

PART II—*continued.*

SECTION II.

The above proposed guaranteed time-rates and general minimum time-rates are weekly rates based on a week of 48 hours and are subject to a proportionate adjustment according as the number of hours of employment in any week is less than 48.

SECTION III.

A male worker employed on piece-work on work to which the General Minimum Piece-rates proposed in Part I of this Schedule are applicable must be paid at not less than the appropriate Guaranteed Time-rate in any case where his earnings on piece-work are less than such sum.

PART III.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF OVERTIME RATES FOR THE CLASSES OF MALE WORKERS FOR WHOM GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE-RATES ARE PROPOSED IN PART I OF THIS SCHEDULE.

Overtime Rates calculated on the proposed Minimum Rates set out in Parts I and II of this Schedule in the manner specified in Part IX of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice J. (35) dated 26th September, 1924, shall apply in substitution for the proposed Minimum Rates set out in Parts I and II of this Schedule in respect of all time worked by male workers of the classes specified in this Notice in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in Part IX of the Schedule to the said Notice J. (35) to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

PART IV.

The respective Proposed Minimum Rates set out in this Schedule shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male workers in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain on Hessian Weaving (as defined in Part I of this Schedule) in the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Jute) Order, 1919, and set out in Part X of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice J. (35) dated 26th September, 1924.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above proposals which may be lodged with them within two months from the 30th September, 1924. Such Objections should be in writing, and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Jute Trade Board (Great Britain), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W.1.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely and, so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.
