TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 12th September, 1924, at 1 o'clock, for:—

(a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, The National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and

(b) £4 per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1933.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £35,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £3,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 15th September, 1924, to Saturday, the 20th September, 1924, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even

multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

4 PER CENT. TREASURY BONDS, 1933.

6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000. They will be exempt from Corporation Profits Tax, and will, as indicated in the Notice of 1st April, 1924, rank *pari passu* with those issued under the Prospectus of the 23rd March, 1923. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 15th September, 1924, to Saturday, the 20th September, 1924, inclusive; the first dividend payable on the 15th October, 1924, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.

7. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bonds required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one shilling) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bonds of different dates.

8. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House, or Broker.

9. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not

later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills or Bonds are to be dated.

10. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills and Bonds.

11. Tenders must be made on the printed forms, which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

12. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

SECTION III.

The WEEKLY RATES set out in Sections I and II above are based on a week of 47 hours and are subject to a proportionate decrease according as the number of hours of employment in any week is less than 47.

NOTE.—In the case of all Male Workers employed on Piece-Work, each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate to an ORDINARY worker, *i.e.*, a worker of ordinary skill and experience in the class of work in question.

SECTION IV.—DEFINITIONS OF GRADES OF WORKERS.

For the purpose of the above Rates the following definitions apply :—

BRAZIERS :

A Brazier of Grade I is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over employed on brazing and not fulfilling the conditions of Grade II or Grade III as hereinafter defined.

A Brazier of Grade II is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who has had not less than six years' experience as a Brazier and who is employed in brazing all classes of metal except aluminium.

A Brazier of Grade III is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who, in addition to fulfilling the conditions of Grade II, as above defined, is also employed in brazing aluminium OR is a charge hand responsible for all work and order in the shop.

BURNISHERS :

A Burnisher of Grade I is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over employed on burnishing and not fulfilling the conditions of Grade II or Grade III as hereinafter defined.

A Burnisher of Grade II is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who has had not less than six years' experience as a Burnisher and who is employed as a hook and straight Burnisher at the vice and satisfactorily burnishes deep thin shell work at the lathe.

A Burnisher of Grade III is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who, in addition to fulfilling the conditions of Grade II, as above defined, is an expert in speed and quality in all classes of work OR is a charge hand responsible for all work and order in the shop.

DROP-STAMPERS :

A Drop-Stamper of Grade I is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over employed on drop-stamping and not fulfilling the conditions of Grade II or Grade III as hereinafter defined.

A Drop-Stamper of Grade II is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who has had not less than six years' experience as a Drop-Stamper and who is employed on all classes of deep or shallow work.

A Drop-Stamper of Grade III is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who, in addition to fulfilling the conditions of Grade II, as above defined, is an expert in all classes of work OR is a charge hand responsible for all work and order in the shop.

DIPPERS WHO ARE ALSO BRONZERS :

A Worker of Grade I is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over employed on dipping and bronzing and not fulfilling the conditions of Grade II or Grade III as hereinafter defined.

A Worker of Grade II is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who has had not less than six years' experience as a Dipper and Bronzer who is employed in dipping or bronzing or on art bronzing and colouring, or electro-plating.

A worker of Grade III is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who, in addition to fulfilling the conditions of Grade II, as above defined, also has an expert knowledge of art bronzing or metal colouring or electro depositing and solutions OR is a charge hand responsible for all work and order in the shop.

POLISHERS :

A Polisher of Grade I is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over employed on polishing and not fulfilling the conditions of Grade II or Grade III as hereinafter defined.

A Polisher of Grade II is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who has had not less than six years' experience as a polisher and is employed in any process of any class of common work and who emery-hobs or mops.

A Polisher of Grade III is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who, in addition to fulfilling the conditions of Grade II, as above defined, is also an expert in all processes of both common and best work OR is a charge hand responsible for all work and order in the shop.

PART II.

OVERTIME RATES (AS VARIED) FOR MALE WORKERS (ALL AGES).

SECTION I.—NORMAL NUMBER OF HOURS OF WORK.

In accordance with Section 3 (i) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board have declared the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

On Saturday	4½

Provided that all hours worked on Sundays and on Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—OVERTIME RATES.

The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of time worked by a worker, whether employed on time-work or on piece-work in excess of the declared normal number of hours shall be as follows:—

- For all time worked on Sundays and Statutory Holidays twice the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable; *i.e.*, DOUBLE-TIME.
- For all time worked in excess of four-and-a-half hours on Saturday, One-and-a-half times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF, notwithstanding that the total number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 47.
- For all time worked in excess of 47 hours in any week; TIME-AND-A-QUARTER for the first two hours and TIME-AND-A-HALF thereafter; except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of Sub-Section (a) and (b) of this Section.

PART III.

APPLICABILITY OF MINIMUM RATES.

APPLICABILITY OF RATES.

The above Minimum Rates of wages apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all MALE WORKERS who are employed as Braziers, Burnishers, Drop-Stampers, Dippers, Dippers who are also Bronzers, or as Annealers or Polishers, in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares) Order, 1919, which is also included under the terms of the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares) Order, 1924.

PART IV.

SECTION I.—RATES TO BE PAID CLEAR OF DEDUCTIONS.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.—RATES WITHOUT PREJUDICE TO PAYMENT OF HIGHER WAGES.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages or to agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these minimum rates of wages.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATION OF PROBATIONARY INSPECTOR IN THE ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT OF THE POST OFFICE.

These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. AGE.—The limits of age for this situation are 17 and 20. Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the 1st March or the 1st September of the year in which they are examined, according as the examination is held in the first or second half of the year.

In reckoning age for this purpose candidates who have served, or are serving, in the Army, Navy or Air Force, may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served.

2. NATIONALITY.—No person will be eligible for appointment who is not a natural-born British subject and the child of a father also a natural-born British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, and provided that exception may be made as regards the father in the case of candidates who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces during the Great War between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918.

Of those who pass and obtain the highest aggregate marks on the first part a certain number, to be determined by the Civil Service Commissioners, will be admitted to the second part of the examination. The successful list will consist of those candidates who pass and obtain the highest aggregate marks on the whole examination.

6. APPLICATIONS for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such time and in such manner as the Civil Service Commissioners may appoint.

7. FEE.—A fee of £2 will be required from every candidate attending an Examination.
