## PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 1st day of May, 1924, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

'We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of | from their said mortgages:

the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice ') of Bredgar, in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Canterbury:

Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Bredgar is vested for an estate in fee simple in Sir Henry Edward Dering, Baronet, of Surrenden-Dering, Pluckley, Ashford, in the said County of Kent, subject, however, together with other hereditaments, to a certain family charge and also to certain Mortgages which are vested in the Equity and Law Life Assurance Society, being a duly incorporated Society whose registered office is at Number 18, Lincoln's Inn Fields, London, but otherwise free from incumbrances:

"And whereas the said Henry Edward Dering is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presenta-tion to the said Benefice of Bredgar, now vested as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Archbishop of Canterbury for the time being:

And whereas the said Equity and Law Life Assurance Society are prepared to consent to such transfer for the purpose of enabling the Advowson of the said Benefice of Bredgar to be transferred as aforesaid, freed and released
