

Ormesby, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Mary, Nunthorpe, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Nunthorpe.'

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Nunthorpe comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the Parish of Ayton, of the Parish of Marton, and of the Parish of Ormesby, all in the County of York and in the Diocese of York, which are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing at the junction of Gunnergate Lane and Back Lane with the road leading from Stokesley to Middlesbrough, and extending thence first eastward, then north-eastward and then south-eastward along the middle of Back Lane (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said Parish of Marton from the said Parish of Ormesby) for a distance of 1 mile and 33 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading from Nunthorpe to Guisborough, and extending thence first north-eastward and then eastward along the middle of the last mentioned road for a distance of 68 chains or thereabouts to the point where it is crossed by the boundary which divides the Civil Parish of Upsall from the Civil Parish of Morton, and extending thence first south-eastward and then in various directions along such Civil Parish boundary for a distance of 66 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the stream called Main Stell upon the boundary which divides the Parish of Guisborough, in the said County and Diocese, from the said Parish of Ormesby, and extending thence first southward and then in various directions along the middle of Main Stell (thereby following in one part the last mentioned boundary, in another part the boundary which divides the Parish of Newton, in the said County and Diocese, from the said Parish of Ormesby, and in another part the boundary which divides the said Parish of Newton from the said Parish of Ayton) for a distance of 2½ miles or thereabouts to the centre of Tree Bridge which carries the said road leading from Stokesley to Middlesbrough across such stream, and extending thence southward along the middle of the last mentioned road for a distance of 16 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway leading to the house and premises known as Tunstall Farm, and extending thence first westward, then north-westward, and then south-westward along the middle of the said roadway for a distance of 40 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the boundary of the Civil Parish of Little Ayton, and extending thence first south-westward and then in various directions along the boundary of the said Civil Parish of Little Ayton (thereby following in part the middle of the River Tame;

in part the boundary which divides the Parish of Stokesley, in the said County and Diocese, from the said Parish of Ayton; in part the boundary which divides the Parish of Seamer, in the said County and Diocese, from the said Parish of Ayton; in part the boundary which divides a detached portion of the said Parish of Stokesley from the said Parish of Ayton; and in part the boundary which divides a detached portion of the said Parish of Seamer from the said Parish of Ayton) for a distance of 2 miles or thereabouts to the point where such Civil Parish boundary meets the boundary which divides the said Parish of Marton from the said Parish of Ayton, and extending thence first eastward and then north-eastward along the last mentioned boundary (thereby following in one part the southern side, in another part the western side, and in another part the eastern side of the roadway leading from Sunny Cross past the eastern side of the house and premises known as Brass Castle to the said road which leads from Stokesley to Middlesbrough) for a distance of 59 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the gateway at the eastern entrance to the house and premises known as Rye Hill Farm, and extending thence first northward to and then first northward and then in various directions along the middle of the last mentioned roadway for a distance of 45 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the said road leading from Stokesley to Middlesbrough, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last mentioned road for a distance of 66½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Gunnergate Lane and Back Lane, at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of York.
