TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 27th June, 1924, at 1 o'clock, for:

(a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, The National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and

(b) £4 per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1933.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £35,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £3,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from

Monday, the 30th June, 1924, to Saturday, the 5th July, 1924, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000. They will be exempt from Corporation Profits Tax, and will as indicated in the Notice of 1st April, 1924, rank *pari passu* with those issued under the Prospectus of the 23rd March, 1923. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 30th June, 1924, to Saturday, the 5th July, 1924, inclusive; the first dividend, payable on the 15th October, 1924, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.

7. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bonds required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of One shilling) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bonds of different dates.

The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills or Bonds are to be dated.

10. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills and Bonds.

The following agreement for the reciprocal notification by the British and Norwegian Governments of certain particulars respecting lunatic Norwegian subjects in Great Britain and lunatic British subjects in Norway has recently been concluded by an exchange of notes between the two governments and came into operation on the 5th instant.

1. His Britannic Majesty's Government

shall be informed through

2. Such information shall include the name of the asylum to which the patient is admitted and so far as possible the following details concerning the patient:—

- (1) Name (in full).
- (2) Birthplace, date and day of birth.
- (3) Position and occupation.
- (4) Where living when admitted.
- (5) Last address in home country.
- (6) Names (in full) and addresses of parents, or in case these are not living, of nearest relations.
- (7) If patient is married, name (in full) and address of husband or wife.
- (8) Date of persons admission to, discharge from or death in the asylum.
- (9) Name of the person or authority at whose request the patient is admitted to the asylum.
- (10) If the patient is admitted under a doctor's certificate, the date when that certificate was issued, and the name and address of the doctor.
- (11) Condition of the patient, whether the same permits a removal to the home country and how many attendants would be required for the transport home.
