BRUSH AND BROOM TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

NOTICE OF PROPOSAL (1) TO VARY THE GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES, PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATES, GUARANTEED TIME-RATES, GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE-RATES AND OVERTIME-RATES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS IN THE TRADE AND (2) TO FIX AN ADDITIONAL GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE-RATE FOR MALE WORKERS EMPLOYED IN PAINTING BRUSH MAKING.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated, respectively 31st October, 1918, and 1st August, 1922, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, in Great Britain, for the Brush and Broom Trade as specified in the Trade Boards (Brush and Broom) Order, 1919, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates, Guaranteed Time-Rates, General Minimum Piece-Rates, and Overtime-Rates for Male and Female Workers at present applicable and set out in the Trade Board's Notices M. (35), M. (36), and M. (37) dated 29th June, 1922, and TO FIX an additional General Minimum Piece-Rate for Male Workers employed on Painting Brush Making.

The Minister of Labour has given his consent to the issue of this Notice of Proposal.

Information in respect of the Trade Board's Proposals may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Trade Board at the address given below.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above Proposals which may be lodged with them within two months from the 2nd day of January, 1925. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Brush and Broom Trade Board (Great Britain), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W.1.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.
