MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

REGULATION UNDER SECTION 9 (1).

CITY OF OXFORD

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the City of Oxford;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in Regulations made by the Local Government Board with a view to the safety of the public on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the power to make such Regulations has been transferred to the Minister of Transport;

And whereas the Town Council of the City of Oxford have applied for the issue of a Regulation in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising certain roads or parts of roads situate within the said City:

Now, therefore, the Minister of Transport, in pursuance of the powers given to him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulation:—

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the roads within the said City which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—This Regulation shall come into operation on the first day of August, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four.
