Leghorne, June 3. N. S.

ONE of the Great Duke's Gallies arrived here the 29th of the last month from *Marseilles*, and departed again the same day for *Civita Vecchia*, having on Board the Cardinal *de Bouillon*, who is going to *Rome*. The 30th went out of this Port an English Privateer, called the *John Galley*, who the next day met with, and took a French Ship, the *St. Anthony*, *Andrew Giobert* Commander, laden from *Alexandria*, and brought her into this Port.

Warsaw, June 3. Most of the Gentry are now arrived, and lie in Tents about a League from this Place; the Whitsun-Holy-Days have given some Interruption to the Proceedings of the Dyer; who on the 29th resumed their Debates about choosing a Marshal, or Speaker; and there appeared a considerable Party for pacing the *Sieur Leszinski* in that Station; to oppose which, 'twas insisted on by others, that they should first Enquire who were the Authors of the late Confederacy of the Army, and they offered to produce some Papers, by which it would be made out, that the Father of the said *Leszinski* had very much promoted it; This occasioned great Differences and Heats; and some Reflections were made upon the Primate and Prince *Lubomirski*; for favouring understand the said Confederacy, in order to obtain by that means the Crown for the Prince of *Conti*. The Marshal of the last Dyer, who performs this Office till a new one is chosen, endeavoured to moderate things, and at last it was consented to on all sides, that they should first proceed to the Election of a Marshal. But as yet they have not been able to agree about the Person, to fill this Place.

Vienna, June 8. The bad weather has retarded for several days the intended Siege of *Bihatz*; Three Regiments of German Foot, one of Horse; and two of Dragoons, designed for this Service, Rendezvoused the 30th of the last Month near *Carlsstat*, and on the 31th marched thence under the Command of General *Auersberg* to a Place called *Unzwias* in *Croatia*, where the Foot continued the 3d and 4th with the Artillery, by reason of the great Rains, but the Horse advanc'd several Miles further to the River *Corona*, to observe the Enemy; The Forces of *Croatia* were likewise drawn together, and when joined with the Germans, would make an Army of above 20000 Men; They had taken in the German Camp a French Ingenier, who came thither as a Spy. The Troops that are to compose the Emperor's main Army in *Hungary*, march to their Rendezvous between *Baya* and *Vershmarten*; and Prince *Eugene* of *Savoy* will leave this place in few days in order to repair thither, having already sent away his Equipage. The Envoy of *Moscovy* prepares for his departure, intending to pass the Campaign in the Imperial Army in *Hungary*; and three Ambassadors from the *Czar* are shortly expected at this Court. The young Duke of *Lorraine* is gone to the Confederate Army on the *Rhine*, and the Emperor has made him Velt-Marshal of his Forces.

Frankfort, June 16. The Confederate Forces continue in their Camp near *Eppingen*; we have yet no advice of Prince *Lewis* of *Baden*'s arrival there; A Detachment of Hussars is sent from thence to join the Troops of the Allies, which are posted near *Mentz*. The French are encamped at *Lautersheim* on the other side of the *Rhine*, except a small Body commanded by the *Marquis de Chamilly*, which lies near *Worms*. The Deputies of the Six Circles are now assembled,

Cologne, June 18. The Forces of *Hesse* are expected this Evening near *Duren*, in their march towards *Brabant*. Part of the French Forces, which lay near the *Moselle*, are marched with *Monsieur Harcourt* towards the *Meuse*; and the rest to the Army commanded by *Marschal Choiseul*. The Letters from the *Upper Rhine* say, the Bavarian Forces had joined the Confederate Army; and that the Duke of *Lorraine* was come to *Stuttgart* in his way thither.

Hamburg, June 18. The Danish Forces opened their Trenches against the *Holmer* Fort on the 11th Instant; the 12th and 13th they shot several Bombs into the Place, and being ready for an Assault, the Governor desir'd a Parley on the 14th, and agreed to surrender the said Fort; after which the Danish Forces marched to attack the two other Forts lately built by the Duke of *Holstein*. The King of *Denmark* is returned to *Copenhagen*, and before his departure from *Rensburg* promised, that these three Forts, being demolished, he will withdraw all his Troops, and send them to their former Quarters.

Paris, June 17. An Express is arrived from the French Army in *Catalonia*, who brings an account that *Barcelona* was Invested the 9th Instant, and the Trenches were to be opened the 12th; That the Prince of *Hesse Darmstadt* was entered into the Town with 11000 Foot and 1000 Horse, besides the Militia of the Country, which made up the Garison to about 20000, and the rest of the Spanish Army, being 5000 Foot and 3000 Horse, were retired to the other side of the River *Lobregat*, to expect a Reinforcement, and to act as opportunity might offer, in order to disturb the French Troops in the Siege, and intercept their Convoys. The Duke of *Vendosme*, who commands the French Army, is indisposed; and it must be expected the Troops will suffer very much by the excessive Heats that are coming on; The Count *d'Estree* with 9 Men of War from *Thoulon*, and the Gallies from *Marseilles*, are arrived before *Barcelona*; 'Tis said that the *Marquis de Nesmond* is gone to join them; and that a Vessel is come in who met his Squadron on the other side of *Cape Finster*, directing his Course towards the *Streights*.

Brussels, June 19. On the 14th Instant the *Marschal de Villeroy* came with a Body of 3 or 4000 Horse to view the Ground about *Enguise*, which occasioned a report that he would march that way with the Army under his Command; but he continues in his Camp at *Lessines*, and seems by the care that is taken to manage the Forage, to have as yet no design of removing from thence. *Marschal Boufflers* is still at *Roux*; and *Marschal Catinat* near *Arth*. *Monsieur Vauban*, the French Ingenier, was some days ago at *Charleroy*, and afterwards went to *Philippride* and *Dinant*, to view those Garisons. They have not yet begun to work on the new Fortifications designed here; but instead thereof a Body of Troops is ordered to cover this City.

From His Majesty's Camp at *Promelles*, June 20. On Tuesday last Major General *du Beye*, and the Prince of *Wirtemberg* Brigadier, marched from thence with 1500 Horse and Dragoons, to attack a Body of about 1000 French which were posted near *Charleroy*, but upon notice of the march of our Troops, they immediately retired under the Cannon of the Town, and the Major General came back yesterday Noon with about 20 Prisoners, whom they took in the Morning. The Troop of Dutch Horse Guards came this day in the Camp, having been hitherto Cantoned between *Mecklen* and *Brussels*. The *Lunenburgh* Forces under the Command of Lieutenant General *Ohr* are expected this night about *Louvain*; when these Troops, and the 5 Battalions newly arrived from *England* have
