

the 1st day of February, the 1st day of May, the 1st day of August and the 1st day of November in each and every year to the Minister of the said proposed District, when duly licensed as hereinbefore mentioned and to his successors, Ministers or Incumbents of the said proposed District or New Parish, the sum of £45 per annum so long as the said capital sum of £1,000 shall remain in our hands:

“ And whereas the said grants of the said yearly sums of £120 and £45 respectively will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument or Instruments to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

“ And whereas there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of £1,000 towards the cost of erecting a permanent Church within and for the said proposed District:

“ And whereas the said sum of £1,250 £4 per centum Funding Stock (1960-1990) has been so assigned as aforesaid and the last mentioned capital sum of £1,000 has been so contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof, should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

“ And whereas the said Arthur Trehane Dingle and the principal contributors of the said capital sum of £1,000 towards the cost of erecting the said permanent Church have nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Durham as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Herbert Hensley, Bishop of Durham (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said District Parish of the Trinity, Stockton upon Tees, and of the said Parish of Egglecliffe, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a Separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named ‘ The District of All Saints, Preston upon Tees.’

“ And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance

in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in the said Herbert Hensley, Bishop of the said Diocese of Durham, and his successors, for ever.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

“ The District of All Saints, Preston upon Tees, comprising:—

“ I. All that portion of the District Parish of the Trinity, Stockton upon Tees, in the County of Durham and in the Diocese of Durham, which is comprised within and is co-extensive with the Civil Parish of Preston upon Tees.

“ II. And also all that contiguous portion of the Parish of Egglecliffe, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon the north east and upon the north by the above described portion of the said District Parish of the Trinity, Stockton upon Tees, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the west, upon the south and upon the south east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said District Parish of the Trinity, Stockton upon Tees, from the said Parish of Egglecliffe at the point where such boundary diverges from following the eastern side of Durham Lane, and extending thence first westward to and then southward along the middle of Durham Lane for a distance of 44½ chains or thereabouts to the centre of the level crossing where the Darlington and Saltburn Branch Line of the London and North Eastern Railway crosses Durham Lane, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 28 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the culvert which carries such line of railway across the stream which flows under Whiteley Springs Bridge into the River Tees, and extending thence first eastward and then north eastward along the middle of the said stream (thereby passing under the Leeds and Stockton Line of the said London and North Eastern Railway and also under Whiteley Springs Bridge) for a distance of 28 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Egglecliffe from the said District Parish of the Trinity, Stockton upon Tees.”

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein-before mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:
