

**APPOINTMENT OF STANDING FOR
FOUR HACKNEY CARRIAGES.**

I, WILLIAM THOMAS FRANCIS HORWOOD, Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, do hereby APPOINT a Standing for four Hackney Carriages at St. Martin's Street, Leicester Square, W.C., and do make the following Regulations with regard to the boundaries for the same, viz.:—

On East side of roadway, commencing at a point opposite the doorway of No. 6, St. Martin's Street, extending Northward, by kerb, as far as necessary for four carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the South.
