ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES. (DATED 9TH FEBRUARY, 1925.)

STIRLINGSHIRE (CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1925.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:-

Power to make Regulations.

- 1.—(1) The Local Authorities of the Districts specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make Regulations, with a view to the prevention of worrying of cattle (including sheep), for requiring that dogs or any class of dogs shall, during all or any of the hours between sunset and sunrise, be kept by the owners thereof under control in manner prescribed by the Regulations.
- (2) The Regulations may apply to the whole or any part of the Districts, and may exempt any class of dogs either generally or under prescribed conditions.
