The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Extension of Limits of Foot-and-Mouth Disease: Infected Place.

The Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place described in the Schedule to the Order of the Minister dated 12th September, 1924 (No. 3788) is hereby extended so as to include the Buildings situated in Long Mead together with the fields known as Long Mead and The Hassops, forming part of Debden Hall Farm, situated in the parish of Loughton, in the administrative county of Essex, and in the occupation of Messrs. Goulds, Ltd.

Extension of Limits of Foot-and-Mouth Disease: Infected Place.

The Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place described in the Schedule to the Order of the Minister dated 5th September, 1924 (No. 3774) is hereby extended so as to include the whole of the farm buildings and premises together with the lands in the sole occupation of Captain John Charles Prosper de Mestre, and being part of Newnham Grange Farm, in the parish of Newnham, in the administrative county of Northampton.
