## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's

Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 13th March, 1925, at 1 o'clock, for

(a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and

(b) £4 per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1933.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £35,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £3,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as their Lordships may determine.

#### TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 16th March, 1925, to Saturday, the 21st March, 1925, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

#### 4 PER CENT. TREASURY BONDS, 1933.

6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000. They will be exempt from Corporation Profits Tax, and will, as indicated in the Notice of 30th September, 1924, rank *pari passu* with those issued under the Prospectus of the 23rd March, 1923. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 16th March, 1925, to Saturday, the 21st March, 1925, inclusive; the first dividend, payable on the 15th April, 1925, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.

7. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bonds required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one shilling) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bonds of different dates.

8. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

9. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills or Bonds are to be dated.

10. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills and Bonds.

11. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

## TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

FLAX AND HEMP TRADE BOARD  
(GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, and 1st August, 1922, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Flax and Hemp Trade in Great Britain as specified in the Trade Boards (Flax and Hemp) Order, 1919, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the

Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they PROPOSE TO VARY certain of the minimum rates of wages for female workers set out in Section III of Part I of the Schedule to their Notice F.H. COUNTY OF BRECON.

Notice is hereby given, that on the 19th day of February, 1925, the Minister of Transport made an Order under Section 7 (4) of the Roads Act, 1920, in respect of a certain highway in the County of Brecon.

## GREAT DRIFFIELD GAS.

(Application for Special Order under Section 10 of the Gas Regulation Act, 1920).

**N**OTICE is hereby given that the Urban District Council of Great Driffield, whose address is at the Council Offices, Driffield, in the East Riding of the County of York (hereinafter called "the Council") have applied to the Board of Trade for a Special Order under Section 10 of the Gas Regulation Act 1920, for all or some of the following purposes (that is to say):—

To extend the limits within which the Council are authorised to supply gas by the addition thereto of the following area (hereinafter referred to as "the added area") namely the parish of Nafferton in the Rural District of Driffield and to authorise the Council to

exercise within the added area all and the like rights, privileges and authorities for and in relation to the supply of gas as they now have and may exercise within their existing limits of supply.

To enable the Council to purchase additional lands by agreement and to make provision in regard to the retention and disposal of the lands and as to the proceeds of sale of surplus lands.

To enable the Council to lay pipes in streets not dedicated to public use, and to lay down pipes for ancillary purposes and to provide dwelling houses for their employees and offices, show rooms and other buildings for the purposes of their gas undertaking.

To provide for (a) the repeal of any enactments or other provisions requiring the Council to supply gas of any particular illuminating or calorific power and the substitution therefor of power to charge for thermal units supplied in the form of gas; (b) the modification of the statutory or other provisions affecting the charges which may be made by the Council by substituting for the maximum price per 1,000 cubic feet now authorised with an addition to meet increases in the cost and charges of and incidental to the production and supply of gas as by the Council since 30th June 1914 a maximum price per therm (*i.e.* 100,000 British Thermal Units) and (c) the charging of a differential price in the added area before and after the introduction of the proposed thermal basis of charge.

The maximum price now authorised in respect of the supply of gas by the Council is 4s. 6d. per 1,000 cubic feet, and the maximum price which the Council propose should be prescribed in respect of the supply of gas by the Council is 1s. 2d. per therm within the existing limits of supply and 1s. 4d. per therm within the added area, subject to the provision that the price for the supply of gas within the added area shall not exceed by more than 2d. per therm the price for the time being charged by the Council for gas supplied within the existing limits of supply.

To provide that gas fittings let on hire shall not be subject to distress or liable to be taken in execution in bankruptcy and shall remain the property of the Council.

To enable the Council to make regulations in regard to the construction and placing of pipes &c. between mains and meters, and to make further provision in regard to the cutting off and reconnecting of supplies and expenses thereof, and in regard to the supply of gas where the consumer has a separate supply; to exempt the Council from the obligation to supply gas when the main is insufficient; for the removal of fittings where gas supply discontinued; to empower the Council to refuse to supply gas to persons in debt for other premises; to require gas consumers to give notice to the Council before removing, and to make provision in regard to notices of discontinuance of supply of gas; to provide for period of error in defective meters; to require anti-fluctuators to be used with gas engines, and to make provision of valve where high pressure air is used.

To enable the Council to enter into contracts with local authorities, companies or persons for the supply by the Council to them or for the supply to the Council by them of gas in bulk and to take out licences for the use of patents.

To enable the Council to borrow moneys for the costs of the Order and, with the sanction of the Ministry of Health, for the purposes of their gas undertaking, including working capital, and to make provision in regard to the borrowing and re-borrowing and the repayment of the moneys so borrowed and to make other financial provisions.

To amend the provisions of Article XXVII of the Order of 1896 in regard to (1) the formation of and contributions to the reserve fund of the gas undertaking, and (2) the application of the residue of the revenue to the credit of the District Fund, and to enact new provisions in regard to the Reserve Fund and to enable the Council to carry the residue of the revenue to the District Fund when the price of gas to private consumers does not exceed ten pence per therm.

To make provision in regard to the authentication and service of notices by the Council and for the recovery of demands and penalties.

To vary and extinguish all rights and privileges which would interfere with the objects of the intended Order and to confer other rights and privileges.

To incorporate and apply, with or without modification, all or some of the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts, the Gasworks Clauses Acts, 1847 and 1871, the Public Health Act, 1875, and any Acts amending the same, and the Local Loans Act, 1875, and to repeal, alter, amend or re-enact all or any of the provisions of the Great Driffield Gas Order, 1896, and any other Act or Order relating to the gas undertaking of the Council.
