Health Insurance purposes by the Insurance Committee and the person dispensing the prescription has no reason to suppose that the prescription is not genuine; or (iii) the person dispensing the prescription has taken reasonably sufficient steps to satisfy himself that the prescription is genuine.

2. The following Regulation shall be inserted in the Principal Regulations after Regulation 18:—

Diversion of drugs in transit.

- 19. If any consignment of the drugs to some destination outside the United Kingdom is brought into any port of the United Kingdom, no person shall, without the licence of the Secretary of State, divert, or cause or procure to be diverted, such consignment to any destination other than the destination to which it was originally consigned. The destination to which the consignment was originally consigned shall be deemed to be the destination stated in the licence, permit or other authority for the export of the consignment granted by the Government of the country of export.
- 3.—(a) The present Regulation 19 (Commencement) of the Principal Regulations is hereby revoked; and
- (b) Regulation 3 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1923, is hereby revoked, provided that any proceedings or other matter instituted under it shall not be invalidated and may be continued as though it had not been revoked.
- 4. These Regulations may be referred to as the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1924.

THE RAW OPIUM REGULATIONS, 1924, DATED NOVEMBER 20, 1924, MADE BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE UNDER SECTION 3 OF THE DANGEROUS DRUGS ACT, 1920 (10 & 11 GEO. 5. C. 46), FOR CONTROLLING THE MANUFACTURE, SALE, POSSESSION AND DISTRIBUTION OF RAW OPIUM.

In pursuance of Section 3 of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920 (10 & 11 Geo. 5. c. 46), I hereby make the following Regulations amending the Raw Opium Regulations, 1921 (S.R. & O. 1921, No. 864), hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations:—

1. The following Regulation shall be inserted in the Principal Regulations after Regula-

tion 9:-

Diversion of Raw Opium in Transit.

10. If any consignment of raw opium to some destination outside the United Kingdom is brought into any port of the United Kingdom, no person shall, without the licence of the Secretary of State, divert, or cause or procure to be diverted, such consignment to any destination other than the destination to which it was originally consigned. The destination to which the con-

- signment was originally consigned shall be deemed to be the destination stated in the licence, permit or other authority for the export of the consignment granted by the Government of the country of export.
- 2. The present Regulation 10 (Commencement) of the Principal Regulations is hereby revoked.
- 3. These Regulations may be referred to as the Raw Opium Regulations, 1924.
