The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 24th day of July, 1924 (C.W. 9794/23), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

“And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, Schedule V, Section IX, to sanction the following scale of retired pay for Quartermasters, Royal Marines :—

“And whereas we are of opinion that this scale of retired pay should be improved, and that such improved scale should be applicable to certain other classes of Officers, Royal Marines :

“And whereas it is necessary to state the scales upon which the retired pay of Officers promoted from Royal Marine Gunner and Commissioned Royal Marine Gunner, and Chief Schoolmaster, Royal Marines, should be granted :

“And whereas we are further of opinion that the Regulations affecting the retired pay of Officers promoted to the rank or equivalent rank of Lieutenant Royal Navy, for acts of gallantry or daring, and to the rank of Lieutenant, Royal Marines, for specially meritorious service or distinguished war service require revision in order to secure uniformity of treatment :

“And whereas it is necessary to make provision for the retirement of Majors, Royal Marines, promoted to commissioned rank under Orders in Council bearing dates the 8th day of October, 1914, and the 22nd day of December, 1915, and absorbed in the Establishment of Majors :

" We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the Regulations set forth in the annexed Schedule.

" The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

" SCHEDULE.

" I.—(1) The following scale of retired pay for Quartermasters, Royal Marines, to be substituted for that provided by Order in Council dated 22nd January, 1920, Schedule V, Section IX:—

" II. Officers promoted from Royal Marine Gunner and Commissioned Royal Marine Gunner, except those promoted under the provisions of Order in Council of 11th February, 1913, to receive retired pay on the following scale:—

" IV. Officers promoted to the rank or equivalent rank of Lieutenant, Royal Navy, for acts of gallantry or daring, under the provisions of Orders in Council of 17th December, 1888, and 16th May, 1904, Officers promoted to Lieutenant, Royal Marines, for specially

meritorious service or distinguished war service under the provisions of Order in Council of 11th February, 1913, Clause 7, and any other Officers who may similarly be promoted for gallantry to be subject to the following Regulations:—

(i) Officers retired over the age of 40 to receive retired pay based on age and service on the scale in force applicable to Officers entered as Naval Cadets or Probationary Second Lieutenants, Royal Marines, respectively, and to count service in Warrant rank and above in full, and service from the age of 18 in any lower rank or rating as one half.

(ii) Officers invalided under the age of 40 either—

(a) to receive retired pay on the scale applicable to Lieutenants, Royal Navy, entered as Naval Cadets similarly invalided, and to count service in the same manner as Officers retired over the age of 40; such scale to continue to apply to Officers promoted to the rank or equivalent rank of Lieutenant Commander, Royal Navy, on the Active List, irrespective of the minimum of £180 a year laid down for that rank; or

(b) to receive retired pay on the scale applicable to Warrant Officers, if promoted from Warrant rank and if that scale would be more advantageous to them; for this purpose service above Warrant rank to count as service in Warrant rank, and service below Warrant rank not to count.

" V.—(i) Majors, Royal Marines, promoted from Warrant rank or from the ranks to commissioned rank under the provisions of Orders in Council dated 8th October, 1914, and 22nd December, 1915, and absorbed in the Establishment of Majors, to receive retired pay on the scale applicable to Officers entered direct as Probationary Second Lieutenant, Royal Marines, all service subsequent to promotion to permanent commissioned rank (including service prior to absorption in the Establishment) being counted for this purpose, but not service prior to such promotion.

" (ii) Majors, Royal Marines, so promoted and absorbed in the Establishment to be retired at the age of 50 years."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by the Termination of the Present War (Definition) Act, 1918, it is provided that His Majesty in Council may declare what date is to be treated as the date of the termination of the present war, and that the date so declared shall be as nearly as may be the date of the exchange or deposit of rati-

fications of the treaty or treaties of peace, and that His Majesty may also similarly declare what date is to be treated as the date of the termination of war between His Majesty and any particular State:

And whereas at Lausanne on the twenty-fourth day of July, nineteen hundred and twenty-three, a Treaty of Peace between certain Powers and Turkey was signed on behalf of His Majesty:

And whereas by the said Treaty of Peace it was provided that a procès-verbal of the deposit of ratification should be drawn up as soon as the Treaty had been ratified by Turkey, on the one hand, and the British Empire, France, Italy and Japan, or any three of them, on the other hand, and that from the date of the said procès-verbal the Treaty would come into force between the High Contracting Parties who had ratified it:

And whereas the said Treaty having been ratified by Turkey, on the one hand, and His Majesty, Italy and Japan, on the other hand, such a procès-verbal as aforesaid has been drawn up and dated the sixth day of August, nineteen hundred and twenty-four:

And whereas His Majesty, by Order in Council dated the tenth day of August, nineteen hundred and twenty-one, was pleased to order that the thirty-first day of August, nineteen hundred and twenty-one should be treated as the date of the termination of the present war, but it was provided that nothing in the said Order should affect the relations between His Majesty and the Ottoman Empire until ratifications of the Treaty of Peace with that Empire should have been exchanged or deposited:

And whereas it is desirable to declare the date which is to be treated as the date of the termination of the war with Turkey:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered that the said sixth day of August, nineteen hundred and twenty-four shall be treated as the date of the termination of war between His Majesty and Turkey.

WHEREAS by treaty, capitulation, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means, His Majesty the King had jurisdiction within the territories which formerly constituted the dominions of the Sublime Ottoman Porte:

And whereas by the Treaty of Peace with Turkey, signed on behalf of His Majesty at Lausanne on the 24th day of July, 1923, provision was made for the termination of the said jurisdiction in Turkey:

And whereas His Majesty has consented to the suspension of the said jurisdiction in certain territories which formed part of the said dominions but do not now form part of Turkey:

And whereas the said jurisdiction is exercised in Egypt in accordance with the provisions of

the Egypt Order in Council, 1915 (S.R. & O., 1915, No. 141), and the Egypt (Amendment) Order in Council, 1921 (S.R. & O., 1922, No. 156):

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act (53 & 54 Vict. c. 37), the Treaty of Peace (Turkey) Act, 1924 (14 Geo. 5, c. 7), or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. Subject to the provisions of Article 2, the Orders in Council mentioned in the Schedule to this Order, and any King's Regulations, Rules of Court, Rules, Instructions or other enactments made thereunder, are hereby repealed, but this repeal shall not extend to Egypt, and shall not, either in Egypt or elsewhere, affect the past operation of such Orders, King's Regulations, Rules of Court, Rules, Instructions or enactments, or any of them, or any right, title, obligation or liability accrued, or the validity or invalidity of any thing done or suffered under any of them, before the making of this Order.

2.—(i) The Secretary of State may, by an Order published in the London Gazette, direct that the jurisdiction of any Provincial Court established under the Orders in Council mentioned in the Schedule hereto in territory which does not now form part of Turkey shall continue, and the jurisdiction of such Provincial Court shall continue accordingly, and except as provided in sub-article (ii) shall be exercised in accordance with the provisions of the Orders in Council, King's Regulations, Rules of Court, Rules, Instructions or other enactments now in force in such territory.

(ii) Any appeal from such Provincial Court, which under the Orders in Council mentioned in the Schedule hereto would lie to the Supreme Court or the Full Court constituted under those Orders, shall lie to the Supreme Court for Egypt (or the Full Court, as the case may be) constituted under the "Egypt (Amendment) Order in Council, 1921," and such appeal shall be governed by the rules applicable to appeals from Provincial Courts in Egypt. The Provincial Court shall execute any Order made on such appeal in like manner as any original judgment of such Provincial Court should or might have been executed.

(iii) The Secretary of State may, by an Order published in the London Gazette, terminate to such extent and in such manner as he may think fit the jurisdiction of any Provincial Court whose jurisdiction has been continued under this Article.

3. This Order may be cited as "The Ottoman Order in Council, 1924," and shall be deemed to have come into force as from the date when the Treaty of Peace with Turkey came into force, that is to say the sixth day of August, nineteen hundred and twenty-four.

And the Right Honourable James Ramsay MacDonald, First Lord of the Treasury, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein.

The Ottoman Order in Council, 1910 (S.R. & O., 1910, No. 1184).

The Turkey Order in Council, 1922 (S.R. & O., 1922, No. 226).

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by section sixty-nine of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, His Majesty is, amongst other things, empowered by Order in Council to make such regulations as seem necessary or proper for setting in motion the Parliament and Government of Northern Ireland and also for any other matter for which it seems to His Majesty necessary or proper to make provision for the purpose of bringing the said Act into full operation or for giving full effect to any provision of the said Act and in particular His Majesty is empowered, amongst other things, by any such Order in Council to make such adaptation of any enactments as appear to Him necessary or proper with respect to the execution of services with respect to which the Parliament of Northern Ireland has not power to make laws and to provide for the exercise and performance of any powers or duties in connexion with those services by any department of the Government of the United Kingdom or officer of that Government where any such powers or duties are, under any existing Act or by the common law, to be exercised or performed by any department or officer in Ireland who will cease to exist as a department or officer of the Government of the United Kingdom:

And whereas under the Representation of the People Act, 1918, and other laws relating to the qualification of Parliamentary electors and election laws certain powers and duties in connexion with services with respect to which the Parliament of Northern Ireland has not power to make laws are to be exercised and performed by the Local Government Board for Ireland being a department which has ceased to exist as a department of the Government of the United Kingdom:

And whereas by section one of the Irish Free State (Consequential Provisions) Act, 1922, it is provided that subject to the provisions of the First Schedule to that Act the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, shall cease to apply to any part of Ireland other than Northern Ireland; and by section six of the same Act it is provided that His Majesty may by Order in Council make such adaptations of any enactments so far as they relate to any of His Majesty's Dominions other than the Irish Free State as may appear to Him necessary or proper as a consequence of the establishment of the Irish Free State:

And whereas the provisions of section one of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Election Laws (Northern Ireland) Order, 1924.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order in like manner as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2.—(1) The election laws and laws relating to the qualification of parliamentary electors in their application to electors and elections of members to serve in the House of Commons

for constituencies in Northern Ireland shall have effect subject to the modifications and adaptations set out in this Order save where inconsistent with the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, the Irish Free State Constitution Act, 1922, or the Irish Free State (Consequential Provisions) Act, 1922, or the provisions of any subsequent Order in Council under any of those Acts.

(2) The adaptations and modifications made by this Order shall apply to any order, scheme, rule, regulation or instrument made or issued under any of the laws aforesaid and in force as respects Northern Ireland immediately before the date of this Order in like manner as they apply to the enactment under which it was made or issued and any such order, scheme, rule, regulation or instrument shall continue in force as respects Northern Ireland in like manner and subject to the like powers of revocation and alteration as if it had been made or issued under the said enactment as so adapted and modified.

3.—(1) The powers and duties of the Local Government Board for Ireland under the Representation of the People Act, 1918, and any other election laws or laws relating to the qualification of parliamentary electors shall be exercised and performed by a Secretary of State and accordingly references in those laws to the Local Government Board for Ireland shall be construed as references to a Secretary of State.

(2) Nothing in this Article shall affect prejudicially any arrangement that may be made under section sixty-three of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, for the exercise and performance of the said powers and duties by departments and officers of the Government of Northern Ireland.

4.—(1) Subject to the provisions of this Article, the Clerk of the Crown and Peace for the county of Fermanagh shall be registration officer for so much of the constituency of Fermanagh and Tyrone as is comprised in the county of Fermanagh, and the Clerk of the Crown and Peace for the county of Tyrone shall be registration officer for so much of the said constituency as is comprised in the county of Tyrone.

(2) The powers and duties of the registration officer under Rule 23 of the First Schedule to the Representation of the People Act, 1918, with respect to the removal of duplicate entries or the placing of marks against names in cases of electors whose names appear in the electors' lists both in Fermanagh and Tyrone, and such other powers and duties of the registration officer as may be specified by the Secretary of State (being powers and duties which in the opinion of the Secretary of State ought to be exercised and performed by an officer acting for the whole of a constituency) shall in the case of the said constituency be exercised by such one of the said Clerks of the Crown and Peace as may be designated for the purpose by the Secretary of State, and the Clerk so designated shall for that purpose be registration officer for the constituency.

5. In the Ballot Act, 1872, references to the Clerk of the Crown and Hanaper in Ireland shall be construed as references to the Clerk of the Crown for Northern Ireland.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 421, Sub-section (2), of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, it is provided that His Majesty in Council, on the application of any person having authority over the waters of any harbour, river, or other inland navigation, or, if there is no such person, any person interested in the navigation thereof, may make rules concerning lights and signals to be carried or the steps for avoiding collision to be taken, and that those rules shall, as regards vessels navigating the said waters, be of the same force as if they were part of the collision regulations:

And whereas by Section 419, Sub-section (2), of the said Act it is provided that if an infringement of the collision regulations is caused by the wilful default of the master or owner of the ship, that master or owner shall, in respect of each offence, be guilty of a misdemeanour:

And whereas the Rivers Humber and Trent are harbours, rivers, or inland navigations within the meaning of the Act, with no person having authority to make rules as aforesaid over the said waters thereof:

And whereas the Humber Conservancy Board who, under the Humber Conservancy Act, 1907, are interested in the navigation of the waters of the said rivers, submitted certain Rules for such navigation which were sanctioned by His Majesty King George the Fifth by Order in Council, dated the 19th July, 1910:

And whereas the Humber Conservancy Board have submitted to the Board of Trade certain proposed Rules for such navigation in lieu of Rule 12 of the above-mentioned Rules sanctioned by Order in Council dated the 19th July, 1910:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the proposed Rules are proper and reasonable:

And whereas the provisions of Section one of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Him by the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to make the Rules which are set forth in the Schedule hereto annexed, and to direct that the same shall come into operation and be in force as and from the date of this Order in Council. And His Majesty is pleased, by and with the like advice, further to direct that as from the said date, the said Rule 12 so sanctioned by the Order in Council dated the 19th July, 1910, shall be altogether revoked, repealed, and abrogated.

SCHEDULE.

1. These Rules which should be read in conjunction with "The Trent Rules, 1910," "The Humber Bye-laws, 1910," and the Humber Rules, 1910, may be cited as "The Humber (Amendment) Rules, 1924."

2. These Rules shall be applicable to the Humber as defined by the Humber Conservancy Act, 1907.

3. Throughout the following Rules the words "Starboard Hand" shall denote that side which would be on the right hand of the

Mariner when approaching or navigating up the Humber from seaward, and "Port Hand" shall denote the left hand of the Mariner under the same circumstances.

A light on a wreck-marking vessel shall be carried in a lantern so constructed as to exhibit a clear and unbroken light visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least one mile.

If a wreck-marking buoy is lighted, the light shall be carried in a lantern so constructed as to exhibit a clear light visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least one mile.

The word "visible" when applied to lights shall mean visible on a dark night with a clear atmosphere.

4. Green shall be the colour for all purposes connected with wreck-marking, viz.:—

For Lights, Buoys, Balls, Shapes, Flags, Wreck-marking Vessels, &c.

Vessel and Buoys shall have the word "WRECK" painted in white letters on a green ground on their sides.

5. Wreck-marking buoys shall be of one of the following shapes, and (if a light is carried) shall be lighted in one of the manners following, and vessels shall pass the buoy in the manner indicated below:—

(a) To be passed on the Mariner's Port Hand—

Shape—Can.

Light—If lighted a Green Light giving two flashes.

(b) To be passed on the Mariner's Starboard Hand—

Shape—Conical.

Light—If lighted a Green Light giving three flashes.

(c) To be passed on either side—

Shape—Spherical.

Light—If lighted a Green Light giving one flash.

6. Wreck-marking vessels shall carry the following lights and shapes and give the following sound signals, and vessels shall pass the wreck-marking vessel in the manner indicated, viz.:—

(1) *Lights*.

(i) Between sunset and sunrise wreck-marking vessels shall carry the following lights:—

(a) To be passed on the Mariner's Port Hand—

Two green lights in a vertical line not less than 6 feet apart from the end of a cross-yard, the lower light to be of a height not less than 15 feet above the hull.

(b) To be passed on the Mariner's Starboard Hand—

Three green lights in a vertical line not less than 6 feet apart from the end of a cross-yard, the lowest light to be of a height not less than 9 feet above the hull.

(c) To be passed on either side—

Four green lights, two in a vertical line one over the other, not less than 6 feet apart, on each end of a cross-yard with a horizontal distance between the lights at either end of the cross-yard not less than 15 feet and not exceeding 25 feet. The height of the two lower lights to be not less than 15 feet above the hull.

(ii) A wreck-marking vessel shall not exhibit the ordinary riding light for a vessel at anchor.

(2) *Shapes.*

Between sunrise and sunset green balls or shapes shall be exhibited corresponding in number and arrangement to the green lights detailed in Part (I) of this Rule.

(3) *Sound Signals.*

A wreck-marking vessel during fog, mist, falling snow, or heavy rain storms, whether by day or night, shall ring a deep-toned bell at intervals of not more than 30 seconds as follows:—

(a) To be passed on the Mariner's Port Hand—

Two strokes in succession.

(b) To be passed on the Mariner's Starboard Hand—

Three strokes in succession.

(c) To be passed on either side—

Four strokes in succession.

7. When two or more vessels or buoys are used to mark a wreck a vessel shall not pass between them.

NOTE.—While it may be assumed that care will be taken to moor or anchor wreck-marking vessels and buoys securely, and, when lights are used, to fit them with efficient lighting apparatus, Mariners should not place undue reliance on wreck-marking vessels or buoys being maintained in position or on their lights, as through heavy weather or other causes they are liable both to drag their moorings and to break adrift, and their lights are liable to be extinguished.

Mariners should regard the marks and lights prescribed in the above Rules merely as aids to navigation, and while observing all proper precautions should give due heed to information contained in Notices to Mariners or to messages received by wireless telegraph or telephone as to the position and bearings of a wreck, and they should not assume that a wreck has been removed from the position given by such Notice or message merely because it may not be marked.

Mariners should always give a wreck as wide a berth as possible.

WHEREAS by the 655th Section of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, it is provided that if any lighthouse, buoy or beacon is erected or placed or reconstructed, repaired or replaced by a local lighthouse authority, His Majesty may, on the application of that authority, by Order in Council, fix such dues to be paid to that authority in respect of every ship which enters the port or harbour under the control of that authority or the estuary in which the lighthouse, buoy or beacon is situate, and which passes the lighthouse, buoy or beacon and derives benefit therefrom as His Majesty may think reasonable:

And whereas the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Beaumaris, act-

ing by the Town Council of the Borough of Beaumaris, who are a local lighthouse authority within the meaning of the 634th Section of the said Act, have established certain buoys, lights and beacon in the northern part of the Menai Straits within the limits of the Franchises of the Borough of Beaumaris between the Priestholme Island and the Swillies, which are under the control of the said Town Council, and have represented that the existing dues should be increased to provide for the maintenance of the said Buoy Lights and Beacon:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the application is reasonable and proper:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, upon the application of the said Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Beaumaris, acting by the Town Council of the Borough of Beaumaris, and in exercise of the powers vested in Him by the said recited Section, and of all other powers (if any) in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to direct that on and after the 1st day of September, 1924, the dues already leviable in respect of the said Buoy Lights and Beacon shall be increased and there shall be paid to the said Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Beaumaris acting by the Town Council of the Borough of Beaumaris in respect of every ship (whether British or Foreign) other than the vessels specified in Section 28 of the Harbours, Docks and Piers Clauses Act, 1847, navigating or anchoring within the limits of the Franchises of the Borough of Beaumaris, between the Priestholme Island and the Swillies, and which shall pass the said Buoy Lights and Beacon and shall derive benefit therefrom, the dues specified in the Schedule hereto.

“ The Boxmoor Ward shall include the area comprised within:—

“ The line forming the boundary of the Hemel Hempsted Ward hereinbefore described from the Western boundary of the Borough to the junction of such Ward Boundary with the Hemel Hempsted Branch of the Midland section of the London Midland and Scottish Railway line thence in a South Westerly direction along the centre of that line to the centre of the bridge over the London Road thence in a Westerly direction along the centre of the London Road to its junction with Roughdown Road thence in a Southerly direction along the centre of Roughdown Road to the London and North Western section of the London Midland and Scottish Railway line thence in a South Easterly direction along the centre of the said line to the centre of the footbridge which carries the public footpath from the London road to the Borough Boundary over the railway line and thence along the centre of the said footpath in a Southerly direction across Featherbed Lane to the Borough Boundary, and thereafter following the Borough Boundary in a South Westerly, Northerly, Westerly and Northerly direction to the point of commencement.

And whereas the two Benefices affected by the said Scheme are both situate in the City or Municipal Borough of Plymouth:

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme, and to order that the two Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Exeter.

"(b) the course and succession in which the respective patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice of Lyneham with Bradenstoke if it should fall vacant before the union of Benefices referred to in Clause 1 of this scheme takes effect shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the patrons of the said two Benefices of Lyneham and Bradenstoke - cum - Clack alternately, the patron of the said Benefice of Bradenstoke-cum-Clack having the right of presentation upon the first avoidance of the United Benefice after the union;

and (B) if the said Benefice of Tockenham shall be the first of the two Benefices to be vacated

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend John Edwin, late Bishop of Chelmsford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Willingale Doe with Shellow Bowells and Willingale Spain duly made their report to the said Bishop of Chelmsford and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Chelmsford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas both of the said Benefices of Willingale Doe with Shellow Bowells and Willingale Spain are now full, the Reverend Robert Travers Saulez being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Willingale Doe with Shellow Bowells and the Reverend Elson Isaac Colnett being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Willingale Spain:

“ And whereas the patronage of the said Benefice of Willingale Doe with Shellow Bowells belongs to Charles Savin Foster, of Newton House, Loughton, in the said County of Essex, Esquire:

“ And whereas the patronage of the said Benefice of Willingale Spain is exercisable as follows, that is to say, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being, on behalf of Your Majesty Your Heirs and Successors, is entitled to present on any vacancy of the said Benefice of Willingale Spain the person nominated for that purpose by the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Chelmsford:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the Right Reverend Frederic Sumpter Guy, now Bishop of Chelmsford, and with the consents of the said Charles Savin Foster and of the Right Honourable Richard Burdon, Viscount Haldane, now Lord High Chancellor of Great

Britain (in testimony whereof they have respectively signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Willingale Doe with Shellow Bowells and the said Benefice of Willingale Spain shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of Willingale with Shellow ’ and that the parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Act provided.

“ 2. That the Church of the Parish of Willingale Doe shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Willingale Doe shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

“ 3. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith: and if one only of the said two Benefices shall then be vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the other of the said two Benefices: and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of that one of the said two Benefices which shall last be avoided after the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme.

“ 4. That upon the union taking effect the marriage registers in duplicate current at the respective Churches of Shellow Bowells and Willingale Spain shall be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

“ 5. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Willingale Doe with Shellow Bowells shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Willingale Spain and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall constitute and form part of the Fund created by the 13th Section of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919.

“ 6. That upon the said union taking effect all the Tithe Rent Charges glebe lands and all (if any) other the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice or which may hereafter belong thereto shall be charged and for ever after be chargeable in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of each of the three Benefices of Blackmore, Founness and High Beech, all in the said County of Essex and in the said Diocese of Chelmsford, with the annual sums or yearly rent charges hereinafter mentioned, that is to say, in each case a clear annual sum or yearly rent charge equivalent in amount to the gross yearly value of a sum of £27 9s. 5d. Tithe Rent Charge as determined in accordance with the Statutory provisions for the time being

and from time to time in force for ascertaining the sum payable in respect of Tithe Rent Charge and to be paid half yearly as hereinafter provided and so that the amount of the half yearly instalment of the said yearly rent charge to be paid on each half yearly day hereunder shall be the same or the like amount in each case as would in accordance with the aforesaid Statutory provisions have become payable in respect of such sum of £27 9s. 5d. Tithe Rent Charge on the last preceding half yearly day for payment of Tithe Rent Charge the said yearly rent charges to be as from the date of the union taking effect due and payable to the Incumbents of the said three Benefices of Blackmore, Foulness and High Beech and to be apportionable between any outgoing Incumbent of any of the said Benefices of Blackmore, Foulness and High Beech or his representatives on the one hand and his successors in the same incumbency on the other hand and to be receivable by the Incumbent in whose favour it is charged as aforesaid by half yearly instalments on the first day of May and the first day of November in every year, and for the recovery of the said yearly rent charges the Incumbents of the said several Benefices of Blackmore, Foulness and High Beech and their successors respectively shall have and be entitled to all such or the like powers and remedies as are expressed to be conferred by Section 44 of the Conveyancing and Law of Property Act, 1881, in relation to rent charges within the purview of that Section.

“ Provided always that if at any time by reason of any redemption of Tithe Rent Charge belonging to the said United Benefice or any sale of or other transfer of the right to receive any such Tithe Rent Charge the endowments chargeable with the said yearly rent charges shall no longer include any sum whatsoever of Tithe Rent Charge then and in such case as from the date on which such redemption sale or transfer shall take effect the amount of the said yearly rent charges shall cease to be regulated by the value of Tithe Rent Charge and shall thereafter in each case be a fixed annual sum equivalent to the amount payable in respect of each of the said yearly rent charges for the year ending on the half yearly day for the payment thereof which last preceded the aforesaid date.

“ Provided also that if at any time the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice shall by any deed duly executed by him under his hand and seal in accordance with the provisions of any Statute in that behalf enabling him grant convey and annex or if by any other instrument in accordance with statutory authority there shall at any time be annexed to the said Benefices of Blackmore, Foulness and High Beech or any of them in lieu of or in substitution for all or any of the yearly rent charges hereby created any part or parts of the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice which shall in the opinion of the Bishop of Chelmsford for the time being be a just and fair equivalent or not less than an equivalent for all or any of the yearly rent charges hereby created as aforesaid then the said yearly rent charge in any case in which equivalent endowments shall have been granted conveyed and annexed as aforesaid shall thereupon and thenceforth cease and be no longer payable.

“ 7. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, and the first turn of presentation or nomination shall belong to the Patron of that one of the said two Benefices of Willingale Doe with Shellow Bowells and Willingale Spain the Incumbent of which does not become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice under any of the provisions of Clause 3 of this Scheme.

“ Whereas at certain extremities of the said Parish of Brighton, of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Nicholas, Brighton, and of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Stephen, Brighton, both in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such Parish and New Parishes:

“ And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said Parish of Brighton, of the said New Parish of Saint Nicholas, Brighton, and of the said New Parish of Saint Stephen, Brighton, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Michael and All Angels, Brighton, situate as aforesaid:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Winfrid Oldfield, Bishop of Chichester, as such Bishop, and also as the Patron, in right of his See as well of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Brighton as of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Nicholas, Brighton, and with the consent of the Reverend Frederick Cyril Nugent Hicks, Clerk in Holy Orders, the Vicar or Incumbent of the said Vicarage of the Parish of Brighton and, as such Vicar or Incumbent, the Patron of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Stephen, Brighton (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said Parish of Brighton, of the said New Parish of Saint Nicholas, Brighton, and of the said New Parish of Saint Stephen,

Brighton, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Michael and All Angels, Brighton, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named ‘ The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Michael and All Angels, Brighton.’

“ We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.”

“ THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

“ The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Michael and All Angels, Brighton, comprising:—

“ All those contiguous portions of the Parish of Brighton, of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Nicholas, Brighton, and of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Stephen, Brighton, all in the County of Sussex and in the Diocese of Chichester, which are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of St. Nicholas, Brighton, from an isolated portion of the said Parish of Brighton at the junction of the road called Regent Hill and Western Road, and extending thence westward along the middle of Western Road (thereby following in part the boundary which divides the said isolated portion of the Parish of Brighton from the said New Parish of Saint Stephen, Brighton) for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Hampton Place, and extending thence northward along the middle of Hampton Place for a distance of 7 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Montpelier Terrace upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Stephen, Brighton, from another isolated portion of the said Parish of Brighton, and extending thence westward along the last mentioned boundary (thereby following the middle of Montpelier Terrace) for a distance of 6½ chains or thereabouts to the junction of Montpelier Terrace with Montpelier Road and the road called Montpelier Place, and extending thence westward along the middle of Montpelier Place for a distance of 8½ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Stephen, Brighton, from the New Parish of Saint Patrick, Hove, in the said County and Diocese, and extending thence north-eastward along the last mentioned boundary (thereby crossing Victoria Road) for a distance of 19 chains or thereabouts to the point in the middle of Windlesham Avenue where such boundary meets the boundary which divides the New Parish of All Saints, Brighton, in the said County and Diocese, from the said New Parish of Saint Stephen, Brighton, and extending thence south-eastward along the last mentioned boundary (thereby following the middle of Windlesham Avenue) for a distance of 7 chains or thereabouts to the junction of Windlesham Avenue, Montpelier Road and the road called Clifton Hill where such boundary meets the boundary

(b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave, and subject to such burial not involving the exposure of human remains.

AYLESBURY AND WYCOMBE UNIONS.

WENDOVER PARISH.

Whereas the Parish of Wendover is situate within the Wycombe Rural District and the Wycombe Union, and the County Council of Buckingham have made an order under section 57 of the Local Government Act, 1888, for the transfer of that Parish to the Rural District of Aylesbury;

And whereas the Parish Council of Wendover and the Rural District Council of Aylesbury have applied to the Minister of Health for an order for the transfer of the Parish of Wendover from the Wycombe Union to the Aylesbury Union:

Now, THEREFORE, the Minister of Health, in pursuance of section 32 of the Poor Law Amendment Act, 1834, and section 66 of the Poor Law Amendment Act, 1844, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Short Title and Commencement.

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Wendover Order, 1924, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of October, 1924:

Provided that for the purpose of the preparation of any precept or contribution order to be made on or after the 1st day of October, 1924, this Order shall operate from such earlier day as may be necessary.

(2) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires, "the appointed day" means the 1st day of October, 1924.

Transfer of the Parish of Wendover.

2.—(1) On the appointed day, the Parish of Wendover in the Wycombe Union shall be separated from that Union, and shall be added to and form part of the Aylesbury Union.

(2) In this Order, "the transferred Parish" means the Parish of Wendover.

Rural District Councillors and Guardians.

3. Any person who, immediately before the appointed day, is in office as Rural District Councillor for the Parish of Wendover, shall, on and after the appointed day, represent that Parish on the Board of Guardians of the Aylesbury Union, and shall cease to act as a Guardian of the Wycombe Union.

Irremovability.

4. Every person, who immediately before the appointed day has acquired, or is in the course of acquiring, a status of irremovability from the Wycombe Union, by reason of residence in the transferred Parish, or any part thereof, shall be deemed to have acquired, or to be in the course of acquiring, a status of irremovability from the Aylesbury Union.

Property, Debts and Liabilities.

5.—(1) All property, debts and liabilities which, immediately before the appointed day, are vested in or attach to the Guardians of the Wycombe Union in relation exclusively to the transferred Parish, or to any part thereof, shall, by virtue of this Order, be transferred to, vest in and attach to the Guardians of the Aylesbury Union.

(2) Any property, debts and liabilities which, immediately before the appointed day, are vested in or attach to the Guardians of the Wycombe Union in relation to the transferred Parish, or to any part thereof, conjointly with any other area, shall be a matter for adjustment.

(3) For the purpose of this Article, the cost accruing, on and after the appointed day, of the maintenance in any institution for lunatics, or other institution, of any person who may be chargeable immediately before the appointed day to the Guardians of the Wycombe Union, and—

(a) who has acquired a settlement in the transferred Parish; or

(b) who resided in the transferred Parish immediately before he last became chargeable to the Guardians of the Wycombe Union;

shall be deemed to be a liability attaching immediately before the appointed day to the Guardians of the Wycombe Union in relation exclusively to the transferred Parish.

(4) For the purpose of any adjustment which may become necessary in consequence of the provisions of this Order, section 62 of the Local Government Act, 1888, shall apply, subject to the modifications specified in the First Schedule to the Poor Law (Dissolution of School Districts and Adjustments) Act, 1903.

Compensation to Officers, etc.

6.—(1) If any officer or servant, in office immediately before the appointed day, shall be deprived of any office or employment, or shall suffer any direct pecuniary loss by reason of this Order, or by anything done in pursuance or in consequence of this Order, the Minister of Health may, if he sees fit, award such compensation as may, in his opinion, be equitable.

(2) Any compensation awarded under this Article shall be paid by such persons, out of such fund, and in such manner, as the Minister of Health may direct.

Parochial Documents.

7. Any books or documents, immediately before the appointed day, in the possession of the Guardians of the Wycombe Union, or of the Assessment Committee of that Union, and relating exclusively to the transferred Parish, shall be transferred to the possession of the Guardians of the Aylesbury Union, or of the Assessment Committee of that Union (as the case may require).

Orders.

8. All orders issued by the Minister of Health, or his predecessors, which immediately before the appointed day are in force in the Aylesbury Union, and apply to the several parishes in that Union, shall extend and apply to the transferred Parish.

Existing Contracts and Instruments.

9. All contracts, deeds, bonds, agreements and other instruments entered into or made by the Guardians of the Wycombe Union in relation exclusively to the transferred Parish, shall be of as full force and effect against or in favour of the Guardians of the Aylesbury Union, and may be continued and enforced as fully and effectually as if, instead of the

Wycombe Guardians, the Aylesbury Guardians had been a party thereto.

Pending Actions.

10. If, immediately before the appointed day, any action, cause of action or proceeding, is pending or existing by or against the Guardians of the Wycombe Union, in relation exclusively to the transferred Parish, or any part thereof, the same shall not be in anywise prejudicially affected by reason of the making of this Order, but may be continued, prosecuted, and enforced by or against the Guardians of the Aylesbury Union.

Savings.

11. All precepts or contribution orders issued or made before the appointed day shall be as valid in law as if this Order had not been made.

12. All rates made by the Overseers of the transferred Parish, which are not collected at the appointed day, may be collected and recovered as if this Order had not been made.

13. Nothing in this Order shall be construed as restricting the powers of the Secretary of State, or of the Minister of Health, or of any County Council, under the Local Government Act, 1888, or of the Local Government Act, 1894.

Determination of Questions, etc.

14. If any question, difference or difficulty arises in relation to any matter dealt with in this Order, the Minister of Health may provide for the determination of the question or difference, or the removal of the difficulty.

1. Any person who dips sheep on any farm or premises in an Infected Area shall, before he dips sheep on any other farm or premises, whether in an Infected Area or not, take the following precautions against the spread of Foot-and-Mouth Disease:—

(1) He shall not dip sheep on such other farm unless he is wearing overalls capable of being cleansed and disinfected as required by this Order and which have been so cleansed and disinfected since he dipped any other sheep, by being steeped for not less than five minutes in boiling water, or steeped for not less than twenty minutes in the prescribed solution.

(2) He shall remove all wool, dung and soil from his boots and leggings (if worn), and then disinfect them by immersion in, or thorough sponging with, the prescribed solution.

(3) The prescribed solution for the purposes of the foregoing provisions shall be either a

five per cent. (minimum) solution of carbolic acid (containing not less than ninety-five per cent. of actual carbolic) or a disinfectant equal in disinfective efficiency to the above-mentioned solution of carbolic acid.

(4) He shall wash and brush his hands thoroughly with hot water and then immerse them in a solution containing not less than three per cent. of carbolic acid of such strength as aforesaid.

Offences.

2. Any person required by this Order to take precautions against the spread of foot-and-mouth disease who shall fail to take the precautions required shall be guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the twelfth day of August, nineteen hundred and twenty-four.
