

Treasurer be authorised to keep the Register of Mortgages granted by the Corporation under the Public Health Act, 1875.

(c) Section 418 of the said Sheffield Corporation (Consolidation) Act, 1918, so as to empower the Corporation to raise money by Bills to a sum not exceeding £1,000,000.

(d) Sections 478 and 507 of the said Sheffield Corporation (Consolidation) Act, 1918, so as to empower the Corporation to subscribe to the Voluntary Hospitals in augmentation of contributions by employees.

(e) Section 7 of the Sheffield Corporation Act, 1919, so as to provide for the repeal of so much of the said section as prohibits the Corporation from selling or disposing of any water for use outside the limits of supply; and,

(2) For the several purposes of the Application, or for purposes connected with, incidental to, or consequent on those purposes to make any such alteration or amendment of the said Local Acts or of any other Local Act or of any Act confirming a Provisional Order made in pursuance of any of the Sanitary Acts or of the Public Health Act, 1875, and in force in the said City as may be necessary or desirable:

And whereas it is proposed that a Provisional Order should be issued in compliance with the said Application;

MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

REGULATION UNDER SECTION 9 (1).

COUNTY OF SURREY.

To the County Council of Surrey;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in Regulations made by the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the power to make such Regulations has been transferred to the Minister of Transport;

And whereas the County Council of Surrey have applied for the issue of a Regulation in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising certain roads or parts of roads situate within the Urban District of Sutton (hereinafter referred to as "the Urban District");

Now, therefore, the Minister of Transport, in pursuance of the powers given to him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulation:—

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall, from the date on which this Regulation comes into operation, apply and have effect within the limits comprising the roads and parts of roads within the Urban District which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—This Regulation shall come into operation on the first day of December, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four.
