He Lucy of this place which about 7 weeks fince put to fea, intending for Virginia, having made about 300 lesgues of her way, met with extraordinary-ill weather and crofs winds, in which fhe broke her Fore-Maft and spent her Main-

Maft, and having run much hazard, put in again to this Port the first instant.

Since Sunday laft 6 Veffels have by the extraordinary violence of florms been caft upon the Rocks in this Halbour, two of them belonging to this Town broken in pieces; and the reft much damnified.

Plymouth, Fan. 8. On Tuiliday last arrived here the Loyal Friendship of London from Malaga.

Weymouth, fan. 9. The 5th inflant was forced on More to the Weilwards of the Ille of Portland, a Dutch Veffel called the Three Falcons of Amfterdam, bound for Vills Nova, laten with Iron, Deals, and Clap-board; her Company had fome time before deferted her, laving themfelves in their Boat: most part of the lading is fince preferved, and 'is hoped the Veffel it felf may be got off.

Rome, Dec 22. Here is lately arrived the Baron de Foix of the Royal house of Navarre, appearing with an honourable Train, attended by many Gentlemen, in enaing to divert himself here for fome time having been rec ived by the Pope with many demonstrations of kinonels, in celtimony whereof, His Holinels has ma e him feveral rich Prefents i he has fince paid his visits to the Queen of Swede'and, and Cardinal Rospiglioss, and feveral others of the faced Co ledge.

On Monday last arrived here by the way of Florence, in post Monfieur Bigorreslate S cretary to the Duke de Chaul nes, formerly Ambailsdor here, the principal part of his bufmels being to recommend to the Pope the Abbot de Albret Nephew to Mareshal Turenne, to be advanced to the dignity of Cardinal in the next promotion.

The next morning the Venetian Ambaflador had an extraordinary Andience from the Pope and Cardial Rofpigliofi, where they fpent fome time in difcou fing upon the affairs of Candia, for whole affiftance the Pope ftill continues his Zerl, in Order whereunto, he has commanded fome new Companies of Foot to be fpeedily railed, and a large quantity of Ammunition, and other warlike Provisions to be made ready, intending to fend out his Gallies again at the Spring, with feveral other thips which shall againd that time be fitted up for that fervice, with whom the Duk of Tufeany has promiled to joyn allo his Gallies.

This last week the Spanish Ambassadour the Marquis d'Astorga went with much Pomp and State to give a visit to the Queen of Sweden, and on Tuesday paid the same civility to Cardinal Orfine, the Protector of the Kingdom of Portugal.

The Ambaffador f om the Republick of *Ragufe* having taken his leave, is returned homewards with much latisfaction having received great testimony of the P pes bounty in the liberal advances made by him for their affisitance in the rebuilding of their City, formerly destroyed by an Earthquake.

Here lately paffed by a Contier from Spain Intending for Naples, with Orders from the Queen Regens, to the Vice-Roy of that Kingdom to haften torwards on his Embaffie of obedience to the Pope, leaving the care of his Government in the hands of the Marquis de Villa Franca. Yesterday arrived here on the same Errand and Character the Lount de fan Segundb from he Prin e of Parma; who is odged at the Pallace Farnese, and 'tis believed may after the performance of the ceremonial part of his Ambassie, make some progress for the putting an end to all farther difputes about Ca 10

Venice, Decemb. 29. This laft week brought us no fresh as v ces from *Candia*, Letters onely of the 26th of *November*, confirming to us the refolution of the bestieged to et deavour the removal of the Turks from their Posts as foon as the fuccors shall arrive from *Maltba*.

The Grand Vifier has lately received fresh fuccors from the Captain Baffa, which has encouraged him to continue his Siege with much obstinacy; having railed Terrafies about his own Tent, and ordered 2000 of the ftouteft of his foldie s to attend him this Winter as: is Guard. The Enemy sfaid to have gained part of the Out-works of the Fort St. Andr, where they have planted fome Canon; which being oppoied by others from the Town, fome fmall execution has been done on both files. The Marquis d'St. Andre Montbrun is faid to be upon a kopeful way of recovery from his hurt, his Charge being in the mean time executed by the Dake de Roanneq.

Some dayes fince the sprain Baffa having a defign upon the Venetian Gillies lying in the Pot of *Standia*, failed with about 50 Gallies to attack theme, and if poffi she to fire them in the Port; but the Venetians having intelligence of his defign, came out, intending to engage them at lea: but the Turks had not the courage to attend them.

G ne al *M rofini* intending the reaemption of Segnior Lafearis General de Bataille, and formerly taken prifoners difpatched Collonel Machierotti a Native of Candia, with Letters to the Grand Vifier defi ing his exchange : who appearing in a Fe ucca with a White Elag before Giofiro, and fending in the import of his Metlage by fome perfors who were fent out to him for that purpele; he had onely a thort retu n made him from the Vifier, that he lay there with int nition to take the City, and not to treat about prifoners : with which answer he was difinist. Chevalier G imani is preferrent to the Vicant Charge.

The faid General has cauled an Holpital to be erected at Standia, for the entertainment of the hurt and fick perfons which fi all be removed f om Candia, and has difpached feveral fhips to leveral parts upon the Archipelago, to furnish it with all forts of provisions.

The G an. Segnior having admitted the Venetian Ambaffador to an Audience, ref led to hearken to any Treaty of a peace till they should farst deliver Candia into his polfestions threatning in cale of refulal, to enter in perfon into Dalmatia to give them a diversion ; but to provide against this strem, upon the instance of Segnior Priuli Proveditor General of Dalmatia; the Senate have refolved to supply him speedily with ten thousand Musquets, and double the number of Swords to arm the people of the Conntrey in cale of danger, and are forming some Companies, which in little time will be ready to be fent to his affistance under the command of General Vertmiller.

Genoua, Decemb. 29. From Legorn we have the news of the late arrival there of Sir Thomas Allen, with a Squadron of English Men of War; who is daily expected here

The Marquis de Rovere having been made choice of to be fent into France, to relide there as Minifter from this Republick, is fitting up his Train, and may in few dayes de-Patt.
