TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Thursday, the 9th April, 1925, at 1 o'clock, for

(a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loans Acts, 1914-1919; and

(b) £4 per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1933.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be

£30,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £3,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Tuesday, the 14th April, 1925, to Saturday, the 18th April, 1925, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. Each tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

4 PER CENT. TREASURY BONDS, 1933.

6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000. They will be exempt from Corporation Profits Tax, and will, as indicated in the Notice of 31st March, 1925, rank *pari passu* with those issued under the prospectus of the

23rd March, 1923. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Tuesday, the 14th April, 1925, to Saturday, the 18th April, 1925, inclusive; the first dividend payable on the 15th October, 1925, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.

7. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bonds required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one shilling) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bonds of different dates.

8. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

9. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills or Bonds are to be dated.

10. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills and Bonds.

11. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

POSTAL WORKERS' INCLUSION ORDER, 1925.

The Unemployment Insurance (Postal Workers') Inclusion Order, 1925, dated February 27, 1925, made by the Minister of Labour under the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920 (10 and 11 Geo. 5, c. 30).

Whereas by a Special Order called the National Health Insurance (Subsidiary Employments), Order, 1924, made under Sub-section 2 of Section 1 of, and paragraph (i) of Part II of the First Schedule to, the National Health Insurance Act, 1911, the classes of employments set forth in the First Schedule thereto are specified as being of such a nature that they are ordinarily adopted as subsidiary employments only and not as the principal means of livelihood:

And whereas by an Order called the Unemployment Insurance (Subsidiary Employments) Order, 1924, made by the Minister of Labour (hereinafter referred to as the Minister) under paragraph (j) of Part II of the First Schedule to the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920 (hereinafter referred to as the Act), the employments of the classes specified in the said Special Order were declared by the Minister to be employments of such a nature that they are ordinarily adopted as subsidiary employments only and not as the principal means of livelihood, and the said Special Order was thereby declared by the Minister to apply for the purposes of the Unemployment Insurance Acts, 1920 to 1924, and employment of the classes so specified thereby became excepted employment for the purposes of the Act:

And whereas it is desirable that certain persons engaged in the said classes of employment should notwithstanding the Special Order and Order hereinbefore referred to continue to be included among the persons employed within the meaning of the Unemployment Insurance Acts, 1920 to 1924:

Now, therefore, the Minister by virtue of the powers conferred on him by Section 4 of the Act, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf with the approval of the Treasury hereby makes the following Order:—

1. The persons engaged in the classes of employments set out in the First Schedule hereto under the conditions set out in the Second Schedule hereto shall be included among the persons employed within the meaning of the Act.

2. This Order may be cited as the Unemployment Insurance (Postal Workers) Inclusion Order, 1925, and shall be deemed to have had effect from the seventh day of August, 1924.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Any person employed as a part-time telephonist (day or night), auxiliary postman, auxiliary sorter or part-time indoor assistant for postal and telegraph business, who renders on the average eighteen or more hours' service weekly, in any one or more part-time employments of any kind whatsoever under the Postmaster-General.

Employments of the classes specified in the First Schedule to the Special Order, made under the National Health Insurance Acts, 1911 to 1920, set out in the Schedule hereto are hereby declared by the Minister to be employments of such a nature that they are ordinarily adopted as subsidiary employments only and not as the principal means of livelihood and the said Special Order is hereby declared by the Minister to apply for the purposes of the Unemployment Insurance Acts, 1920 to 1924.

2. This Order may be cited as the Unemployment Insurance (Subsidiary Employments) Order, 1924, and shall be deemed to have had effect from the seventh day of August, 1924.

Authorisation of Landing of Animal for Exceptional Purposes.

1. The landing of the animal described in the First Schedule hereto, which is intended for exceptional purposes, is hereby allowed, subject to the provisions of Part II (Quarantine) of the Third Schedule to the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of the Foreign Animals (Quarantine) Order of 1896, and of this Order.

Definition of Quarantine Station.

2. The premises described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby defined as a Foreign Animals Quarantine Station for the purpose of the detention of the animal described in the First Schedule hereto.

Examination Before Landing.

3. No such animal as aforesaid shall be landed except with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry, which licence shall not be granted unless and until the animal has been examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry, and certified by him to be free from symptoms of contagious disease.

Regulation Applicable to the Animal on Landing.

4. The animal on being landed shall forthwith be moved under the supervision of an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries from the quay to the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall be there detained for a period of twenty-eight days. During the said period the animal shall be kept separate from all other animals, and no other animal shall be moved into such premises.
