The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE COMPETITIVE SELECTION OF ASSISTANTS IN THE NAUTICAL ALMANAC OFFICE UNDER THE ADMIRALTY.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time. Competitions do not take place at fixed intervals, but are held as occasion arises on the occurrence of vacancies.

1. Candidates must have attained the age of 22 and must not have attained the age of 40 on a date to be fixed in respect of the competition in which they are to take part.*

2. Candidates must be natural-born British subjects and born of a father also a natural-born British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, and provided that exception may be made as to the father in the case of candidates who have served in His Majesty's Armed Forces during the Great War between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918.

* For competitions subsequent to the competition now announced the upper age limit will be reduced to 30.
