The Home Secretary gives notice that in pur-
 suance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of
 Women, Young Persons and Children Act,
 1920, he has made an Order authorising the
 employment on two day shifts of women of 18
 and young persons of 16 years of age and over
 in the processes of fitting and moving of frames
 containing Anodes and Kathodes and the sort-
 ing and cleaning of finished plates at the works
 of Messrs. Gauntletts Limited, North Lincoln
 Road, Scunthorpe, subject to the conditions
 that a worker shall not be employed in the
 afternoon shift in consecutive weeks; that a
 worker shall not be allowed to lift, carry or
 move anything so heavy as to be likely to
 cause injury to such worker; that suitable
 protective clothing, cloakroom, messroom, and
 washing accommodation and facilities for
 sitting shall be provided.
