6. At the end of Rule 40 insert:—

(a) Within six calendar months from the date of the delivery of the copies of a judgment to the Government Agents, any party may deliver to the Tribunal a demand for the revision of the judgment on the ground of the discovery of evidence referring to allegations made by him before the judgment which, if known to the Tribunal when the cause was before it previously, would have exercised a decisive effect upon its judgment and which could not by the exercise of reasonable diligence have been then produced by such party. If the Tribunal thinks that a *prima facie* case for revision is disclosed in the demand, it will cause notice thereof to be given to the other parties concerned of the place and time when the Tribunal will hear the parties and decide upon the demand for revision. If the Tribunal decides in favour of revision, it will give such directions with regard thereto as may be necessary.
