TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO MAKE A SPECIAL ORDER TO BE CITED AS THE TRADE BOARDS (STAMPED OR PRESSED METAL-WARES) ORDER, 1924.

Whereas the Minister of Labour on the 28th day of February, 1924, published notice of his intention to make a Special Order, pursuant to his powers under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, varying the description of the Stamped or Pressed Metal-Wares Trade contained in the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal-Wares) Order, 1919;

And whereas objections were made with respect to the draft Order;

And whereas the draft Order not having been amended or withdrawn after consideration of these objections, the Minister of Labour in accordance with the provisions of the First Schedule to the Trade Boards Act, 1918, appointed Sir William Warrender Mackenzie, K.B.E., K.C., to hold an enquiry with regard to the said draft Order and to report to him thereon;

And whereas Sir William Mackenzie duly held an enquiry in public with regard to the said draft Order on the 6th May, 1924, and reported to the Minister of Labour thereon;

And whereas the Minister of Labour has considered this report;

Now, therefore, the Minister of Labour hereby gives notice that, with a view to varying by way of correction the description of the Stamped or Pressed Metal-Wares Trade contained in the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal-Wares) Order, 1919, he intends, pursuant to the powers conferred upon him by Section 1 and Section 2 of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, to make a Special Order, varying the Trade Board (Stamped or Pressed Metal-Wares) Order, 1919, and the Trade Boards (Button-Making) Order, 1919, in the manner shown in the Draft Special Order contained in the Appendix hereto.
