FOOT - AND - MOUTH DISEASE (IN-
FECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1924
(No. 172).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Contraction of Certain Infected Area.

1. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1924 (No. 170) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Infected Area No. 2 described in the First Schedule to that Order.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the fifth day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty-four.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1924 (No. 172) and shall be read with the Order referred to in Article 1.
