- (d) THE PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATE (and the Overtime Rates based thereon) set out in Part VII are effective:—
 - as respects Female Weavers outside the areas of Aberdeen, Barrow-in-Furness, Carnoustie, Dundee and Tayport, as from 11th June, 1923.
 - (ii) as respects Female Weavers in Carnoustie, as from 3rd SEPTEMBER, 1923.
 - (iii) as respects all other workers to whom the rate applies, as from 29th SEPTEMBER, 1924.*
- Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full-pay period, but in any case not later than 5th October, 1924.
