THE ROADS ACT, 1920.

COUNTY OF THE EAST RIDING OF YORKSHIRE.

Notice is hereby given that on the twentyseventh day of June, 1924, the Minister of Transport made an Order under Section 7 (4) of the Roads Act, 1920, in respect of a certain highway in the County of the East Riding of Yorkshire.

The Order, which will come into force on the twentieth day of July, 1924, and will remain in force for a period of five years, is to the following effect:—

No person shall drive or cause to be driven on the highway specified in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as "the said road") any locomotive, any heavy motor car (as defined by Article II of the Heavy Motor Car Order, 1904), or any motor car with seats for more than fourteen persons exclusive of the driver;

Nothing in the Order shall prevent the driving on the said road of:-

(i) Any vehicle which is being used for the purposes of agriculture in connection with land adjoining or lying near to the said road or for the conveyance or haulage of timber felled upon such land;

- (ii) Any vehicle which is being used for the conveyance of goods or merchandise to or from any house, building or other premises situate on or adjacent to the said road; or
- (iii) Any vehicle which is being used in connection with the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said road.

THE ROADS ACT, 1920.

COUNTIES OF MIDDLESEX AND SURREY.

Notice is hereby given that on the twentyseventh day of June, 1924, the Minister of Transport made an Order under Section 7 (4) of the Roads Act, 1920, in respect of Hampton Court Bridge in the Counties of Middlesex and Surrey.

The Order, which will come into force on the twentieth day of July, 1924, and will remain in force for a period of three years, is

to the following effect:-

Except as hereinafter provided no person shall drive or cause to be driven on the highway on Hampton Court Bridge any mechanically-propelled vehicle exceeding three tons in weight unladen or constructed with seats for more than twenty persons exclusive of the driver; Provided that on any days when race meetings are being held at Hurst Park or Kempton Park any motor car constructed with a single deck for the conveyance of passengers may, irrespective of its weight or seating capacity, but subject to the restrictions hereinafter contained, be driven on the said highway;

No person shall drive or cause to be driven on the said highway any mechanically-propelled vehicle which under the provisions of this Order may be driven on the said highway at a speed exceeding in the case of a heavy motor car (as defined by Article II of the Heavy Motor Car Order, 1904), eight miles per hour, and in the case of any other

such vehicle ten miles per hour.

AGRICULTURAL COUNCILS REGULATIONS 1924.
