WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 9th day of *May*, 1925 (C.W. 1941/25), in the words following, viz. :—

“ Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

“ And whereas provision has been made from time to time by Order in Council for the retire-

ment of Officers of Your Majesty's Navy and Marine Force after specified periods of non-service :

“ And whereas we are of opinion that the rules governing retirement for non-service should be revised in such manner as to provide that Officers of the several branches of the Naval Service of equivalent rank shall be retired after the same period of non-service, and that consequent thereon certain regulations should be adopted for the purpose of ensuring uniformity of treatment of Officers of the various branches :

“ We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the regulations set forth in the annexed Schedule.

“ The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

“ SCHEDULE.

“ 1. Officers, R.N., of all branches of the rank or equivalent rank specified to be retired on account of non-service as follows :—

Rank or equivalent rank.	Period of non-service necessitating retirement.
*Rear Admiral	2½ years from date of last 'service' in the rank of Rear Admiral, or if they have not served in the rank of Rear Admiral, 2½ years from date of promotion to that rank, or 3 years from date of last 'service' in the rank of Captain, whichever period expires first.

SCHEDULE—continued.

Rank or equivalent rank.	Period of non-service necessitating retirement.
Captain	2 years from date of last 'service' in the rank of Captain but not less than 3 years from date of promotion to that rank, or if they have not served in the rank of Captain, 3 years from date of promotion to that rank.
Commander	2 years from date of last 'service' in the rank of Commander, or, if they have not served in the rank of Commander, 2 years from date of promotion to that rank.
Lieutenant Commander Lieutenant	3 years from date of last 'service' in the rank of Lieutenant Commander or Lieutenant, or, if they have not served in the rank of Lieutenant, 3 years from date of promotion to that rank.

* The provision of Order in Council dated 9th March, 1914, for the retirement on promotion to Vice Admiral of Rear Admirals who have not hoisted their Flag at Sea remains in force.

" 2. Chaplains of the Church of England to be retired after 2 years from the date of last service.

" 3. No increase of half-pay to be granted to any Officer, R.N. or R.M., on the Active List on account of time on unemployed or half-pay in excess of two years subsequent to his last employment.

" 4. No increase of retired pay to be granted to any Officer, R.N. or R.M., on account of time on unemployed or half-pay in excess of two years subsequent to his last employment, whether retired pay is assessed on the half-pay scale or otherwise.

" 5. Paragraphs 3 and 4 of this Schedule are not applicable to Officers selected for retirement under the provisions of Order in Council of 14th July, 1922, Schedule ' B,' who elected to be placed on unemployed pay or half-pay and retired for non-service."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 14th day of *May*, 1925 (C.W. 4291/25), in the words following, viz. :—

" Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, wages, pensions, bounty money, grants, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, seaman, or marine shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

" And whereas for the purpose of giving effect to a scheme approved by Your Majesty's Government for the manning of the Fleet Air Arm we are of opinion that Commissioned Officers of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines should be attached to Your Majesty's Royal Air Force for service with the Fleet Air Arm for such periods as we may from time to time determine :

" And whereas such Officers during a portion of the period of their attachment will be borne on the books of one or other of Your Majesty's Ships in Commission :

" And whereas we also consider it desirable that a certain number of Officers of the rank of Commander in the Royal Navy should be lent to the Royal Air Force for short periods of service to gain practical experience in air matters :

" And whereas we consider that Officers of Your Majesty's Royal Navy and Royal Marines while so attached or lent to the Royal Air Force, should continue to receive the normal emoluments of their rank in the Royal Navy or Royal Marines, together with, in the case of Officers of or below the rank of Commander, R.N., or Captain, R.M., a special allowance in respect of their air duties :

" We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to empower us to grant to Commissioned Officers of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines of or below the rank of Commander, R.N. or Captain, R.M., while attached or lent to the Royal Air Force as above and borne on the books of one or other of Your Majesty's Ships in Commission, an allowance of 6s. a day in addition to the normal emoluments of their rank, with effect as from the 16th June, 1924. Such allowance to be paid during passage, leave or sickness under such conditions as we may from time

to time determine, and otherwise continuously in the case of Officers below the rank or relative rank of Commander in the Royal Navy or of the rank of Captain or below in the Royal Marines who are attached to the Royal Air Force, and on days on which the Officer is actually required to ascend in aircraft on duty in the case of Officers of the rank of Commander in the Royal Navy who are lent.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified Their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS on the 20th day of January, 1914, an International Convention for the safety of Life at Sea, and for purposes incidental thereto, was duly entered into by His Majesty and the other Signatory Powers more especially referred to and set out in the said Convention:

And whereas a Statute 4 & 5 Geo. V. c 50, intituled "An Act to make such amendments of the law relating to Merchant Shipping as are necessary or expedient to give effect to an International Convention for the safety of Life at Sea" (being the Convention above referred to) was passed on the 10th day of August, 1914, the short title of which is "The Merchant Shipping (Convention) Act, 1914."

And whereas by Section 29, Sub-section 5, of the said Act it was provided as follows:—

"This Act shall come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1915:

"Provided that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, from time to time postpone the coming into operation of this Act for such period, not exceeding on any occasion of postponement one year, as may be specified in the Order":

And whereas by divers Orders in Council the coming into operation of the said Act has been from time to time postponed, and now stands postponed, by virtue of an Order in Council of the 8th day of December, 1924, until the 1st day of July, 1925:

And whereas His Majesty deems it expedient that the provisions of the said Act should be further postponed:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, in pursuance of the powers vested in Him by the above-recited provision and of all other powers Him thereunto enabling, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that the provisions of the Merchant Shipping (Convention) Act, 1914, shall be postponed from coming into operation until the 1st day of January, 1926.

WHEREAS by Section 5 of the Merchant Shipping (Mercantile Marine Fund) Act, 1898 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Section"), it is, amongst other things, enacted as follows:—

"5.—(1) On and after the commencement of this Act, the general lighthouse authorities shall levy light dues with respect to the voyages made by ships or by way of periodical payment, and not with respect to the lights which a ship passes or from which it derives benefit, and the dues so levied shall take the place of the dues now levied by those authorities:

"(2) The scale and rules set out in the Second Schedule to this Act shall have effect for the purpose of the levying of light dues in pursuance of this Act, but Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, alter, either generally or with respect to particular classes of cases, the scale or rules and the exemptions therefrom."

And whereas from time to time divers Orders in Council have been made in pursuance of the said Section:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the Scale and Rules set out in the Second Schedule to the said recited Act should be further altered in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him by the said Section, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Light Dues) Order, 1925, and shall have effect from the date of its publication in the London Gazette.

2. Each of the dues authorised to be levied in accordance with the Scale set out in the Second Schedule to the said recited Act shall be subject to an increase of ten per cent. for the purpose of the levying of light dues in pursuance of the said recited Act.

WHEREAS by Section 80 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, power is given to His Majesty by Order in Council to make regulations as to the manner in which Government ships may be registered as British ships under the Merchant Shipping Acts:

And whereas by the said Section it is provided that those Acts shall, subject to any exceptions or modifications which may be made by Order in Council, either generally or as respects any special class of such ships, apply to such ships when registered in accordance with such Regulations:

And whereas the Air Council will, by such Regulations as they shall from time to time deem fit to make, having regard to the interests of seamen in Government ships in the service of the Air Council, and of the Public Service, provide for the payment of seamen's wages, advance and allotment of wages, and remittance of seamen's wages by money orders:

And whereas the provisions of Section one of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the said Act, or otherwise in Him vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the following Regulations shall have effect as regards any Government ships in the service of the Air Council:—

1. An application for registry of a Government ship in the service of the Air Council shall be made in writing under the hand of the Secretary or a Principal Assistant Secretary of the Air Ministry. Such application shall contain the following particulars:—

(i) A statement of the name and description of the ship;

(ii) A statement of the time when and place where the ship was built; or, if the ship was foreign built and the time and place of building are unknown, a statement to that effect and of her foreign name;

(iii) A statement of the nature of the title to the said ship, whether by original construction by or for the Air Council, or by purchase, capture, condemnation, or otherwise, and a list of the documents of title, if any, in case she was not originally constructed by or for the Air Council;

(iv) A statement of the name of the Master.

2. The Registrar, on receiving such application in respect of a Government ship in the service of the Air Council, shall—

(i) enter the ship in the Register Book as belonging to "His Majesty, represented by the Air Council," and shall also enter therein

(ii) the name of the port to which she belongs:

(iii) the particulars stated in the application for registration:

(iv) the details comprised in the Surveyor's Certificate.

3. On the registry of a Government ship in the service of the Air Council the Registrar shall retain in his possession the Surveyor's Certificate and the application for registry and any documents of title mentioned in such application.

4. Upon the transfer of a registered Government ship in the service of the Air Council by Bill of Sale the Air Council shall be the transferors, and the Bill of Sale shall be in Form A in the proper form prescribed under the principal Act, omitting the covenant therein contained. Any such Bill of Sale shall be sealed with the official seal of the Air Council, which shall be authenticated by the signature of the Secretary or of some person authorised by the Council to act on behalf of the Secretary.

5. The application for a Certificate of Sale referred to in Sections 39 to 42 and Sections 44 to 46 of the principal Act, may be made in respect of a Government ship in the service of the Air Council by the Secretary or a Principal Assistant Secretary of the Air Ministry on their behalf.

6. The Secretary of the Air Ministry for the time being shall be deemed to be the managing owner of a registered Government ship in the service of the Air Council within the meaning of Section 59 of the principal Act and shall be so registered at the Customs House of her registered port by his official style and address.

7. The tonnage of Government ships in the service of the Air Council shall be ascertained in accordance with tonnage regulations to be made by the Board of Trade with the concurrence of the Air Council; and wherever reference is made to tonnage regulations or to the ascertainment of tonnage thereby in any sections of the Merchant Shipping Acts which are applicable to Government ships, such sections shall be read with reference to Government ships as if the tonnage regulations made under this Order were mentioned therein in lieu of the tonnage regulations mentioned in those Acts.

8. The term "seaman" in Section 113 of the principal Act shall not be deemed to mean or include any officers or airmen in His Majesty's Air Force.

9. Where a seaman is lost with a Government ship in the service of the Air Council, the Air Council may pay the wages due to him to the person entitled to receive the same.

10. Whenever during the absence of any seaman on a voyage his wife or any of his children or step-children become chargeable to any Union or Parish in the United Kingdom, the Air Council may in their discretion reimburse such Union or Parish out of the wages of the seaman earned during the voyage, any sums properly expended during his absence in the maintenance of those members of his family or any of them, provided that the Air Council, shall not, unless in their opinion such a course shall be warranted by exceptional circumstances, pay sums exceeding the following proportions of the seaman's wages, namely:—

(i) If only one of those members be chargeable, one half of the wages;

(ii) If two or more of those members are chargeable, two-thirds of the wages.

11. The provisions of Part V of the principal Act, and Part I of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, and any enactment amending those provisions, and any rules or regulations made thereunder, shall not apply to Government ships in the service of the Air Council except to such extent and subject to such conditions as may be prescribed by Orders made by the Air Council with the consent of the Board of Trade.

12. In the case of a shipping casualty to or connected with a Government ship in the service of the Air Council, the preliminary inquiry and the formal investigation mentioned in Sections 465 and 466 of the principal Act may be held either by the Board of Trade or the Air Council as may be arranged between them, and in the event of such inquiry or investigation being held by the Air Council, they shall

have all the jurisdiction conferred by the Act on the Board of Trade with reference to the same.

13. Sections 480 to 486 inclusive of the principal Act and Sections 67 and 68 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, shall apply to Government ships in the service of the Air Council, subject to the following exceptions and modifications:—

(i) the said sections shall not apply where the vessel is under the command of an Air or other Officer Commanding the Royal Air Force at a Station abroad;

(ii) the power to remove or appoint a Master, conferred by Section 483 of the principal Act, shall not be exercised in the British Islands without the consent of the Air Council, nor elsewhere without the consent of the Air or other Officer Commanding the Royal Air Force at the Station, if obtainable with reasonable despatch.

14. For the purposes of this Order, subsection (2) of Section 517 of the principal Act shall have effect as if for the words "secretary of Lloyds in London, and the secretary shall place it in some conspicuous position for inspection" there were substituted the words "Air Council."

15. The powers conferred by Sections 530 to 534 of the principal Act shall not be exercised in the case of Government ships in the service of the Air Council without the consent of the Air Council except in regard to lights, buoys, and other matters or things necessary for the immediate protection of the traffic.

16. The references in Section 557 of the principal Act to the Admiralty and the Secretary of the Admiralty shall be construed as if they were references to the Air Council and the Secretary of the Air Ministry respectively.

17. Where any section of the Merchant Shipping Acts which by virtue of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, and this Order is applicable to Government ships in the service of the Air Council, imposes any duty or liability or confers any right or power upon or contemplates any act being performed by the owner of a ship, such duty, liability, right or power shall, subject always to the other provisions of this Order, be carried out, borne, or exercised by the Air Council on behalf of His Majesty.

18. No provision of the Merchant Shipping Acts imposing on the owner of a ship any liability to any penalty, debt, damages, costs, or proceedings shall, in the case of a Government ship in the service of the Air Council, have any application to His Majesty or to the Air Council.

Provided that where expenses are incurred in respect of seamen belonging to a Government ship in the service of the Air Council under Part IV of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, and the Distressed Seamen Regulations, made in pursuance of Section 40 of the said Act, which would under the said Act or Regulations be payable by the owners of such vessel, any such expenses will be repaid by the Air Council.

19. No provision in the Merchant Shipping Acts shall render His Majesty or the Air Council liable to pay salvage where no such liability at present exists.

20. No provision contained in the Merchant Shipping Acts providing for the forfeiture or

detention of a ship by reason of non-compliance with an enactment therein contained shall have any application to a Government ship in the service of the Air Council.

21. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Merchant Shipping Acts and this Order, the Master of a Government ship in the service of the Air Council shall not be liable for any penalty, debt, or damages under any provision of any of the Merchant Shipping Acts in respect of anything done or omitted in pursuance of the Order of the Air Council or of any officer of His Majesty's Air Force.

22. Nothing in the Merchant Shipping Acts or this Order shall render the Master or any other persons in charge of or on board a Government ship in the service of the Air Council liable for displaying any signal authorised by any regulations of the Air Ministry.

23. In this Order the expression "Merchant Shipping Acts" means any of the Merchant Shipping Acts, any provision of which is by virtue of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, and this Order applicable to Government ships; and the expression "United Kingdom" means Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

24. Nothing contained in this Order shall affect the airships, flying boats or other aircraft of the Air Council notwithstanding that such aircraft may be floating upon the water.

25. The following provisions of the Merchant Shipping Acts shall not apply to Government ships in the service of the Air Council registered in pursuance of the provisions of this Order, namely:—

(i) The Merchant Shipping Act, 1894:

Sections 1, 2, 3, 7 (3) and (5), 8 to 12, 16, 23, 27 to 38, 39 to 42 so far as they relate to mortgages, 43, 44 to 46 so far as they relate to mortgages, 48, 49, 50, 52, 54 to 58, 59 (2) and (3), 62, 68 to 71, 72, 74, 76, 84, 85, 87, 103 (4), 105 to 109, 116 (4), 119, 120 (so far as it relates to home trade ships), 131 to 147, 155 to 158, 162 to 168, 171 (2), 174, 182 to 184, 210, 224 (2), 253 (1) (b) and (2) (b), 262 to 264, 267 to 417, 435, 439, 441 (2) and (3), 442, 443 (3) and (4), 444 to 450, 452 to 457, 459 to 461, 468, 472, 492 to 509, 520 (b), 567, 568, 634 to 679, 689 (2), (3) and (4), 692, 693, 729 (1) (d) and (3), so far as they may relate to any papers or documents belonging to or in possession of the Crown.

(ii) Merchant Shipping Act, 1897. The whole Act.

(iii) The Merchant Shipping (Liability of Shipowners) Act, 1898. The whole Act.

(iv) The Merchant Shipping (Mercantile Marine Fund) Act, 1898. The whole Act.

(v) The Merchant Shipping (Liability of Shipowners) Act, 1900. The whole Act.

(vi) The Merchant Shipping Act, 1906:

Sections 1 to 4, 6, 9 to 11, 13 to 24, 25 (3), 26, 35, in 38 (2), so much thereof as is subsequent to the word "Master" where it first occurs, 38 (3), 43, except sub-sections (2) and (4), 51 to 53, 57, 60 to 64, 65 (1), 69 to 71, 76, 77, 81, 83.

(vii) The Merchant Shipping (Seamen's Allotment) Act, 1911. The whole Act.

(viii) The Merchant Shipping (Stevedores and Trimmers) Act, 1911. The whole Act.

(ix) The Merchant Shipping Act, 1911. The whole Act.

(x) The Pilotage Act, 1913. The whole Act.

(xi) The Merchant Shipping (Amendment) Act, 1920. The whole Act.

(xii) The Merchant Shipping (Scottish Fishing Boats) Act, 1920. The whole Act.

Provided that no provision of the Merchant Shipping Acts which, according to a reasonable construction, would not apply in the case of Government ships in the service of the Air Council, shall be deemed to apply to such ships by reason only that its application is not hereby expressly excluded.

26. This Order may be cited as the Air Council Ships (Application of Enactments) Order, 1925.

TO THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR MAJESTY,

We, Your Majesty's loyal and devoted subjects, Ministers and Elders of the Church of Scotland, convened in General Assembly, desire to express the deep appreciation and gratitude with which Your Majesty's letter was received by us. Nothing could be of greater encouragement to us than Your Majesty's gracious interest in the Proceedings of our General Assembly, and in the service which the Church of Scotland seeks to render to the cause of true religion in our land. We most earnestly desire to assure Your Majesty that it will be our constant endeavour to be faithful to the trust committed to us.

Where the whole-time male worker is employed by the week or any longer period and the hours of work agreed between the worker and the employer in any week (excluding hours of overtime employment) are less than 54 in summer or 50 in winter, as the case may be, the rate of wages applicable to that worker, shall be such as to secure to that worker the wages which would have been payable if the agreed hours had been 54 in summer or 50 in winter as the case may be.

3. For the purpose of the above rates employment in winter shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on the first Monday in November and terminating on the last Sunday in February, and employment in summer shall be deemed to be employment during the rest of the year.

4. For the purpose of the above rates, the hours of work shall not include meal times, but shall include any time during which, by reason of weather conditions, an employer has prevented from working a worker who was present at the place of employment and ready to work.
