The KING has been pleased by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing date the 5th instant, to present and appoint the Reverend Charles Leonard Thornton-Duesbery, M.A., Rector of Holy Trinity, Saint Marylebone, to the Bishopric of the Isle of Man and Sodor, void by the death of the Right Reverend Father in God Doctor James Denton Thompson, late Bishop thereof.

The KING has been pleased, by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing date the 9th instant, to grant unto the Very Reverend Edward Lowry Henderson, M.A., Provost of the Cathedral Church of Edinburgh, the Deanery of the Cathedral Church of Saint Albans, void by the death of the Very Reverend George Wilfrid Blenkin, M.A., D.D.

18 years of age and over in brass stamping and power press work at the works of The Deritend Stamping Co. Ltd., Liverpool Street, Birmingham, subject to the conditions that a woman shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks; that suitable cloakroom and messroom accommodation and washing facilities shall be provided; and that a woman shall not be allowed to lift, carry or move anything so heavy as to be likely to cause her injury.
