such strength as aforesaid.

#### *Saving for Orders and Regulations.*

13. No licence under this Order shall authorise the movement of animals in contravention of any Regulations made by a Local Authority other than the Local Authority by whom the licence was issued.

#### *Movement of Imported Animals.*

14. Imported animals intended to be moved from an approved Landing Place to a destination within an Infected Area shall be accompanied throughout the movement by

(1) a licence issued under this Order by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the place of destination, and in the case of

cattle, sheep or goats, by (2) the licence granted by the Inspector of the Ministry under the Imported Animals Order of 1923 (No. 2) authorising the removal of the animals from the Landing Place. The last mentioned licence shall not be issued until the Local Authority's licence is produced to the Inspector of the Ministry at the Landing Place.

*Local Authority to Enforce Order.*

15. This Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

*Offences.*

16.—(1) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2) If a person allows an animal to stray in contravention of this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3) If any person enters any field, shed, or other place in contravention of this Order, or of a Notice served thereunder, such person shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4) If a person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any animal as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(6) If any other thing is done or omitted to be done in contravention of this Order or any Notice served or the conditions of any licence granted thereunder or with intent to evade or defeat the operation of this Order or any Notice served, or the conditions of any licence granted thereunder, the owner and the person for the time being in charge of the animal, dog, or thing and the occupier of the premises in respect of which the same is done or omitted to be done shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

*Commencement.*

17. This Order shall come into operation on the third day of May, nineteen hundred and twenty-four.

*Short Title.*

18. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1924 (No. 70).

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (DISINFEC-  
TION OF VEHICLES) ORDER OF 1924.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Disinfection and Cleansing of Vehicles used for the conveyance of animals in certain areas.*

1.—(1) Any float, cart, van or other vehicle (other than a railway truck) used for the conveyance of any animal or carcase thereof (not being a dressed carcase) into, within, or out of any area which is for the time being declared to be a Prohibited Area, Controlled Area or Infected Area, for the purposes of any Order of the Minister relating to Foot-and-Mouth Disease shall, as soon as practicable after each occasion on which it is so used, and before any other animal or any fodder or litter or any other thing intended to be used for or about animals is placed therein, be disinfected, cleansed, and again disinfected by, and at the expense of, the person using the same for such purpose in the manner following:—

(a) The floor of the float, cart, van or other vehicle, and all other parts thereof with which any animal or its droppings or other excretions have come in contact shall be disinfected in the manner hereinafter prescribed. Such parts shall then be scraped and swept, and the scrapings and sweepings, and all dung, sawdust, litter and other matter shall be effectually removed therefrom; then the same parts of the float, cart, van, or other vehicle shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water; and then be again disinfected in the manner hereinafter prescribed.

(b) The scrapings and sweepings of the float, cart, van, or other vehicle, and all dung, sawdust, litter and other matter removed therefrom shall forthwith be well mixed with quicklime, and effectually removed from contact with animals, or be effectually destroyed by fire.

(2) Every rope, net, or other apparatus used in connection with any such conveyance of animals as aforesaid otherwise than on a railway shall, as soon as practicable after being so used, and before being used for or about other animals, be disinfected by being thoroughly saturated with one of the disinfectants prescribed in Article 3 of this Order.

*Offences.*

2.—(1) If the person using any such vehicle or thing for the conveyance of an animal fails to disinfect and cleanse it as required by this

Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894, and it shall be lawful for the Local Authority, without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for the offence, to cause such vehicle or thing to be disinfected and cleansed and to recover summarily the expenses of such disinfection and cleansing from such person.

(2) Where the power of causing any vehicle or thing to be disinfected and cleansed under this Article is exercised by a Local Authority, the owner of the vehicle or thing and the person using the same shall give all reasonable facilities for that purpose, and any person failing to give such facilities shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

*Disinfection Prescribed in Specified Cases.*

3. The prescribed manner of disinfection to be adopted in the case of any vehicle or part of a vehicle required to be disinfected under this Order is as follows:

The vehicle or the part thereof, required to be disinfected shall be thoroughly coated or washed with:—

(a) a one per cent. (minimum) solution of chloride of lime containing not less than thirty per cent. of available chlorine; or

(b) a four per cent. (minimum) solution of carbolic acid (containing not less than ninety-five per cent. of actual carbolic acid); or

(c) a disinfectant equal in disinfective efficiency to the above mentioned solution of carbolic acid.

*Interpretation.*

4. In this Order "Animals" means cattle, sheep, goats, deer and swine.

"Carcase" means the undressed carcase of an animal, and includes a part of such carcase.

"The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

*Local Authority to enforce Order.*

5. This Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

*Commencement.*

6. This Order shall come into operation on the fifth day of May, nineteen hundred and twenty-four.

*Short Title.*

7. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (DISINFECTION OF VEHICLES) ORDER OF 1924.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF  
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 30TH APRIL, 1924.)

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (CHESHIRE DISTRICT) ORDER OF 1924 (No. 5).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Meaning of Terms.*

1. In this Order:—

“ The Prohibited Area ” means the Area described in the First Schedule hereto, in which the movement of animals is hereby prohibited;

If any farm (excluding any detached part) is partly within and partly outside the Prohibited Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within that Area.

“ Animals ” means cattle, sheep, goats, deer and pigs;

“ Slaughterhouse ” means premises used habitually and solely for the purpose of slaughtering animals, but does not include (1) a slaughterhouse which forms part of a farm, or (2) any premises on which animals other than those intended for immediate slaughter are kept.

*Restrictions in Force in the Prohibited Area.*

2.—(a) No animals shall be moved into or out of the Prohibited Area, except as hereinafter provided;

(b) No animals shall be moved along or across any road or other highway, or by water

within the Prohibited Area, or be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any such road or highway;

(c) No market, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in the Prohibited Area, except a sale of animals on farm premises. A licence must be obtained from an Inspector of the Ministry to hold any such sale, and a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry shall attend and examine the animals exposed thereat. No licence shall be granted for the holding of any such sale on any premises within a radius of three miles from any place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease. Provided that any such place on which all affected animals have been slaughtered shall, for the purposes of this Article, cease to be regarded as a place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease at the expiration of twenty-eight days from the date upon which the slaughter of the stock was completed, if the final disinfection of the premises has been completed to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Ministry.

(d) No slaughterhouse manure, refuse or offals, or other parts of a carcass intended for feeding animals shall be moved out of the Prohibited Area or be brought into contact with animals in the Prohibited Area.

(e) The occupier of any park or enclosure in which deer are kept shall, if such park or enclosure is within the Prohibited Area, take all practicable steps to prevent the straying of any such deer out of the park or enclosure.

*Control of Dogs in Prohibited Area.*

3. (a) Dogs in the Prohibited Area shall at all times, except whilst in a dwelling-house, be kept by the owner thereof under control by being:—

(i) confined in a kennel, or other enclosure from which the dog cannot escape; or

(ii) secured to some premises by a collar and chain; or

(iii) accompanied by the owner or some person deputed by him and under effectual control.

(b) Any dog which is not kept under control as prescribed by this Order may be seized by the Local Authority, or by the Police, and any dog so seized shall be dealt with in the same manner as a stray dog seized under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906, is thereby authorised to be dealt with. No dog so seized shall be given or sold for the purpose of vivisection.

*Provision for Movement into the Prohibited Area of Animals for Immediate Slaughter.*

4. Animals may be moved from premises outside the Prohibited Area to a slaughterhouse in any borough or urban district in the Prohibited Area, subject to the following conditions:—

(i) A licence authorising the movement must be obtained from an Inspector of the Local Authority of the destination before the movement commences. This licence must accompany the animals throughout the whole movement.

(ii) The animals must be put on rail at a station outside the Prohibited Area and be moved by railway without being untrucked within the Prohibited Area until arrival at the railway station nearest to the place of destination: Provided that where the distance from the railway station in the Prohibited Area to the place of destination is greater than the distance to be covered within the Area, if the movement were to take place by road, the Inspector granting the licence may specify therein any other route if he thinks it desirable, and may require the animals to be moved by float or other suitable vehicle.

*Provision for Movement of Animals out of the Prohibited Area for Immediate Slaughter.*

5. Animals intended for immediate slaughter may be moved from premises in the Prohibited Area to a slaughterhouse authorised for the reception of animals moved under this Order, with a licence of an Inspector of the Ministry, provided that the animals are examined by the Veterinary Inspector immediately before the licence is issued, and found to be free from any symptoms of foot-and-mouth disease, and subject to and in accordance with the following conditions:—

(1) The animals shall be moved within the Prohibited Area by float, cart or van, to the railway station nearest the place of origin for conveyance thence only to a slaughterhouse authorised for the reception of animals moved under this Order by the Local Authority of a district specified in the Third Schedule hereto. The precise address of the slaughterhouse to which the animals are to be moved shall be inserted in the licence.

(2) Before the animals are loaded therein the float, cart or van, shall be disinfected with a disinfectant prescribed in the next following Article of this Order since the vehicle was last used for the conveyance of animals. The float, cart or van shall be similarly disinfected immediately after the animals have been unloaded therefrom.

(3) The animals shall on arrival be examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority and shall on arrival at the slaughterhouse specified in the licence be kept separate as far as practicable from all other animals therein and shall be slaughtered within forty-eight hours after their arrival thereat.

(4) A copy of every licence granted under this Article shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the district in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.

*Disinfection of Railway Trucks and Railway Loading Banks.*

6.—(1) A railway truck or other railway vehicle used for the conveyance of any animals with a licence under the preceding Article shall, immediately before any such animal is placed in it, and also immediately after the unloading of the animals therefrom at the place of destination, be thoroughly sprayed with liquid disinfectant under the supervision, and to the satisfaction of the Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority.

(2) A railway loading bank or loading dock used for the loading or unloading of animals moved with a licence, under the preceding Article shall, when required by an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority, be thoroughly sprayed with liquid disinfectant.

(3) The liquid disinfectant to be used for the purposes of this Article shall be:—

(a) A one per cent. (minimum) solution of chloride of lime, containing not less than thirty per cent. of available chlorine; or

(b) A four per cent. (minimum) solution of carbolic acid (containing not less than ninety-five per cent. of actual carbolic acid); or

(c) A disinfectant equal in disinfective efficiency to the above-mentioned solution of carbolic acid.

(4) Nothing in this Article shall interfere with the operation of the provisions of the Animals (Transit and General) Order of 1912 as to the cleansing and disinfection of railway trucks and other railway vehicles used for the conveyance of animals on a railway.

*Conditions of Licences.*

7.—(a) Licences must be delivered up at or sent by post to the nearest Police Station, or to an Officer of the Local Authority, immediately after completion of the movement;

(b) Licences shall only be available for four days, including the day of issue, and shall accompany the animals throughout the movement;

(c) Animals while being moved with a licence under this Order shall be moved as far as practicable by the nearest available route and without avoidable delay to the place of destination specified in the licence, and not elsewhere, and shall be kept separate, as far as practicable, from all other animals;

(d) Licences shall be produced by the person in charge of the animals moved therewith on demand to an Inspector or to a Constable, and such person shall, if required by such Officer, give his name and address.

*Movement through Prohibited Area by Railway Permitted.*

8. This Order shall not prevent the movement of animals direct by railway through the Prohibited Area, if the animals are not untrucked within such Area.

*Time Limit for Slaughter of Animals.*

9. Except where any less period is expressly specified in this Order, animals moved with a licence under this Order to a slaughterhouse shall be slaughtered within 96 hours of the time of arrival at the slaughterhouse, provided that the Local Authority of the district in which the slaughterhouse is situate may, if they think fit, require any such animals to be slaughtered within a less period than 96 hours.

*Animals for Slaughter to be Marked.*

10. Animals moved to a slaughterhouse with a licence under this Order shall, before such movement commences, be marked as follows:—

*Cattle*:—A broad arrow six inches long clipped on the left hindquarter, and the hair clipped off the end of the tail.

*Sheep*:—A letter "M" six inches long painted or stamped with red or blue adhesive composition on both sides of each sheep.

*Pigs*:—A letter "M" painted or stamped on both sides of the pig with red or blue adhesive composition.

*Closing of Footpaths and Premises.*

11.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may (notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way) prohibit the entry of any person into any field, shed or other place in the Prohibited Area by giving notice in writing to that effect to the occupier. In such cases, the owner of the animals in such place, or his agents, or servants, may enter for the sole purpose of feeding or tending the animals, but no other persons shall enter any such place until such notice has been withdrawn by a further notice from an Inspector, unless he has obtained a licence to do so from an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority;

(2) Copies of such notices shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he may think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed;

(3) Copies of such notices, when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

*General Power to Control Dogs and Poultry.*

12.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may, by a written notice, served upon the occupier of any premises in the Prohibited Area on which dogs or poultry are kept, require such occupier to keep such dogs or poultry under such control as may be prescribed in the notice or to confine them to any specified part of the premises.

(2) Copies of such notices, when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

*Precautions to be taken by Persons Clipping Sheep.*

13. Any person who clips sheep on any farm or premises in the Prohibited Area shall, before he clips sheep on any other farm or premises,

whether in the Prohibited Area or not, take the following precautions against the spread of foot-and-mouth disease.

(1) He shall not clip sheep on such other farm unless he is wearing overalls capable of being cleansed and disinfected as required by this Order, and which have been so cleansed and disinfected since he clipped any other sheep, by being steeped for not less than five minutes in boiling water or steeped for not less than twenty minutes in the prescribed solution.

(2) He shall remove all wool, dung and soil from his boots, and leggings (if worn), and then disinfect them by immersion in, or thorough sponging with the prescribed solution.

(3) He shall remove all wool from any clippers or other instruments used in the clipping and then disinfect them with the prescribed solution.

(4) The prescribed solution for the purposes of the foregoing provisions shall be either a four per cent. (Minimum) solution of carbolic acid (containing not less than ninety-five per cent. of actual carbolic) or a disinfectant equal in disinfective efficiency to the above mentioned solution of carbolic acid.

(5) He shall wash and brush his hands thoroughly with hot water, and then immerse them in a solution containing not less than three per cent. of carbolic acid of such strength as aforesaid.

*Local Authority to Enforce Order.*

14. This Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

*Offences.*

15. Any contravention of this Order or of any notice served thereunder, shall be deemed to be an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

*Revocation of Orders.*

16. The Orders described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby revoked.

*Commencement.*

17. This Order shall come into operation on the third day of May, nineteen hundred and twenty-four.

*Short Title.*

18. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (CHESHIRE DISTRICT) ORDER OF 1924 (No. 5).

## ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 30TH APRIL, 1924.)

### FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1924 (No. 71).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

#### Movement of Wintering Sheep.

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1924 (No. 70) (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Order"), sheep may be moved from wintering quarters situate in the Infected Area No. 2, described in the First Schedule to the Principal Order, to any other premises in Great Britain subject to and in

accordance with the following provisions of this Order, but not otherwise.

2. The sheep shall be accompanied by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the premises to which the sheep are to be moved are situate.

3. Before such licence is available it shall be countersigned by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District from which the sheep are to be moved.

4. The sheep shall be moved as far as practicable by railway or by vessel. The Inspector countersigning the licence and the Inspector granting the licence shall respectively specify the routes by which the sheep are to be moved to the railway station for the purpose of entraining, and from the railway station or landing place, as the case may be, nearest to the place of destination.

5. No licence shall be granted for the movement of sheep under this Order from or to any premises situate within a radius of two miles from any place which is for the time being declared to be a place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease, and the route to be specified by the Inspectors as aforesaid shall be such

that at no point shall the sheep be moved by road within a radius of two miles of any place which is for the time being declared to be a place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease.

6. Before any licence is countersigned under this Order the sheep to be moved shall be examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the sheep are within forty-eight hours before the movement commences, and no licence shall be countersigned unless the sheep have been certified by the Inspector to be free from any suspicion of Foot-and-Mouth Disease.

7. On arrival of the sheep at the railway station or landing place nearest to the place of destination, the sheep shall, before being dispersed to their intended destination for summer grazing and before being brought into contact with any other animals, be examined again by a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority.

#### *Disinfection of Railway Trucks and Vessels.*

8.—(1) Every railway truck or other railway vehicle in which sheep are to be placed for the purpose of movement with a licence under this Order shall, not more than twenty-four hours before the sheep are placed therein, be thoroughly sprayed or soused with liquid disinfectant under the supervision, and to the satisfaction, of an Inspector of the Local Authority.

(2) All parts of a vessel used for carrying sheep moved with a licence under this Order, and all fittings, pens, hurdles, or utensils used for or about the animals, shall, not more than twenty-four hours before the sheep are placed therein, be thoroughly sprayed or soused with liquid disinfectant under the supervision, and to the satisfaction, of an Inspector of the Local Authority.

(3) The liquid disinfectant used for the purposes of this Article shall be—

(a) a 1 per cent. (minimum) solution of chloride of lime (containing not less than 30 per cent. of available chlorine); or

(b) a 4 per cent. (minimum) solution of carbolic acid (containing not less than 95 per cent. of actual carbolic acid); or

(c) a disinfectant equal in disinfective efficiency to the above-mentioned solution of carbolic acid.

(4) Nothing in this Article shall interfere with the operation of the provisions of the Animals (Transit and General) Order of 1912, or any Order amending that Order, as to the cleansing and disinfection of railway trucks or other railway vehicles, or of vessels or parts thereof, used for the conveyance of animals on a railway or by water.

#### *Offences.*

9. If any sheep is moved, or anything is done or omitted to be done, in contravention of this Order, the owner and the person for the time being in charge of the animal in respect of which the same is done, or omitted to be done, or in respect of Article 8, the railway company or shipping company carrying the sheep, as the case may be, shall each according to and in respect of his or their own acts or omissions, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

#### *Revocation of Certain Orders.*

10. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1924 (No. 56), and the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1924 (No. 61) are hereby revoked on the third day of May, nineteen hundred and twenty-four.

1.—(1) Canadian cattle, except as hereinafter provided, shall, as a condition of landing in Great Britain, be marked before shipment by securely affixing to the right ear of each animal a tag of a pattern approved by the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries with the letter C and a serial number stamped thereon, and also by branding the animal on the right cheek with the letter C, or tattooing that letter on the left ear, unless the animal is already branded with a brand registered by the Government of a Province of the Dominion of Canada: Provided that this provision shall not apply to cattle to be landed at an Imported Animals Wharf for immediate slaughter.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the power conferred by Section Nine of the Importation of Animals Act, 1922 (Session 2), hereby orders as follows:—

(2) For the purposes of this Article the expression "Canadian cattle" means cattle born and reared in the Dominion of Canada.
