WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representa-tion, bearing date the 30th day of April, 1925, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a District Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Mary, Cockerton, situate in the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of the Holy Trinity, Darlington, in the County of Durham and in the Diocese of Durham:

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a District Chapelry should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Mary, Cockerton, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Herbert Hensley, Bishop of Durham (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Darlington, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of Saint Mary, Cockerton, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Mary, Cockerton ':

"And with the like consent of the said Herbert Hensley, Bishop of Durham (testified as aforesaid) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of Saint Mary, Cockerton, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees or dues to be received in respect of the publication of banns and of the solemnization or performance of marriages, churchings and burials should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being.

"We therefore humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal Wisdom, shall seem meet.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Mary, Cockerton, being:

"All that part of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of the Holy Trinity. Darlington, in the County of Durham and in the Diocese of Durham, which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon the east partly by the District of Saint Matthew, Darlington, and partly by the New Parish of Saint Paul, Darlington, upon the north east by the Parish of Haughton le Skerne, upon the west partly by the Parish of Heighington and partly by the Parish of Coniscliffe, all in the said County and Diocese, upon part of the south by the said Parish of Coniscliffe and upon the remaining part of the south by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Coniscliffe from the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Darlington, at the centre of Mowden Bridge which carries Staindrop Road across the stream known as Baydale Beck, and extending thence first eastward and then south eastward along the middle of Staindrop Road for a distance of 71 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Woodland Road, and extending thence north westward along the middle of Woodland Road for a distance of $5\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the centre of Cockerton Bridge which carries Woodland Road across the stream known as Cocker Beck, and extending thence first eastward and then in various directions along the middle of Cocker Beck for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Darlington, from the said District of Saint Matthew, Darling-

And whereas the said Representation has

been approved by His Majesty in Council:
Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with
the advice of His said Council, is pleased
hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Durham.
