And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Salisbury has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Act against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas neither of the two Benefices affected by the said Scheme is situate in a City or Municipal Borough:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the two Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Salisbury.

The following Statute made by Pembroke College, Cambridge, on the 12th day of May, 1924, and sealed by the University of Cambridge Commissioners on the 24th day of June, 1924, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923":—

STATUTE to alter and amend the Statutes of the College of Valence Mary commonly called PEMBROKE COLLEGE in the University of Cambridge, which amending Statute was duly made at a Meeting of the Governing Body of the College, specially summoned for this purpose and held on the twelfth day of May, 1924, and having been passed at such Meeting by the votes of more than two-thirds of the number of the persons present and voting, is now submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

WE, THE MASTER OR KEEPER AND FELLOWS AND SCHOLARS of the said College in exercise of the powers given to us by the 54th Section

of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, and by the 11th Section of the Schedule of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, do hereby alter and amend the Statutes made under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, in relation to our said College in manner following, that is to say:—

By repealing Chapter XII intituled "Of the Preservation of Interests of the Fellows" and substituting therefor the following Chapter XII to be intituled "Power to make agreements with Fellows":—

"1. The College shall have power to come to an agreement with any Fellow elected or appointed before the first day of January 1924 and holding any College Office who may desire to place himself under such new Statutes as may be made or approved by the Commissioners acting under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, for the surrender or modification of his rights and/or interests under the present College Statutes in consideration of rights under any College scheme for Pensions which may be made or approved by the said Commissioners, or under any modification thereof specified in such agreement, and for the payment by the College of such capital and annual sums as may be required by such agreement."
